Officers of the Mahara Prison had used force in order to bring under control an unrest which had arisen at the Mahara Prison last evening, said Police Media Spokesperson DIG Ajith

He said according to reports, one prisoner had died and three other inmates had been injured in the incident. In addition, four police teams

headed by the Kelaniya and Ragama OICs have been deployed to bring the situation under control. Teams of Special Task Force personnel had also been deployed to bring the situation under control.

These teams have been deployed in order to provide security to the outer perimeter of the Mahara Prison. A tense situation had arisen at the Mahara Prison due to a clash between

the prison guards and the inmates. With several of the prison inmates being infected with the Coronavirus, another group of prisoners had attempted to escape from prison. Referring to various state-ments being made regarding court verdicts in the country in the recent past, Justice Minister Ali Sabry, PC, said that the independence of the judiciary should be safe-

the judiciary should be sale-guarded.

"The independence of the judiciary should be pro-tected not for the Government or the Opposition, it should be safeguarded for the people of this country. Eventually the only place a person could go to seek justice is the Courts. Therefore, while safeguard-ing the independence of the judiciary, we must also remember that the judiciary is not bound to give their remember that the judiciary is not bound to give their verdicts to suit the whims and fancies of anyone," he

told the House. He noted that in the past many Court verdicts had been given to satisfy certain groups. "There are reasons for that. In the Civil Appellate Courts alone last Thursday, 60 verdicts were given and the Court of Appeal had given 30 verdicts. In between that several other Court verdicts were also given." However, he said the judiciary was under severe pressure during the last five years. He said the FCID was established in violation of the Police Ordinance. Sabry said it was very evident how this

UGC to provide computers to new entrants on easy payment terms

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has intended to provide computers to all the students that enter the universities this year.

UGC Chairman Prof. Sampath Amaratunga said that the People's Bank has agreed to provide a loan to every student to purchase a computer, and only the interest on that amount will have to be paid monthly during their university education.

He was speaking to the media after the launch of Research Papers for the year 2020 at the Postgraduate Institute of Science, at the University of Peradeniya on Thursday (26). The UGC Chairman said that the monthly interest for the loan of purchasing a computer is Rs.500 and after systematically paying it during the university period students will get the opportunity to pay the loan after being employed. He said this decision was taken as a separate amount was charged additionally apart from the interest by the previous loan given and students found it difficult to pay Rs.2,500 from the Rs.5,000 Mahapola Scholarship Fund.

Separate unit at CNH to conduct PCR tests on COVID dead

The Ministry of Health is to set up a separate unit at the Colombo National Hospital (CNH) to conduct PCR tests on remains of persons who die in their homes.

The Health Consultative Committee, chaired by Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi made this decision at the Committee meeting held at the Parliamentary Complex on Saturday.

The proposed unit will conduct the PCR tests The proposed unit will conduct the PCR tests on bodies that are taken to the morgue from homes due to the existing quarantine regulations. The unit will release the respective clinical reports of the PCR within 24 hours to enable the families to perform their religious rites accordingly if the PCR reports are negative. In the event of a positive report, the hospital would make its own arrangements
