GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest), from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE**Village Committee Clerical Service, Grade II
Examination, November 13, 1954**

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter Grade II of the Village Committee Clerical Service will be held at Colombo, Kandy, Galle and Jaffna, on November 13, 1954.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. (i) *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to serve Village Committees on the salary scale of Rs. 576 per

annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 36 to Rs. 936 per annum. An efficiency bar operates before Rs. 792 per annum. Rent allowance, temporary cost of living allowance and a temporary special living allowance are payable according to Government regulations.

(i) *Conditions of Service*.—(a) The posts are permanent and pensionable and the selected candidates will be eligible for the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension benefits.

(b) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the by-laws of the Village Committee, the Village Committee Rules framed under the Village Communities Ordinance and the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations framed thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' probation. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(d) Successful candidates may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through guarantee associations approved by the Local Government Service Commission in sums which may be decided upon by the Local Authorities to which they will be appointed.

3. The names of the successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments, as and when vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility*.—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The terms "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least, either—

(a) the Junior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination with English as one of the subjects ; or

(b) the Junior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination and the 5th Standard (English)

NOTE.—TRUE COPIES OF CERTIFICATES OF EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS SHOULD BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM.

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph (6) (iv) (a) except that if necessary—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct period of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

(v) Candidates must furnish satisfactory proof that they have been resident in an area specified

in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945,* for at least three years immediately prior to July 31, 1954.

5. (a) Candidates in the permanent employ of a Local Authority with not less than five years' service on July 31, 1954, will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above.

(b) Temporary clerks employed in village committees with more than one year's continuous satisfactory service on July 31, 1954, will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above.

6. *Applications.*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the Office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Fort, Colombo, up to August 14, 1954, and forwarded by *registered post* to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo 1, to reach him not later than August 21, 1954. Any application received after that date will be rejected

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or Local Authorities, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of Departments or the Chairman, Special Commissioners or Commissioners of the Local Authorities in which they are serving. Any candidate who fails to do so, will be disqualified.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs 3.

(iv) The following documents must be attached to the form of application.—

(a) A certificate of registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than November 13, 1931, and not later than November 13, 1937.

Note.—(1a) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(1b) The special certificate of birth issued for purposes of admission to schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of birth, under section 18 (i) (b) of the Births and Deaths Regulation Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced, that the birth certificate is that of the candidate, and not that of any other person.

Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendments of the entry in cage 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for the rectification of the entry in cage 2.

(b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he had attended; otherwise, it may be from the candidate's teacher or school master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

(c) A certificate of residence from a Divisional Revenue Officer, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, to the effect that the candidate has been resident in an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, for at least 3 years immediately prior to July 31, 1954.

(d) True copies of the certificates of educational qualifications.

N.B.—(1) ANY APPLICATION WHICH IS NOT ACCOMPANIED WITH ALL OR ANY ONE OF THE DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THIS NOTIFICATION WILL BE REJECTED.

(2) DOCUMENTS THAT ARE NOT ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM, BUT ARE SENT LATER, WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

(3) APPLICATIONS NOT MADE ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM WILL BE REJECTED.

(v) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to the candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination, their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination hall.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the supervising examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should without delay write to

the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars:—

- (1) Name of examination.
- (2) Full name.
- (3) Full address
- (4) Examination centre at which candidate applied to take up the examination.

7. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during, or after the examination

If any of the particulars furnished by a candidate are found to be false within his knowledge, or if he has wilfully suppressed any material fact, or if it is found at any time, during the period of his service, that he was ineligible to sit for this examination, he will be liable to immediate dismissal from the service.

8 *Withdrawals and refunds*—In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made

9. *Leave to officers to attend examination.*—Heads of Departments, Chairmen, Special Commissioners and Commissioners of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers of their departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves at the examination

10 *Identity Cards.*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General
- (b) A valid passport issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination
- (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination on the authority of a Government Department

No candidate will be admitted to the examination hall without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

11. *Subjects*—The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

(1) Sinhalese or Tamil Language and Composition—a one and a half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the correct use of the language ..	200
(2) General Intelligence (in Sinhalese and Tamil)—a 45 minutes paper ..	100
(3) English—a one and a half hour paper which will include:	
(i) exercises on the comprehension of easy passages and on composition.	
(ii) questions to test the correct use of the language ..	150
(4) 'Viva Voce' Test ..	100

(Candidates are required to produce at the 'Viva Voce' Test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to this examination.)

12. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held, and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the 'Viva Voce' test. The number to be called for the 'Viva Voce' test will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates, whose writing is illegible, are liable to be disqualified. The 'Viva Voce' test will be held in Colombo.

13. *Medical Examination*—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, Chapter 181

REGULATION made under section 19 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance (Chapter 181), by the Colombo Municipal Council, the proper authority in that behalf in respect of general cemeteries, situated within the administrative limits of that Council.

