GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

BY-LAWS

THE NUWARA ELIYA SUNDAY FAIR

1. A Fair to be called and known as "The Nuwara Eliya Fair" shall be held by the Council on every Sunday.

2 (1) No person shall use or occupy any stall or space within the premises of the Fair, unless he is the holder, or the servant or the agent of the holder, of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Commissioner, or otherwise than in accordance with conditions of such permit.

(2) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall be substantially in the form set out in Schedule I hereto and shall be in force for such period not exceeding twelve months or less than one month as may be specified in the permit.

3 Every holder of a permit issued under by-law II hereto for the use of a stall or space within the premises of the Fair shall pay a fee at the rate specified in Schedule I hereto for the use of a stall or space within the premises of the Fair.

4. If the Council does not employ an officer to collect the fees payable under by-law 3, it may lease the right of collecting the fees to any approved person—

- (a) by private treaty; or
- (b) by calling for tenders; or
- (c) by putting up the right to public auction.

5 (1) No holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 shall, without the written permission of the Commissioner—

- (a) transfer his permit to any other person; or
- (b) sub-let any part of the stall or space allowed to him; or
- (c) permit any person, other than his servant or agent, to use or occupy any part of the stall or space allowed to him.

6 Within the premises of the Fair, no person shall, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.—

- (a) read or offer to read the palm, or tell the fortune of any person visiting the Fair; or
- (b) advertise, sell or expose for sale, medicines or drugs of any kind whatsoever; or
- (c) beg for alms in or near the fair premises from persons attending the Fair; or
- (d) advertise, read, sing or sell any ballads, songs or books.

7. Every holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 may, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., sell or expose for sale within the premises of the Fair, vegetables, fruit, country rice, paddy, coconuts, tamarind, kollu, kurakkan, grains, cereals, berries, yams, jaggery, potatoes, or any other garden or chena produce.

8. (1) No holder of a permit issued under by-law 2 shall sell or expose for sale within the premises of the Fair any fish or meat, whether fresh, dried or salted, or pulses (other than those specified in by-law 7), dried chillies, onions, textiles or wearing apparel or any other commodity not specified in by-law 7:

Provided, however, that any such article or commodity may be sold or exposed for sale under the authority of a special permit issued in that behalf by the Commissioner.

(2) No special permit shall be issued by the Commissioner unless he is satisfied there are good and sufficient reasons for issuing such a permit.

9 Any disputes arising between holders of permits issued under by-law 2 or their authorized servants or between them and the public relating to the use of the Fair, may be settled by any officer authorized by the Commissioner, on duty, within the premises of the Fair.

10 Order within the premises of the Fair shall be maintained by an officer of the Council appointed for the purpose and on duty within the premises of the Fair.

11. Every person attending the Fair for the sale or purchase of goods shall comply with the lawful order given by an officer of the Council or by a Police Officer in settlement of any dispute or for the maintenance of order.

12. No person shall, within the premises of the Fair—

- (a) carry on any cooking; or
- (b) behave in a disorderly manner, or create any noise or disturbance or fight with any person, or use insulting, abusive, or obscene language; or
- (c) remain in or loiter about without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself after being ordered to leave by an officer of the Council or a Headman, or Police Officer or any person acting under the authority of the Commissioner.

13 (1) It shall be lawful for a court of competent jurisdiction to cancel any permit in respect of a stall or space in the Fair on a second or subsequent conviction of the permit-holder by such court for the contravention of any of the by-laws in connection with which such permit was issued.

(2) The Commissioner may refuse to issue a permit under by-law 2 to any person whose previous permit has been cancelled by a court of competent jurisdiction.

14. (1) It shall be lawful for the Commissioner, or for any officer of the Council acting under the authority of the Commissioner, to inspect and seize any article of food exposed for sale within the premises, of the Fair, which appears to him to be unwholesome.

(2) Where any article seized under paragraph (1) is certified by a Government Medical Officer to be unwholesome, such article may be destroyed without payment of compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.

15. (1) No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest, any officer or person appointed by the Commissioner to superintend the Fair in the execution of his duties.

(2) No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest, any person appointed to collect the fees by the Council or (where the right to collect the fees has been leased), by the lessee, in the execution of his duties.

16 No person shall—

- (a) construct any sheds or awnings, or leave mats or sacks in the premises of the Fair earlier than 3 p.m. of the day preceding the holding of the Fair, or
- (b) leave any sheds, awnings, mats, sacks or any other goods in the premises of the Fair later than 9 a.m. the day following the holding of the Fair.

17. It shall be lawful for the Commissioner, or any other officer of the Council acting under the authority of Commissioner, to remove any sheds, awnings, mats, sacks or any other goods left in the premises of the Fair after 9 a.m. the day following the holding of the Fair.

18 Every contravention of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees and, in the case of a continuing contravention, with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees, for every day during which the contravention is continued after a conviction thereof by a Court of competent jurisdiction or after service of a written notice from the Commissioner or an officer authorized by the Commissioner directing attention to such contravention.

19 In these by-laws,—

- “Commissioner” means the Municipal Commissioner of the Council;
 “Council” means the Nuwara Eliya Municipal Council, and
 “Fair” means the Nuwara Eliya Sunday Fair.
