GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay), appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese.

A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS DEPARTMENT

Examination for Recruitment of Telegraphists for the Overseas Telecommunications Service

1. *Date of Examination.*—A competitive examination for recruitment of Telegraphists for the Overseas Telecommunications Service will be held in Colombo by the Commissioner of Examinations commencing on Friday, September 10, 1954. The examination is open only to male candidates

2. *Applications.*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Postmaster-General on forms which may be obtained from his office up to July 16, 1954.

(ii) Completed entry forms should be sent to reach the Postmaster-General not later than 2 p.m. on July 23, 1954. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10.

(iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

(v) The Postmaster-General will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission on the day of the examination. A candidate who does not produce such form will be refused admission to the examination.

(vi) A copy of the time-table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates.

3. *Identity Papers.*—All candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

(a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.

(b) A valid passport issued within three years of the date of the examination.

(c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within three years of the examination on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

4. *Eligibility. General Conditions of.*—(i) Candidates must be of good character. The certificate of good character must be recent and from a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, Divisional Revenue Officer, Officer of the Ceylon Army, Navy or Air Force or a permanent Government officer in receipt of an annual salary of Rs 2,400 or over, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made. The name, designation and address of the person must be clearly indicated on the certificate.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(iii) Candidates must be not less than 17 years nor more than 22 years of age on August 1, 1954. The upper age limit will be 25 years in the case of candidates already employed in Government Departments and are qualified in other respects.

(iv) Candidates should possess at least—

The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English).

(v) Candidates must—

(a) be not less than five feet in height.

(b) possess good sight and hearing,

(c) not stammer or have any other defect of utterance which would prevent them from efficiently carrying out traffic and operating duties.

5. *Documents.*—(a) No documents or copies of documents should be attached to the application form. All certificates and documents required to establish eligibility in respect of 4 (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) above should be produced at the Viva Voce Test by candidates summoned for it. (See section 9 below.)

(b) Admission to the Examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.

Note.—(a) Where a candidate has not received his Senior School Certificate he should produce a statement from his Head of School if he took the examination as a School candidate or the Result Slip issued to him by the Commissioner if he took the examination as a private candidate.

(b) The Birth Certificate should be on form Registration B 78 (a). Affidavits and Certificates of Baptism as substitutes for birth certificates, and the special certificate of birth issued for purposes of admission to Schools, will not be accepted.

Where the name/names appearing in the birth certificate differs/differ from the name/names which the candidate ordinarily uses and under

which the candidate enters for the examination a valid affidavit to the effect that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person must be attached. In the case of a candidate who has a parent living, the affidavit must be by the parent. In the case of others, the affidavit must be by a guardian or close relative. In no case will an affidavit by the candidate himself be accepted.

Action should also be taken forthwith in terms of section 19 or 20, as the case may be, of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), to get the name in the birth registration entry amended by the Registrar-General, the Provincial Registrar, or the Assistant Provincial Registrar of the district in which the birth took place. That such action is being taken should be stated in the affidavit. A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted for purposes of making appointments only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established.

6. Penalty for furnishing False Particulars.—Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to dismissal. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalized.

If at any time, during the period of service of a person appointed to a post on the results of this examination, it is proved that he has been ineligible to sit for this examination, he will be immediately dismissed from the service.

7. Refunds.—No refunds will be made under any circumstances.

Fees paid for this examination cannot be transferred to any other examination.

8. Scheme of Examination.—Candidates should be capable of writing legibly. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling.

9. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is held first and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the Viva Voce Test. The number to be called for the Viva Voce examination will be fixed by the Postmaster-General. The Viva Voce examination will be held in Colombo. Non production of any of the required documents (vide section 5 above) will render a candidate liable to disqualification.

10. Medical Examination.—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their eligibility in respect of 4 (v) above and as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island. Any candidate admitted for training or to the service before the medical examination and found to be unsuitable after the medical examination will be rejected

Note.—The number of appointments in Class I will be one-sixth the number of appointments in Class II and Special Class will consist of one or two appointments as decided by the Treasury and will be personal appointments. 12 Training—(1) Successful candidates will be required to undergo a course of training in traffic and operational duties at the Overseas Telecommunication Office for a period of one year. They will not be required to pay any fees or deposit. They will receive the training allowance plus cost of living allowance and special

living allowance as indicated above, subject to a proportionate deduction during vacations or absence from any cause whatever, but the payment of allowance is contingent on satisfactory behaviour and progress. Any candidate who does not satisfy the Director of Telecommunications as regards progress in his work, or studies and good behaviour is liable to summary rejection at any time during the period of training and forfeiture of his allowance and any candidate so rejected will for the future be ineligible for service in the Posts and Telecommunications Department.

(i) At the end of the period of training candidates will be examined in the subjects in which they have been trained. Those who pass will be appointed as Overseas Telegraphists as vacancies occur, on trial for two years.

13. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts are permanent. The question of declaring them pensionable will be considered by Government.

14. *Conditions of Service.*—(i) A learner who resigns at his own request before completing his entire course of training at the Overseas Telecommunications Office or within five years of appointment as an Overseas Telegraphist will be required to refund all allowances drawn by him while under training.

(ii) Overseas Telegraphists will not be permitted to sit for an examination for entrance to any other Government Department or apply for or accept an appointment in any other Government Department during the first five years of their service in the Posts and Telecommunications Department.

(iii) Overseas Telegraphists are liable for duty on all days including Sundays and holidays. They will not be entitled to any additional remuneration for duty on holidays other than Post Office Holidays. They will be required to attend for periods of duty which may begin or end at any time of the day or night and, for this purpose, to reside in close proximity to their place of work.

(iv) Overseas Telegraphists will not, save in exceptional circumstances such as sudden illness, be permitted to absent themselves from work without leave. Where exceptional circumstances arise due information should immediately be given to the Head Office.

(v) Overseas Telegraphists will be subject to the regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Public Service Commission Rules, Financial and other standing regulations of the Government and of the Posts and Telecommunications Department.

(vi) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934, as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946.

13. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Deputy Food Controller, Colombo District, The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of

Attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.