NOTICE

The Municipal Council may under section 19 of Ordinance 9 of 1899 (Chapter 181), sell the exclusive right of burial in any graves in the portions of Kanatte Cemetery not sold for the special use of any religious denomination and the following fees have been approved:—

Fee for the purchase of a grave 4 by 4½ feet	40 0
Fee for the purchase of a grave 4 by 9 feet	150 0
Fee for the purchase of a grave 9 by 9½ feet	500 0
Fee for the purchase of a Military grave (for personnel other than the armed forces of the allied nations) 3 by 7 feet	40 0
Fee for extensions to existing graves per sq. ft	2 0
Grant fee to be paid at the time of purchase of grave	1 0
Fee for every assignment of grant	1 0
Fee for a certified extract from the register of burials or grant register	1 0
Fee for a duplicate copy of grant	1 0

For exclusive possession, sites of graves must be purchased within one year from date of burial. Sites not so purchased will be regarded as available for further burials at the discretion of the cemetery-keeper.

No grave shall be reopened within one year, nor vault within eighteen months from the last interment therein, except for a post-mortem examination as provided for by law.

In pursuance of its powers under sections 12 and 26 of the same Ordinance, the Municipal Council hereby gives notice that—

- (1) No grave, site or vacant space in the cemetery shall be enclosed with any permanent coping or wall and no tombstone or monument or vault of any description shall be erected thereon until such grave, site or vacant space has been purchased.

The proof of such purchase shall be the production of a grant, which must be available for the inspection of the cemetery-keeper. The caretaker of any section of the cemetery sold to religious denominations, under section 11 of Ordinance 9 of 1899 (Chapter 181), shall produce to the cemetery-keeper, proof of the sale of any such site or vacant space in the section under his care, before he allows it to be built upon.

- (2) No person shall plant any tree, palm, shrub or hedge or fix any bower for growing creepers on any grave space in the cemetery (whether purchased or not) or place thereon any large tub or flower pot or vase, bowl or any receptacle (that can hold water in which mosquitoes are able to breed) without the consent of the Cemetery-keeper.

By-laws relating to roads and paths

1 Every public road or path shall be constructed or reconstructed and maintained in accordance with any resolution of the Committee as to the width of such road or path and the course which it is to take

2 No person shall—

- (a) injure, damage obstruct, encroach upon or otherwise interfere with the use of any public road or path, whether constructed or in the course of construction; or
- (b) except with the written permission of the Committee, divert the course of any public road or path, whether constructed or in the course of construction

3. (1) It shall be the duty of the proprietors and cultivators of paddy fields through which a public path runs, to maintain such path at its customary width

(2) No person shall cut or encroach upon any public path so as to reduce its width to less than its customary width

4. When a range of paddy fields through which any public road or path passes is under cultivation, the cultivators of such range shall be entitled, with the previous permission of the Chairman and subject to such terms and conditions as he may impose, to erect a suitable gate across such road or path during the periods of cultivation in order to prevent cattle from trespassing on the paddy fields

5. No fence shall be erected in any paddy field within three feet from the middle of a ridge.

6 Whenever any work of construction or of repair is commenced on any public road or path, the Chairman shall have the power to prohibit the use of such road or path by the public for such time as may be necessary after giving at least three days' notice by beat of tom-tom or otherwise.

7. It shall be lawful for the Committee by a resolution duly passed in that behalf, to restrict or prohibit the use of any public road or path by any kind or class of heavy vehicular traffic.

8. Any officer of the Committee authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman shall have the power to make, scour, clean or keep open, all ditches, gutters, and drains or water-courses, and also to make and lay such trunks, tunnels, plates or bridges as he may deem necessary for the protection, preservation, improvement, repair, or construction of any street or road in or through any lands or grounds adjoining or lying near such street or road or proposed street or road.

9. It shall be lawful for any person authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman—

(1) to enter between the hours of 7 a.m and 5 p.m with all necessary servants, labourers, workmen, carts, animals and other implements and apparatus, upon any land adjacent to or near any existing or proposed public road or path within the village area and there severally to do and perform all acts, matters and things, authorised by the Committee in connection with the improvement, alignment, level, width or construction of that road or path;

(2) to throw upon any land adjacent or near thereto, such earth, rubble or materials, as it may be necessary to remove from the place of any such work, so however that such earth, rubble and materials shall be removed within a reasonable time;

(3) to make any temporary road through the grounds near any existing or proposed public road or path during the execution of any work in any way connected therewith, so however, that such roads shall not run over any ground whereon any building stands, or over any enclosed garden or yard; and

(4) to enter upon any land for the purpose of constructing, repairing or cleaning such drains or water-courses or culverts as may be necessary for the preservation, improvement, repair or construction of any public road, path or canal

10 In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;

"Committee" means the Village Committee of the village area; and

"village area" means the Nainativu village area
