GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

DEPARTMENT FOR THE REGISTRATION OF INDIAN AND PAKISTANI RESIDENTS**Posts of Deputy Commissioner**

APPLICATIONS are invited for the posts of Deputy Commissioner in the Department for the Registration of Indian and Pakistani Residents from Advocates of the Supreme Court, serving Government Officers and from Government Pensioners who possess the qualifications set out in paragraph 4 below. Applications, which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before July 1, 1955.

2. Salary, Allowance and Conditions of Service.**I. Salary and duty allowance:—****(a) Government Pensioners will receive—**

- (i) the difference between salary at retirement and unreduced pension, together with
- (ii) a duty allowance equal to the difference between Rs. 500 and the sum received as at (i) above per mensem.

(b) Serving Government officers other than Assistant Settlement Officers will receive the salaries payable to them in their substantive posts together with a duty allowance calculated as follows:—

- (i) for new entrant officers—an allowance, monthly, equal to the difference between Rs. 700 and the officer's salary, subject to a limit of 50 per cent. of the officer's salary. If, however, the allowance so payable falls below a sum equal to the additional remuneration which the officer concerned would receive over and above his salary in his substantive post on appointment to act in a post, the initial salary of which is Rs. 8,400 per annum, the allowance will be equal to such additional remuneration.

- (ii) for non-new-entrant officers—an allowance, monthly, equal to the difference between Rs. 750 and the officer's salary, subject to a limit of 50 per cent. of the officer's substantive pay. If, however, the allowance so payable falls below a sum equal to the additional remuneration which the officer concerned would receive over and above his salary in his substantive post on appointment to act in a post, the initial salary of which is Rs. 9,000 per annum, the allowance should be equal to such additional remuneration.

(c) Any Assistant Settlement Officer appointed to one of these posts will receive an allowance as at (b) (i) above or Rs. 200 per mensem, whichever is higher.**(d) Advocates will receive the scale Rs. 8,400—10 of 480—Rs. 13,200 (with 2 years' halt on Rs. 11,280 and efficiency bar before Rs. 11,760).**

II. Rent allowance, temporary cost of living allowance and special living allowance are payable according to Government Regulations. The basis of payment of these allowances to Government pensioners appointed to these posts will be the aggregate of their unreduced pension and the salary paid in terms of 2. I (a) (i) above.

III. Persons appointed to these posts will be posted within the Central, Uva and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and will be liable to transfer within those provinces.

3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts are non-pensionable; serving Government officers who are selected will be seconded at the instance of Government.

4. Qualifications required.—(i) Every applicant must be either—

- (a) An Advocate of the Supreme Court with not less than 5 years' practice at the Bar or
 - (b) A Government pensioner who, at the time of retirement, held a post listed in Ceylon Civil List of the year in which he retired, or
 - (c) A serving Government Officer who is a graduate of a recognized university, or a Barrister-at-law, or an Advocate, or a Proctor of the Supreme Court, or holds a post listed in the Civil List, or one who has held a staff appointment under Government for over 10 years, or
 - (d) A Chief Headman on the salary scale of Rs. 3,600—180, 240—Rs. 7,680 per annum who has been compulsorily retired on abolition of office, or
 - (e) A retired President, Rural Courts, who is a graduate of a recognized university or a Barrister-at-law or an Advocate or a Proctor of the Supreme Court, or
 - (f) Any person who has held a Government or semi-Government staff appointment for over 10 years. The basis of remuneration will be fixed in such cases in consultation with the Treasury.
- (ii) Every applicant must be physically sound and fit to serve in any part of the Island.

5. Applications from serving Government officers, who are qualified under paragraph 4 (i) (b) above, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In forwarding an application from a serving Government officer, the Head of his Department should state whether he is prepared to release the applicant if he is selected, in terms of Administrative Regulation 109. Such an application received in this office after the prescribed date will not be entertained, unless the application was received by the Head of the Department before the prescribed date and the Head of the Department recommends acceptance, adducing valid reasons for the delay.

POSTS OF PRESIDENT, RURAL COURT

THE Judicial Service Commission invites applications from Ceylonese lawyers, possessing a good knowledge of the Sinhalese language, for two posts of President, Rural Court. The posts are in Kandyan areas and preference will be given to Kandyan applicants.

Applications should be made on the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the Secretary, Judicial Service Commission, P. O. Box 573, Colombo 12, and should reach the Secretary before 12 noon on July 8, 1955.

A transport allowance and rent allowance will also be paid according to the rules and rates sanctioned by the Government. The selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination in regard to physical fitness and will be liable to transfer as President to any other Rural Court in the Sinhalese-speaking area of the Island. The appointment will be subject to a period of probation.

