nothing changes, 106.7 million jobs could be lost. "Additionally, travel and tourism GDP losses in 2020 have already amounted to US\$1,475 billion in the Asian region and could grow to US\$1,801 billion if barriers to travel, such as quarantine remain," the official said.

The recovery time of tourism was 19.4 months on an average during the previous diseases. According to the WTTC Crisis Report, travel and tourism is becoming

more resilient and could recover faster and specific recommendations such as public-private cooperation are essential.

The WTTC hopes that there will be a new normal in the postpandemic world. Messina said the Council has identified four emerging trends for the future of the sec-tor, such as, demand evolution, health and hygiene, innovation and digitisation and sustainability.

As of yesterday afternoon, the number of worldwide cases reported were over 62,100,000.

The United States accounted for the highest number with over 13,460,000 affected people, while India was second with around 9,360,000 re-
