*China—Tung Hai, or Eastern Sea—Bank reported
150 Miles Eastward of Chusan Archipelago.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 312 of 1896) that the commander of the P. and O. steam-vessel Shanghai reports that on April 10, 1896, in approximately lat. 30° 1' N., long. 125° 9' E., he obtained two soundings with a patent lead, each of 9 fathoms, black mud bottom, nearly a mile apart; and at about a mile further westward the ship was stopped, and a sounding of 24 fathoms, black mud, was got with the deep sea lead.

*Eastern Archipelago—Sumatra, West Coast—Padang
Approach.—Alterations in Lights.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 319 of 1896) that the under-mentioned alterations have been made in the lights on Pulo Pisang and at the extremity of the breakwater in Koninginne bay:—

1. Pulo Pisang light shows red from N. 20' W. to N. 72° W., and in other respects is unaltered.

Approximate position, lat. 0° 59½' S., long 100° 19½' E.

2. Koninginne breakwater light has been altered from fixed white to a fixed light showing the following sectors:—White from N. 84° E. to N. 28° E.; and red from N. 20° E. through north to N. 4° W.

*Pacific Ocean—Philippine Islands—Mindavao, North-West
Coast—Amended particulars of Shoal Southward of
Alikai Island.*

With reference to notice to Mariners No. 104, dated May 22, 1896, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 320 of 1896) that an

examination has been made of the coral shoal reported southward of Alikai Island, with the result that a least depth of 23 ft. was found on it, as before, and that its position is with the centre of Alikai Island bearing N.N.W., distant 2½ miles; and Point Tagolo N. 78° E. Approximate position, lat. 8° 42½' N., long. 123° 14' E. Variation, 1° Easterly in 1896.

Australia, East Coast—Inner Route—Amended Position of Pearn Reef.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 71, dated May 7, 1895, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 334 of 1896) that telegraphic information has been received from Lieutenant and Commander W. V. Howard, H.M.S. Dart, dated June 23, 1896, that he has found a pinnacle rock with a depth of 10 ft. on it at low water and 12 fathoms close around, in a position with the centre of Halfway island bearing N. 27° E., distance 3⅔ miles.

Approximate position, lat. 11° 25' 39" S., long. 142° 56' 2" E.

This is most probably the shoal reported by Captain Pearn in 1876, which has hitherto been searched for in vain in the position assigned to it, and also the patch on which the steam-vessel Duke of Buckingham touched in 1895, marked "Reported 1895" on Admiralty Chart.

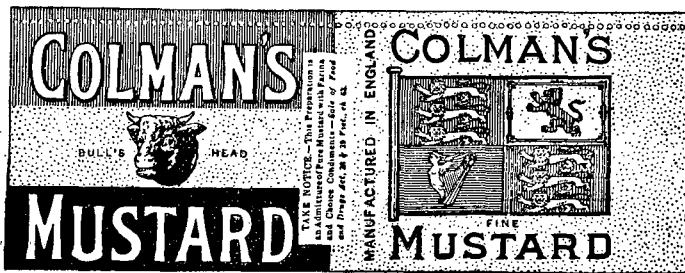
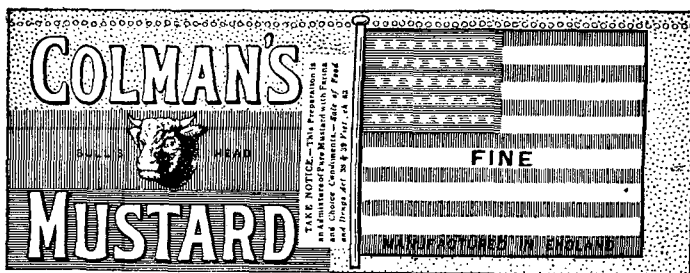

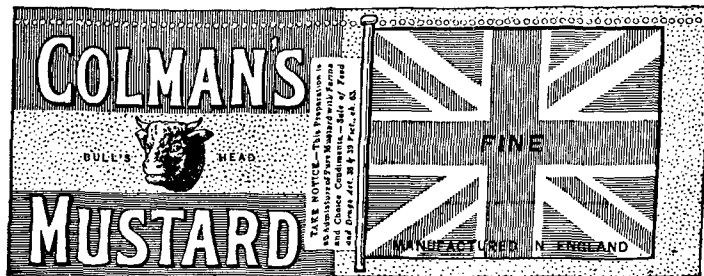