AIRCRAFT AND ADMINISTRATIVE APPRENTICES—ROYAL AIR FORCE

UNDER the Commonwealth Scheme of Entry into the Royal Air Force eight vacancies have been allotted to Ceylon in the May, 1956, Entry, for those desirous of joining the Royal Air Force as either Aircraft or Administrative Apprentices.

2. Candidates who wish to apply for these vacancies are invited to send in their applications to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence and External Affairs, on or before July 29, 1955.

3. Application forms and further particulars regarding the Scheme of Entry will be furnished by the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs on application.

4. Candidates should be British subjects and sons of parents both of whom are (or, if deceased, were at the time of death) British subjects. They should also be members of families established and resident in Ceylon; sons of parents whose connection with Ceylon is only temporary or official will not be considered.

5. Candidates should also have passed the Junior School Certificate or equivalent examination, in the English medium, and should have a good knowledge of English.

6. In the case of applications for aircraft apprenticeships, candidates should be between 15 and 17 years of age (or in exceptional cases between 15 and 17½) on May 1, 1956, and in the case of applications for Administrative Apprenticeships, candidates should be between 16 and 17 years of age (or in exceptional cases between 15½ and 17½) on the same date.

7. Candidates satisfying the above conditions will be required to sit for a qualifying examination for which an entry fee of Rs. 10 will be charged.

8. Those candidates who are successful at this examination will be required to appear before a Selection Board and also undergo a medical inspection at which they will be required to attain the high standard of physical fitness demanded by the Royal Air Force.

9. Selected candidates will be provided with 3rd class passages to the United Kingdom and will be required to leave Ceylon either at the end of February or in the beginning of April, 1956.

Application for 1955 Fellowships under the Colombo Plan (Australia)

APPLICATIONS are invited from qualified nurses employed in the Department of Health for the award of six junior fellowships, tenable in Australia for one year, two in each of the following specialities :—

- Sister Tutors Diploma Course,
- Nursing Administration Diploma Course,
- Operating Theatre Technique and Management.

2. The proposed training will not entitle the selected candidates to enhanced emoluments.

3. Applicants for—

- (a) Sister Tutors,
- (i) should be under 40 years of age ;
 - (ii) should have at least two years' nursing experience after passing out of the Nurses' Training School ;
 - (iii) should possess the J. S. C. (English) or Senior Domestic Science Certificate or equivalent or higher qualifications. Preference will be given to Nurses with the Senior School Certificate (English).

- (b) Nursing Administration,
- (i) should be under 45 years of age ;
 - (ii) should have at least two years' nursing experience after passing out of the Nurses' Training School ;
 - (iii) should be in the Sisters' Grade or in the Higher Grade of Matrons or Assistant Matrons.

(c) Operating Theatre Technique and Management,

- (i) should be under 40 years of age ;
- (ii) should possess at least two years' nursing experience after passing out of the Nurses' Training School ;
- (iii) should possess the J. S. C. (English) or Senior Domestic Science Certificate or equivalent or higher qualifications. Preference will be given to Nurses with the Senior School Certificate (English).

4. All applicants must be Ceylonese. Ceylonese means "a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration".

5. A high standard of physical fitness is necessary. Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination by a Board of Government Medical Officers as to their physical fitness.

6. Candidates will be required to present themselves for an interview in Colombo at an appointed time and place which will be notified later. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

7. Study leave on full-pay, half-pay and/or no pay as may be decided by the Treasury, taking into consideration the allowances granted by the Colombo Plan authorities, will be granted.

8. The selected candidates will be required to—

- (a) enter into agreements with the Government of Ceylon, undertaking among other things to follow the prescribed courses and complete satisfactorily their courses of studies and to serve the Government for a specified period (to be decided by Government) after completion of their courses of study ;
- (b) enter into bonds, undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the total cost of training (i.e., salary, allowances, cost of passages, &c., paid on account of the fellowship from Ceylon Government funds and/or by the Government of Australia under the Colombo Plan) in the event of their failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the agreement.

(b) recruits who do not possess the basic educational qualifications stipulated in paragraph 4 will not be eligible to enter the Higher Grade of Stenographers unless and until they obtain the basic educational qualification.

6. Applications from officers holding permanent appointments in Government Service will be accepted only—

(a) in cases where the Head of the Department or the Head of the Service certifies that he is agreeable to the release of the officer for appointment for the Supreme Court post in the event of his selection for appointment.

(b) he is prepared to resign his substantive post.

A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the Survey Department as Clerks and Draughtsmen will be held in Colombo and at the following centres:—Kandy, Galle, Jaffna, Kurunegala and Batticaloa, on September 30 and October 1, 1955.

Note.—Any centre for which a sufficient number of candidates do not enter will be cancelled.

Places for Competition :

2. The number of places assigned for competition will be not less than 25, provided there are candidates who attain the required standard

Salary :

3. Successful candidates will be appointed on probation for two years to the General Clerks and Draughtsmen Class on a salary of Rs. 960 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,688 per annum. Efficiency bars before Rs. 1,608 and Rs. 2,184.

