#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

**Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

**Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

**Terms of Engagement.**—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay, appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

**Qualifications required.**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

**War Service Concession.**—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

**Other Requirements.**—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

**POST OF WARDEN, HOSTEL AND CENTRE FOR CEYLON STUDENTS IN LONDON**

APPLICATIONS are invited from members of the public for a temporary post of Warden of the Hostel and Centre for Ceylon Students in London which will be established in October, 1954, under the Ceylon High Commission in the United Kingdom. The appointment will be subject to provision being made for the post in the Estimate for 1954-55. Applications which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should be sent to reach this office on or before the following dates:—

2. Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

The salary attached to the post will be £760 per annum and the candidate will, if residing in Ceylon at the time of his selection, be paid an Outfit Allowance. **TRAINING FACILITIES UNDER THE COLOMBO PLAN TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION SCHEME FOR THE STUDY OF THE ACCOUNTING ASPECTS OF ELECTRICITY REVENUE COLLECTION**

APPLICATIONS are invited from members of Classes I, II and III of the Government Accountants' Service for the award of training facilities for the study of the accounting aspects of electricity revenue collection, billing of consumers, &c. The training will be for a period of six months.

Applications, which should be made on special forms obtainable from this office, must reach me on or before the following dates:—

2. *Terms of Award.*—The United Kingdom Government will meet the transport and other approved expenses normally attached to these awards.

The selected candidate will be required to pass a medical examination by a Medical Board appointed by Government as to his physical and mental fitness to undergo a course of training in the country in which it is to be undertaken. A high degree of physical and mental health is required. The fee for this examination will have to be paid by the candidate.

### Post of District Inspector

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(1) The post is pensionable under the Government Pension Minute. If a female officer is appointed, she will be entitled to Provident Fund benefits. The selected candidate will, if not in the permanent pensionable service under Government, be appointed on two years' probation or trial as the case may be

(ii) The selected candidate will also be required to qualify in the Second National Language (i.e., the language other than the one referred to in sub-paragraph (1) (c) of paragraph 4) within two years from the date of appointment. The period taken in excess of two years to qualify in the Second Language will operate as a deferment of increment with corresponding loss of seniority.

(iii) The officer may be discontinued at any time during the period of probation/trial or at the end of it, if he/she is considered to be unsuitable for further employment.

4. *Qualifications required.*—(1) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he/she—

- (a) is not more than 45 years of age on October 15, 1954. (This age limit will not apply in the case of Inspectors of Schools, Grade I, in service);
- (b) is a graduate of a recognized University (preference will be given to Honours Graduates with a good class or Trained Graduates);

(c) has at least passed in Language and Literature at the Senior School Certificate (Sinhalese Medium) Examination or at the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) Sinhalese Medium Examination;

(d) is possessed of not less than six years' service either as a teacher in a Government or Assisted School or College and/or Inspector of Schools with not less than 3 years' service either as a Graduate Teacher and/or Inspector of Schools, Grade I;

(e) is of good moral character and physically sound.

(2) Non-graduate Inspectors of Schools, Grade I, who have passed the second efficiency bar in their present grade are eligible to apply irrespective of age limit and academic qualifications provided they were in service in the Education Department as Government Teachers or Inspectors of Schools prior to April 2, 1940, if there is no break in service since that date.

Note (1)—This sub-paragraph (ii) does not exempt applicants from the requirement (c) in sub-paragraph 4(1).

(ii)—Those officers who were absorbed to Grade I of the Inspectorate with no prospects of promotion to the Grade of District Inspector until they obtain a degree of a recognized University will not be eligible to apply under this sub-paragraph.

5. All Inspectors of Schools who have the necessary qualifications and wish to be considered for promotion should apply on the prescribed form.

## Colombo Plan Fellowships for Sisters, Lower Grade Matrons and Nurses

APPLICATIONS are invited from registered Nursing Sisters, lower grade Matrons and qualified Nurses of the Department of Health for the award of the under-mentioned fellowships in U.K. under the Colombo Plan for a period of one year:—

- (1) Orthopaedic Nursing—One.
- (2) Eye Nursing—Two.
- (3) Ear, Nose and Throat Nursing—Two.
- (4) Urological Nursing—Two for male nurses.
- (5) Psychiatric Nursing—One for male nurses.
- (6) Obstetric Nursing—One
- (7) Operating Theatre Technique—Two

## 2. The conditions of eligibility are as follows:—

- (a) should be under 35 years of age on March 1, 1954.
- (b) Should possess the J. S. C (English) or its equivalent Preference will be given to those with the S. S. C. (English)
- (c) Should have at least 2 years' experience in general nursing after satisfactorily completing the period of professional training in a Nurses' Training School

*Note.*—Preference will be given to candidates who have had experience in the specialities they apply for.

## 3. All applicants must be Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" means—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

4. A high standard of both mental and physical fitness is necessary Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination by a Board of Government Medical Officers as to their mental and physical fitness.

5. Candidates will be required to present themselves for an interview in Colombo at an appointed time and place which will be notified later. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

## 6. The selected candidates will be required to—

- (a) enter into an agreement with the Government of Ceylon undertaking among other things to follow the prescribed courses and complete satisfactorily their courses of studies and to serve the Government for a specified period (to be decided by Government) after completion of their courses of study;
- (b) enter into a personal bond undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the total cost of training (i.e., salary, allowances, cost of passages, &c., paid on account of the fellowship from Ceylon Government funds and/or by the Government of the United Kingdom under the Colombo Plan), in the event of their failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the agreement.

## 7. The award of the fellowship includes—

- (a) A grant of £40 for the purchase of warm clothing (a sum of £20 out of this amount can be drawn in Ceylon and the balance on arrival in the United Kingdom).

- (b) A monthly maintenance grant as laid down by the Colombo Plan Authorities.
- (c) A reasonable allowance for the purchase of books and apparatus.
- (d) Cost of passage to and from the United Kingdom and also cost of any internal travel in the country of study;
- (e) Study leave on full-pay, half-pay and /or no pay as may be decided on by the Treasury taking into consideration the allowances granted by the Colombo Plan Authorities.

8. The selected candidates will not be entitled to any enhanced emoluments as a result of their undergoing the training.

APPLICATIONS of all private students seeking admissions to the universities and other institutions in countries outside Ceylon except Australia for the purpose of pursuing engineering and technical studies should be made in triplicate on forms obtainable from the office of the Director, Ceylon Technical College. 19. The bags in which the livestock food is supplied will be returned only after the stuff is emptied into the containers at the respective farms. Freight charges for the return of receptacles should be borne by the contractors.

20. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labour in carrying out the work tendered for.

The employment of only Ceylonese labour in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation.
