GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

- 1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.
- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.
- (a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.
- (b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension 691——J. N. B 37063-1,481 (7/54)

- By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.
- (c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.
- (d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

- (e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
- (f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.
- 4. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- 5. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 6. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.
- (ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.
- (iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.
- (iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.
- (v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The public library established and maintained by the Council shall consist of—
 - (a) a lending library,
 - (b) a reference library, and
 - (c) a reading room.
- The supervision and general administration of the public library shall be vested in a library committee (hereinafter referred to as the 'Čommittee').
- (2) The committee shall consist of the following:-

 - (a) the Chairman of the Council,(b) the members of the Council, and
 - (c) not more than three other persons appointed by the Council
- (3) The Council may appoint a librarian who shall be in charge of the public library and shall be responsible for the maintenance of order in such library.

- 3. (1) The Chairman shall be ex-officio president of the Committee and shall preside at every meeting of the Committee In the absence of the Chairman at any meeting, the Vice-Chairman shall preside. In the absence of both the Chairman and the vice-Chairman at any meeting, such member of the committee as may be elected by the other members of the committee from among the members of the Council who are present at that meeting shall preside at that meeting.
- (2) The presiding member at any meeting of the committee shall have an original vote and if the votes cast on any question are equal, a casting vote.
- 4. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless there is a quorum of three members, two of them being members of the Council.

THE LENDING LIBRARY

- 5. (1) No person shall be eligible to be a member of the lending library unless he—
 - (a) has attained the age of fourteen years,

(b) is literate.

- (c) is resident or has an office or place of business, within the administrative limits of the Council, and
- (d) deposits with the Librarian a sum of rupees six in the case of an adult, or a sum of rupees three in the case of any student who produces a certificate from the Principal of any Government or Assisted School to the effect that he is a student of such school.
- (2) Every person desirous of being admitted as a member of the lending library shall make application in that behalf on a form obtainable from the librarian, and shall have such application endorsed by any one of the following persons:—
 - (a) a member of Parliament.
 - (b) a member of the Committee.
 - (c) a member of the medical or legal profession.
 - (d) a Justice of the Peace.
 - (e) a Government servant whose name appears in the annual civil list.
 - (f) a Principal of a Government or Assisted School situated within the administrative limits of the Council.
 - (g) an employee of the Council whose annual salary is not less than one thousand five hundred rupees.
- (3) No person who is entitled under the preceding provisions of this by-law to endorse an application shall be required to have his own application endorsed.
- 6. Every adult member shall pay a fee of one rupee per month and a student member a fee of fifty cents per month, before the tenth day of the month. Any member who fails to pay his fees for a consecutive period of three months shall ipso facto cease to be a member of the lending library.
- 7. The Librarian shall issue two tickets to every member of the lending library; and such member shall be entitled to borrow one book at a time on each such ticket.
- 8. A member of the lending library shall be responsible for every book removed by him from the library.
- 9. Where a member of the lending library loses a ticket issued to him, he shall forthwith report such loss to the Librarian. If the Librarian is satisfied that no book has been borrowed on such