Conditions of Service :

4. (a) The grant of leave and other conditions will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934, as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946.

(b) Successful candidates will be required to enter into an agreement to serve for a period of three years in the department. Candidates will, during such period, diligently and efficiently discharge all duties which they may be required to do, and shall enter into a bond for the payment of rupees four hundred and twenty (Rs. 420) in the event of their leaving the department before the expiration of three years. 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Age Concession to Temporary Clerks and Draughtsmen of the Survey Department :

13. Temporary Clerks and Draughtsmen in the employ of the Survey Department on June 10, 1955, will be permitted to sit for the examination,

provided they possess the educational qualifications specified in para. 12 and are under 45 years of age on August 1, 1955.

14. Candidates entitled to War Service concession should furnish documentary proof of such service when forwarding their applications.

Note.—(i) The War Service concession referred to does not apply to civilian employees in Service Departments.

(ii) Civil Defence Services will be held to include only those services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.

If the name appearing in the birth register differs either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, the parent or guardian should before obtaining the certificate apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94, Legislative Enactments) or (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years—he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Surveyor General that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v) A certificate of good character must also be attached to the application. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, this certificate must be signed by the Principal of such school, otherwise it may be signed by the candidate's tutor or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES

Hospital Clerical Service Examination

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter the Hospital Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, on September 17, 1955.

2. *Salary.*—(i) Successful candidates will be appointed to Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service on the salary of Rs. 960 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,688 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 1,206 per annum. Rent allowance and temporary cost of living allowance and special living allowance are payable in accordance with Government Regulations.

(ii) Successful candidates, with previous continuous service as temporary clerks in the Department of Health Services and the Quarantine Department, will be granted incremental credit as if they had been on the salary scales obtaining from time to time for Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service from the date of commencement of their temporary employment, provided that such incremental credit does not result in their being paid a salary higher than that received by them in their temporary office immediately prior to appointment to Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.

3 *Conditions of Service.*—(i) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be in accordance with Government Regulations.

(ii) The posts are temporary and non-pensionable. The appointment is terminable on one month's notice on either side. The selected candidate will be appointed on trial for a period of two years. Candidates will be required to pass an examination in the following, before promotion over the efficiency bar—

(a) Sinhalese and Tamil (conversation and interpretation);

(b) Rules, regulations and procedure relating to hospital accounts and administration.

(iii) Successful candidates will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders, or any other orders or regulations which may be issued from time to time by Government.

(iv) Successful candidates will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed.

(iv) Candidates must be between 17 and 25 years of age on September 1, 1955.

6. *Eligibility: Special conditions for ex-personnel of the Civil Defence Services.*—In computing age for the purpose of the age limit prescribed in paragraph 5 (iv), persons who have been full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions or Civil Defence Services (excluding those who were dismissed or had left those services of their own accord) for any length of time during the period September 3, 1939, to August 15, 1945, inclusive, will be allowed to deduct the

period of their continuous full-time service with those Services since September 3, 1939, from their ages. They should also have passed at least one of the following:—

- (6) Commercial Certificate (either section), Ceylon Chamber of Commerce.

Note.—(1) True copies (NOT ORIGINALS) of certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application.

(2) Civil Defence Service will be held to include only those services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.

7. (1) (a) Temporary Clerks, both in the Department of Health Services and the Quarantine Department also will be eligible to sit for the examination irrespective of educational qualifications, provided they—

- (i) are not more than 45 years of age on September 1, 1955;
- (ii) have completed one year's continuous satisfactory service in the Department of Health Services or the Quarantine Department; and
- (iii) are recommended by their superior officers as efficient, of good character, and fully capable of performing the duties of a hospital clerk in Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.

(b) Copies of certificates in proof of (i), (ii) and (iii) above should be attached to application

(c) A period of "break" not exceeding fifteen days will be condoned, if such break was due to retrenchment.

(2) Minor employees and Hospital Overseers of the Department of Health will be eligible to sit for the examination provided they—

- (i) possess the Junior School Certificate (in English) or higher qualifications;
- (ii) are not more than 45 years of age on September 1, 1955;
- (iii) have completed two years' continuous satisfactory service in the Department of Health on September 1, 1955;
- (iv) are recommended by their superior officers as efficient, of good character, and fully capable of performing the duties of a hospital clerk in Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.

8. (i) Applications should be substantially in the form specified below, and should be sent by registered post to reach the Office of the Director of Health Services, P. O. Box 500, Secretariat, Colombo 1, on or before July 20, 1955.

(ii) Applications will be rejected if they—

- (1) are received after the closing date specified in (i) above, and

The number to be called for the viva voce examination will be decided by the Director of Health Services. The viva voce examination may, however, be dispensed with in the event of the number of candidates qualifying for it falling short of the number of vacancies. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.
