GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations; and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay, appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund; and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

2. Salary, Allowances and Conditions of Service.—The salary scale attached to the post is Rs. 4,800—Rs. 8,400 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 360.

Note:—The selected candidate if holding a permanent post in the Public Service will be eligible for acting pay in accordance with the Financial Regulations. A selected candidate from outside the Public Service will be paid a fixed salary and may be placed at a higher point than the initial of the scale if he possesses high qualifications and experience which make him eminently suitable for the post.

3. Terms of Engagement.—The post is temporary and non-pensionable and it does not carry with it any claims whatsoever to any permanent employment under Government and is terminable at one month's notice on either side. The selected candidate for this post will be engaged for the period ending May 31, 1956, on which date the permanent holder of the post is due to revert back to his substantive duties. The possibility exists, however, that the permanent officer may return to his substantive post at an earlier date in which case the temporary holder of this post will be required to vacate it.

- (b) is of excellent moral character and physically sound;
- (c) is a graduate of a recognized University with at least 3 years' journalistic experience;

SELECTION OF STUDENT DELEGATES TO THE 1955 NEW YORK HERALD TRIBUNE FORUM FOR HIGH SCHOOLS

A. Purpose of the Forum

TO give a representative group of secondary school students from all parts of the world a chance to—

- (i) Make friends with each other ;
- (ii) Discover the United States of America—not as tourists, but by becoming members of typical American school communities and family groups ;
- (iii) Teach Americans about their countries. Delegates are used literally as “walking textbooks” in all host schools in U. S. A.

B. General Qualifications required from Delegates

- (i) An active interest in world affairs, combined with basic knowledge of the home country and some understanding of its problems.
- (ii) Intellectual curiosity, ability to adapt readily to unfamiliar situations, interest in new experience for its own sake.
- (iii) Working knowledge of the English Language. Delegates must be articulate if they are to represent their countries well in forums and classroom discussions in the United States. Lack of fluency in English can be an insuperable handicap to an otherwise qualified delegate.
- (iv) Excellent health is an absolute requisite.
- (v) Personal appearance is an important consideration since delegates come into brief contact with so many people in large school assemblies, television appearances, &c.
- (vi) Both boys and girls are eligible. The Forum Authorities would wish to have a fairly equal distribution of boys and girls at the forum.
- (vii) Age. No delegate can be accepted who is younger than sixteen or older than eighteen and a half years. Preference will be given to candidates who have not completed secondary school education before their departure for the United States.
- (viii) No delegate can be accepted who has the intention or hope of asking permission to deviate from the scheduled programme of forum activities. This specifically includes departure from the United States and itinerary of the homeward trip.

C. Rules of the Competition

- (i) The contest is open to students of Senior Secondary, Government, Assisted and Unaided Schools. The competitors should be citizens of Ceylon by birth who have a good working knowledge of the English Language and who will have passed their sixteenth birthdays before January 1, 1955, but who will not be nineteen years old before June 30, 1955.
- (ii) Preliminary selection of candidates will be made on the basis of a 1,500-word essay in English, entitled “The World We want”.
- (iii) Each competitor should have over, on or before September 20, 1954, his or her essay to the Principal of the school together with a signed statement by the competi-

tor's parents that he or she will be permitted to make the trip if finally selected.

- (iv) The Principal of the school will forward the best essay from his school together with the signed statement of the competitor's parents and also a certificate giving the actual date of birth of the competitor, under registered cover to the Director of Education, Branch M, Malay Street, Colombo 2. The essay should reach the Director not later than September 25, 1954.
 - (v) The selection will be made at a final contest before a panel of three judges. This contest will be held early in October, 1954.
- D The selected delegate from Ceylon will be required to travel by air to New York on or about December 26, 1954, and will return to Ceylon on or about March 31, 1955. Free transportation will be provided from Colombo. Board and lodging is furnished by host families in U. S. A.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING—CONDITIONS OF SERVICE, &c.

Candidates should be qualified in General Nursing and below 35 years of age on October 1, 1954. They must be Ceylonese.

2. Eligible candidates will be interviewed by a Selection Board which will select suitable candidates for training. A competitive examination may be held.

3. Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical test.

4. On being selected they will undergo training in Public Health Nursing for six months at the Health Unit, Kalutara, and in Midwifery for twelve months at the De Soysa Maternity Hospital, Colombo; if they have not had the training in the latter already. At the end of each course they will be required to pass an examination in the subjects studied.

5. The period of training as well as one year thereafter will be on probation.

6. The Director of Health Services reserves to himself the right of discontinuance at any time during the probationary period, the services of nurses who are found to be unsuitable.

7. Uniforms to be worn while on duty will be provided free of charge.

8. During the period of training they will be paid Rs. 1,488 per annum as salary together with the following allowances :—

Washing allowance, Rs. 60 per annum.

House allowance, Rs. 30 per mensem, when furnished quarters are not provided (if not a new entrant to Government Service).

They will not contribute towards the Public Service Provident Fund during training. No incremental credit will be given during the period of training.

9. During the period of training in Midwifery and if free quarters are available at the De Soysa Maternity Hospital, Colombo, the house allowance will not be paid.

10. On satisfactory completion of the training salary will be paid on the scale of Rs. 1,920—120—Rs. 2,880 per annum. On appointment all officers will have to contribute towards the Public Service Provident Fund.

11. Public Health Nurses are liable to serve in any part of the Island.

12. Candidates must be able to speak Sinhalese and Tamil and to read either of the languages before the granting of the first increment.

13. There will be an Efficiency Bar Examination before reaching the step Rs. 2,640, i.e., at the sixth year of service.

14. Candidates will be required to sign a bond to serve the department for a period of three years on satisfactory completion of training.
