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Posts—Vacant

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay), appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute; at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949 at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Superintendent, Brackish Water Fisheries, in the Department of Fisheries. Applications, which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before the following dates:—

2. *Salary and Allowances*.—The salary attached to the post is as follows:—

On trial—1st year, Rs. 3,000 per annum; 2nd year, Rs. 3,360 per annum.

On appointment—Rs. 4,080 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 360 to Rs. 7,680 per annum.

Note.—The salary payable to a permanent and pensionable officer if seconded for service will be salary (including increments) of the seconded post subject to a limit of 150 per centum of the officer's substantive salary.

3. *Terms of Engagement*.—(i) The post is permanent but non-pensionable. The appointment will, in the first instance, be on trial for a period of two years.

(ii) The selected officer will be required to take up appointment at very short notice. He may be discontinued at any time during the period of trial if he is considered to be unsuitable for further employment.

He should pass departmental examinations in the National Languages (Sinhalese and Tamil) before he is confirmed in the post.

(b) is of excellent moral character and physically sound;
(c) (i) is a graduate of a recognized University with Zoology as a subject.

(ii) Applications will also be entertained from candidates who have sat for and are awaiting the results of the Final Examinations for Degrees of the University of Ceylon. The applications of such candidates will only be considered if they have been successful in obtaining their Degrees and that fact is notified to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, within a week of the publication of the results.

Post of Instructor in Sinhalese

APPLICATIONS are invited from persons qualified for appointment for a post of Instructor in Sinhalese at the Official Languages Bureau.

2. This officer will be required to conduct classes for training officers in the use of Sinhalese in Government offices according to a prescribed syllabus. He will be required to assist the Official Languages Bureau in other ways as well.

3. Reference is invited to the general conditions applicable to appointments to posts in the Public Service published at the beginning of Part I, Section II, of this *Gazette*.

4 *Salary, Allowances and Conditions of Service.*—

- (i) The post is temporary and non-pensionable.
- (ii) The salary attached to the post is Rs. 3,600 per annum (fixed). If an officer holding a permanent and pensionable appointment under Government is seconded to the post the salary payable to him will be the salary of the post subject to a limit of 150 per cent. of the officer's substantive salary.

- (i) is a graduate of a recognized University who has specialised in Sinhalese; or

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Assistant Food Controllers (Temporary) in the Food Commissioner's Department. Applications, which should be substantially in the form given below, should reach me on or before August 20, 1954.

2. *Salary Scale*.—The salary scale attached to the post is Rs. 3,600—8 of 180 and 6 of 240—Rs. 6,480. Efficiency Bar before Rs. 4,680.

3. *Qualifications required*.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration;
- (b) is of good character and physically sound;
- (c) (i) a graduate of a recognized University not less than 24 years and not more than 35 years. These age limits do not apply to permanent officers in the Public Service or to Price Control Inspectors and Stock Verifying Officers of the Department.
- (ii) an officer of the Executive Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service who is in receipt of a salary of Rs. 2,640 per annum or more with S. S. C. (English) and with administrative experience and recommended on the ground of exceptional merit by the Head of his Department.

Note.—Food and Price Control Inspectors and Stock Verifying Officers of exceptional merit who have served the Department for over 7 years and have been stagnating on the maximum of their salary scale for over 3 years and who possess the minimum educational qualifications of S. S. C. (English) will also be considered for appointment on a reduced salary scale of Rs. 3,000—5 of 120 and 7 of 180—Rs. 4,860 per annum.

4. *Terms of Engagement*.—(a) The post is temporary and non-pensionable and does not convey with it any claim whatsoever to any permanent employment under Government or preferential claim to any appointment in the Permanent Establishment. The appointment is terminable by the Crown at its pleasure. Should the officer wish to terminate his employment he should give one month's notice or pay a sum equivalent to one month's salary in lieu of notice. He should serve in any part of the Island in which he is called upon to serve.

(b) In the case of members of the General Clerical Service they will be seconded for a period of 2 years only and their pay will be limited to 150 per cent. of their substantive salary.

(c) The selected candidates will be required to furnish security in a sum of Rs. 2,500 in such manner as the Permanent Secretary may decide.

SURVEY DEPARTMENT

Examination for Appointment as Clerks and Draughtsmen

Date of Examination

A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the Survey Department as Clerks and Draughtsmen will be held in Colombo and at the following centres:—Kandy, Galle, Jaffna, Kurunegala and Batticaloa, on November 19 and 20, 1954.

Note.—Any centre for which a sufficient number of candidates do not enter will be cancelled.

Places for Competition

2. The number of places assigned for competition will not be less than 14 provided there are candidates who attain the required standard.

Salary

3. Successful candidates will be appointed on probation for two years to the General Clerks and Draughtsmen Class on a salary of Rs. 840 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum. Efficiency bars before Rs. 1,488 and Rs. 2,064.

Conditions of Service

4. (a) The grant of leave and other conditions will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934, as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946.

(b) Successful candidates will be required to enter into an agreement to serve for a period of three years in the department. Candidates will, during such period, diligently and efficiently discharge all duties which they may be required to do, and shall enter into a bond for the payment of rupees four hundred and twenty (Rs. 420) in the event of their leaving the department before the expiration of three years. They will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in draughtsmanship within one year of the date of appointment, and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed. On appointment, Clerks and Draughtsmen are given a full training in draughtsmanship for six months and a test is held at the end of this period to judge the proficiency in drawing and to qualify for first increment.

