### (1) *China Sea—Formosa—Anping Road—Beacons erected.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 300 of 1896) that five white, framework, wooden beacons, each 38 ft. high, and pyramidal in shape, with the upper part horizontally boarded over, have been erected on the shore of Anping road, west coast of Formosa.

The beacons are situated approximately as follows on Chart No. 2,409:—

1. Lat. 23° 1' 10" N., long. 120° 8' 15" E.
2. Lat. 23° 0' 0" N., long. 120° 9' 10" E.
3. Lat. 22° 59' 0" N., long. 120° 10' 0" E.
4. Lat. 22° 58' 20" N., long. 120° 10' 40" E.
5. Lat. 22° 57' 5" N., long. 120° 10' 50" E.

### (2) *Kelung Harbour—Alterations in Buoyage.*

Also, that the buoys previously moored in Kelung harbour having disappeared, a conical iron buoy, painted red and surmounted by a white spherical cage, has been moored in a depth of 5 fathoms westward of Inflexible reef, in a position with Bush I. beacon bearing N.N.E., distant 4 cables, and Image point N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. Approximate position, lat. 25° 9' 5" N., long. 121° 44' 55" E.

*Africa, East Coast—Delagoa Bay—Amended particulars of Lech Reef Buoy.*

With reference to notice to Mariners No. 132, dated the 4th instant, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 308 of 1896) that the buoy (can) moored on the southern edge of Lech reef is painted red and not black as given in the above notice, also that its position is with Cape Inyack lighthouse bearing S. 45° E., distant nearly 10 miles; and Reuben point lighthouse N. 86° W.

Approximate position: lat. 25° 54' 55" S., long. 32° 49' 20" E.

NOTE.—Vessels should approach within a quarter of a mile of this buoy, and should not place too much dependence on its being in position.
