GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

Enlistment of Private Soldiers (Recruits)

APPLICATIONS for enlistment in the Army in the rank of Private are called for from candidates who fulfil the following qualifications:—

- (a) is a Ceylonese. This means that he—
 - (i) should be a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration; or
 - (ii) should have applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship.
- (b) be not less than 18 or more than 21 years of age on July 16, 1955,
- (c) has passed at least the Fifth Standard in English, Sinhalese or Tamil;
- (d) is of a height of not less than 5 feet 4 inches and of a chest measurement of approximately 32 inches;
- (e) passes a medical test to the satisfaction of the Commander of the Army

The educational and physical qualifications stated above are the minimum required. Preference will, however, be given to those of higher educational and better physical standards

2. Applications will be made in the form appearing at the end of this notification. Applications which are NOT in accordance with the prescribed form will be rejected NO printed application forms are available.

3. Application forms will be forwarded to reach the Recruiting Officer, Army Headquarters, P. O. Box 553, Colombo, not later than May 5, 1955. Applications and envelopes enclosing them must be marked "APPLICATION FOR ENLISTMENT".

4. Under no circumstances will applications be considered unless candidates possess the necessary qualifications stated in paragraph 1 above.

- (a) Candidates considered suitable for interview will be required to appear at their own expense for interview by the Recruiting Board which will sit in Colombo and certain other selected towns in Ceylon. Such candidates will be notified individually of the time, date and location of interview.
- (b) Candidates who have been interviewed and are considered suitable for enlistment by the Recruiting Board will thereafter be required to appear in Colombo at their own expense for the Medical Examination
- (c) Candidates who are passed fit for service will be enlisted.

7 Enlistment will commence on approximately July 5, 1955 and candidates who are unlikely to be free to accept an engagement from that time are accordingly advised not to apply

8. Those candidates who are selected will be enlisted in the rank of Private in the Army and will then undergo a course of training at the Recruit Training Depot. At the end of this training