(c) Appointments are pensionable; officers do not, however, acquire pension rights until they are confirmed on the satisfactory completion of their period of probation. Candidates who have previous pensionable or non-pensionable service in Government or quasi-Government Departments will not be given incremental credit in respect of such service.

Applications

5. Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms which may be obtained from the Surveyor-General's Office, Fort, Colombo, up to August 23, 1954.

6. Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Surveyor-General, P. O. Box 506, Colombo, on or before August 26, 1954. Any application received after August 26, 1954, will be rejected. The application must bear a duly cancelled stamp or stamps to the value of Rs. 10.

7. The Surveyor-General will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned, who, on presenting themselves for examination, must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Surveyor-General together with their signature forms. A candidate not producing these forms will be refused admittance to the examination.

8. CANDIDATES SHOULD SEND IN THEIR APPLICATIONS STRICTLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REGULATIONS. ANY APPLICATION WHICH IS NOT ACCOMPANIED BY THE CORRECT DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION OR IS DEFECTIVE IN ANY OTHER RESPECT WILL BE REJECTED.

Eligibility

9. Candidates must be of good character.

10. Candidates must be Ceylonese.

11. Candidates must be not less than 17 years nor more than 24 years of age on August 1, 1954.

12. Candidates must furnish proof that they have previously passed at least—

- (a) the Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- (b) The Senior School (Sinhalese or Tamil) Certificate Examination together with one of the following:—
- (i) a credit pass in English at the S. S. C. Sinhalese (Tamil) Examination, or at the G. C. E. (Ordinary level—Sinhalese/Tamil Medium) Examination;
 - (ii) an ordinary pass in English Language at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examination;
 - (iii) a pass in the J. S. C. (English) Examination held by the Education Department or by a school approved by it; or
- (c) the Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- (d) one of the following examinations;

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Note.—The original certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application form.

13. Candidates entitled to War Service concession should furnish documentary proof of such service when forwarding their applications.

Note.—(i) The War Service concession referred to does not apply to civilian employees in Service Departments:

(ii) Civil Defence Services will be held to include only those services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.

(iii) A person who while serving in one of these services was also employed otherwise or was a student at school will not be considered to have done full-time service.

14. (i) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth must be attached to the form of application.

(ii) Certificate of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii) Affidavits and baptismal certificates will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv) A certificate of registration in the register of past births will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) In the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, the parent or guardian should before obtaining the certificate apply to the

Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94, Legislation Enactments), or (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v) A certificate of good character must also be attached to the application. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, this certificate must be signed by the Principal of such school, otherwise it may be signed by the candidate's tutor or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

PENALTY FOR FURNISHING FALSE PARTICULARS

15. (i) If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the Regulations for this Examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the Examination.

(ii) Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalized.

(iii) Admission to the Examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.

16. If at any time, during the period of service of a person appointed on the results of this examination, it is proved that he has been ineligible to sit for the examination, he will be liable to immediate dismissal from the service.

Identity Cards

17. All candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor in respect of each subject they offer. For the purpose of this rule any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity card issued by the Postmaster-General.
- (b) A valid passport issued within three years of the date of the examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder, and issued within three years of the date of the examination, on the authority of a Government Department.

Note.—(i) Application forms for identity cards issued by the Postmaster-General are available at any Post Office in the Island.

(ii) No candidate will be admitted to the examination without any one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card and signature form.

Refunds

18. No refunds will be made under any circumstances.

Subjects for the Examination

19. The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

- (1) English Language and Composition. *Marks*

A one-and-a-half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis, and questions to test the correct use of the English Language } 150

- (2) General Paper.

A two-and-a-half hour paper in three sections as follows:—

- (a) 50 minutes. A test of accuracy with figures including tots and additions of various kinds
- (b) 50 minutes. A test of general intelligence
- (c) 50 minutes. A test of general and local knowledge

- (3) One of the following:—

Sinhalese
Tamil
Arabic
English
(Special Paper) } One hour paper 100

Candidates, both of whose parents are Sinhalese or both Tamil must take Sinhalese or Tamil, whichever language they prefer. Candidates who are not Sinhalese or Tamil will be given the option of offering Sinhalese or Tamil or Arabic or a special paper in English. Candidates of mixed parentage will be given the option of offering Sinhalese or Tamil, or if English or Arabic is the language of one of their parents, that language.

- (4) Drawing.

A two-and-a-half hour paper. Candidates will be required to make a free-hand enlarged outline drawing of a map in ink, with colouring and lettering. A specimen of this map can be examined by prospective candidates at the Surveyor-General's Office, Lower, Chatham Street, Fort, Colombo, and at the Divisional Survey Offices at Galle, Kurunegala, Anuradhapura and Badulla. Candidates are required to bring Indian ink, water colours and drawing materials. } *Marks* 150

- (5) Viva Voce test.

Candidates are required to produce at the viva voce test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission for appointments as Clerks and Draughtsmen } 100

N.B.—Candidates with a knowledge of Shorthand and Type-writing will receive special consideration in the viva voce test.

20. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the result of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the viva voce test.
