

"Improvement in or relating to artificial blocks for the protection of structures exposed to the action of moving water"

Abstract —This invention relates to the formation of artificial blocks for structures exposed to the action of moving water. The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1 to 4 which read as follows:—

- 1 A block for building structures exposed to the action of moving water, said block having at least four projections whose axes radiate substantially from a common central zone and which are separated by recessed portions
- 2 A block according to claim 1, wherein each said projection has a cross-section, taken on a plane perpendicular to the projection axis, whose periphery is generally convex.
- 3 A block according to claim 1 or 2, in which the axes of the projections define substantially equal polyhedral angles at said central zone

4 A block according to any one of the preceding claims, wherein the bases of the said projections are joined to each other by fillets having concave profiles.

"Primary dry cell."

Abstract —This invention relates to an improved dry cell and to improved primary batteries made therefrom.

The principal object of the invention is to provide a new and improved dry cell structure wherein the necessary cell elements are completely enclosed between two faces of flexible non-conducting plastic material which are edge sealed around the entire periphery of each cell unit. Thus the metal base plate or collector plate may be completely sealed within a plastic envelope and does not have any connector tab or jumper strip protruding between any marginal edges of the two plastic sheets.