- ticket or that any book borrowed on such ticket had been returned to him, he may issue to such member a duplicate ticket. No such duplicate ticket shall be issued by the Librarian unless there has clapsed a period of at least 30 days from the date on which the loss was reported.
- 10. Every book borrowed by a member from the lending library shall be returned to the Librarian within a period of fourteen days from the date on which the book was borrowed. The Librarian may however permit a book to be retained for a further period of fourteen days if such book is not required by any other member.
- 11. Where a member fails to return any book to the Librarian within the period referred to in by-law 10, he shall be liable to a fine of twenty-five cents in respect of each day the book is overdue.
- 12. Where a member fails to return a book within the thirty days next after the expiry of the period referred to in by-law 10, then such book shall be presumed to be lost.
- 13. Where a book borrowed by a member is lost or presumed to be lost, the member shall be liable to pay the cost of its replacement.
- 14 No member shall damage or injure in any manner any book he has borrowed from the lending library.
- 15. It shall be the duty of every member to bring to the notice of the Librarian any damage or injury in any book he intends to borrow from the lending library. Where he has failed to bring any such damage or injury to the notice of the Librarian, such book shall be presumed to have been issued to him without any injury or damage.
- 16. Where the Librarian is satisfied that a book returned by a member has been so damaged by him as to render it unfit for further circulation, the member shall be hable to pay the cost of its replacement. When the book has been replaced, the damaged book may be given to that member with the words "The Public Library Ambalangoda—sold as damaged" stamped thereon.
- 17. No member shall lend to any other person any book borrowed by him from the lending library.
- 18. (1) No member shall return to the lending library any book which, to his knowledge, has been used by any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease.
- (2) Where a book borrowed from the lending library by a member has been used by any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, such book shall be destroyed, and that member shall be liable to pay the cost of its replacement.
- 19. Where any dispute arises between two members of the lending library as to which of them should borrow a particular book, the Librarian shall settle the matter.
- 20. When a member wishes to borrow any book already borrowed by another member, he shall enter his name and the title of the book in a register kept for that purpose. The Librarian shall, on such book being returned by the member who borrowed it, issue it to the member who has entered his name in the register. Where two or more members have entered their names in the register for the same book, such book shall be 'ssued to them in the order in which they have entered their names in the register.
- 21. Any member who ceases to reside or have any office or place of business within the administrative limits of the Council shall cease to be a member of the lending library and shall surrender to the Librarian the two tickets issued to him under by-law 7.

- 22. The deposit paid to any person under by-law 5, less any sum due from him to the lending library shall be returned to him upon his ceasing to be a member.
- 23. Subject to by-laws 32, 33 and 34, the lending library shall be kept open daily except on Saturday and Wednesday, from 9 a m. to 12 noon and from 2 30 p m. to 6 30 p.m. On Saturdays it shall be kept open from 2.30 p.m. to 6 30 p m. On Wednesdays it shall be closed for the whole day.

REFERENCE LIBRARY

- 24. No person shall make use of the reference library unless he-
 - (a) has obtained permission from the Librarian for that purpose, and
 - (b) has signed the register kept in the reference library.
 - 25. The Librarian may permit any person who-
 - (a) has attained the age of fourteen years, to make use of the reference library.

(b) is literate, and

- (c) is resident within the administrative limits of the Council,
- 26. No person shall remove from the reference library any book issued to him for purposes of reference.
- 27. Subject to by-laws 32, 33 and 34, the reference library shall be kept open daily except on Saturdays and Wednesdays, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and from 230 pm. to 6.30 pm

On Saturdays it shall be kept open from 230 pm. to 6.30 p.m.

On Wednesdays it shall be closed for the whole day.

READING ROOM

- 28 No person shall make use of the reading room unless he-
 - (a) has obtained permission from the Librarian for that purpose, and
 - (b) has signed the register kept in the reading room.

 - 29: The Librarian may permit any person who—
 (a) has attained the age of fourteen years, to make use of the reading room.

- (c) is resident within the administrative limits of the Council.
- 30. Subject to by-laws 32, 33 and 34 the reading room shall be kept open daily except on Saturdays and Wednesdays, from 9 a m. to 12 noon and from 2.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m.
- On Saturdays it shall be kept open from 2.30 pm. to 630 pm.
- On Wednesdays it shall be closed for the whole day..
- 31. No person shall remove from the reading room any newspaper, periodical, magazine, map, document, or any other article placed in or belonging to the reading room.
- 32. The public library shall be closed on the New Year's Day, Sinhalese and Tamil New Year's day, Wesak, Poson, and Esala full moon days, Christmas day and any such other day as may be decided by the Committee.
- 33. The Committee may, for the purpose of stocktaking close the whole of the public library or any section thereof on any day fixed by them, after giving seven days notice.

- 34. It shall be lawful for the Committee, notwithstanding anything in the preceding provisions of these by laws,-
 - (a) to vary the hours specified in by-law 23, 27 or 30;
 - (b) to keep the library open on Wednesdays;
 - (c) to close the library on such dates as may be fixed by them for the purpose of stock-

GENERAL

- 35 No person who is suffering from or who has recently suffered from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall enter the premises of the public library until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.
