GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers' (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified, must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

TRAINING FACILITIES UNDER THE COLOMBO PLAN TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION SCHEME FOR THE STUDY OF THE USE OF PUNCH CARD ACCOUNTING MACHINES

APPLICATIONS are invited from Public Officers for the award of training facilities in the United Kingdom in the use of punch card accounting machines including various accounting applications (e.g., costing, billing, payroll, &c.) in addition to those in the purely statistical field. Management and personnel problems attending the use of punched card accounting machines in the Public Service should also be studied from the general viewpoint of grading, pay, working conditions, training, output, career prospects, incentives, &c., in addition to the narrower viewpoint of the management of the single installation. The training will be for a period of three to six months.

Applications, which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before the following dates:—

(a) *Local applications*—November 26, 1954.

(b) *Overseas applications*—December 3, 1954.

2. *Terms of Award.*—The United Kingdom Government will meet the transport and other approved expenses normally attached to these awards.

3. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that the applicant—

(a) is not more than 40 years of age on November 26, 1954;

(b) is of excellent moral character and physically sound;

(c) has passed the London Matriculation or an equivalent examination;

(d) has experience in the use of accounting machines or has knowledge of statistical or mechanisation work.

A high degree of physical and mental health is required.

PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT DOCKING AND SLIPPING MASTERS—COLOMBO PORT COMMISSION

APPLICATIONS are invited for one or two vacancies in the posts of trainee Probationary Assistant Docking and Slipping Masters in the Colombo Port Commission.

3. Every applicant should furnish satisfactory proof that he—

CENTRAL CLERICAL EXAMINATION—1955**1 Date of Examination—January 28 and 29, 1955**

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter the General Clerical Class of—

- (a) the General Clerical Service, and
- (b) the Customs Clerical Service,

will be held in Colombo, and at the following centres—Gampaha, Kalutara, Moratuwa, Negombo, Galle, Hambantota, Matara, Batticaloa, Trincomalee, Apuradhapura, Kegalla, Ratnapura, Kandy, Matale, Nuwara Eliya, Jaffna, Mannar, Point Pedro, Vavuniya, Badulla, Vaddukkodai, Chilaw, Kurunegala and Puttalam, commencing on January 28, 1955

Any centre for which a sufficient number of candidates do not enter may be cancelled

2. Salary—

Successful candidates appointed to the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service and the Customs Clerical Service will be placed on the salary of Rs 840 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum. In this scale efficiency bars operate before Rs 1,488 and Rs 2,064 per annum

3. Conditions of Service—

A *General*—(i) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934, as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946. Rent allowance will be payable. Posts are pensionable and appointments will be on 2 years' probation.

(ii) Successful candidates will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Public Service Commission Rules, Financial and other Standing Regulations of the Government and of the particular departments to which they are appointed

(iii) They will be required to pass a test in type-writing within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed

B. *Special*—Customs Clerical Service—Candidates appointed to the Customs Clerical Service will be on duty without additional remuneration on all public holidays other than Customs holidays

4. Appointments, how made—

Candidates may compete for one or both of the Services, subject to the conditions of paragraphs 6 and 12B. They must state, in their application forms, in the order of their preference, the Service for which they are competing. This choice will be considered to be final and no revision will be allowed

The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur. Candidates will be liable to be appointed to vacancies in a Service, which is not their highest preference, in case the vacancies in the Service, which is their highest preference, have already been filled. They will not be transferred from one Service to another after their appointment

(iv) Candidates must not be less than 17 years nor more than 22 years of age on January 1, 1955.

6. Eligibility of Candidates already employed in Government Departments—

(i) Clerks in the Assistant Clerks' Service controlled by the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury in categories (a), (b) and (c) below will be allowed to compete only for vacancies in the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service

(a) Those who, immediately prior to their entry into the Assistant Clerks' Service, were temporary clerks on monthly pay or temporary clerks on daily pay who would have been eligible for monthly pay had they continued in service as temporary clerks, provided they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii).

(b) Those who possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii) and are under 45 years of age on January 1, 1955.

(c) Those who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before November 10, 1954, and are under 45 years of age on January 1, 1955

(ii) Clerks in the Quasi-Clerical Service in categories (a) and (b) below will be allowed to compete for vacancies in any of the Clerical Services:

* For all purposes of recruitment to the Public Service the term "Ceylonese" is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration

- (a) Those who possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii).
 (b) Those who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before November 10, 1954, and are under 45 years of age on January 1, 1955

(iii) Persons holding permanent posts in Government employ on October 22, 1954, will be allowed to compete for vacancies in the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service provided—

- (a) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii),
 (b) they are under 45 years of age on January 1, 1955; and
 (c) their services are certified as satisfactory by the Heads of their Departments and the Heads of Departments are prepared to release them if they are selected for appointment to the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service.

Note.—(a) Officers belonging to Departmental Clerical Services, such as the Railway, Postal, Survey and Customs Clerical Services will *not* be eligible to sit for the examination under the above paragraph Officers in Departmental Clerical Services, recruitment to which has now ceased, will, however, be eligible.

(b) Successful candidates will not, under any circumstances, be allowed incremental credit for their previous services, and will be appointed to the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service on the initial salary of the scale for that Class.

(iv) Temporary clerks on *monthly pay* in Government employ on October 22, 1954, will be allowed to sit for this examination, irrespective of age, provided they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii).

(v) Officers holding temporary posts in Government employ on October 22, 1954, who are not eligible for the concession set out in paragraph 6 (iv), will be permitted to sit for the examination provided they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 5 (iii) and are under 45 years of age on January 1, 1955.

7. Applications—

(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Commissioner of Examinations, Colombo 2

Applications from candidates seeking admission to the examination under paragraph 6 above must be made on Form B; others should apply on Form A. Forms A may be obtained by personal callers from the Enquiry Office, Department of Examinations, or by post from the Commissioner of Examinations, Malay Street, Slave Island, P. O. Box 1508, Colombo 2, from November 1 to 10, 1954. Each candidate will be issued only one form

Forms B should be obtained from the Department of Examinations from November 1 to 10, 1954, by Heads of Departments or Offices for the use of officers employed in such departments or offices. These forms will not be issued by the Commissioner of Examinations to individual applicants either personally or by post

Note—Applications that are not on the appropriate form will be rejected. Candidates are forbidden to amend the printed form in any way

Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Commissioner of Examinations, Colombo 2, on or before November 13, 1954. Any application received after that date will be rejected. The name of the examination and the centre at which the candidate wishes to be examined should be clearly written on the top left-hand corner of the envelope. (The centres at which the examination will be held are given in paragraph 1 above.)

(ii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10,

(iii) Candidates who are already employed in Government departments must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified. Candidates are requested to forward their applications to the Heads of their Departments well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Commissioner of Examinations to reach him on or before November 13, 1954.

(iv) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth must be attached to the form of application.

Note—(a) The special certificate of birth issued for purposes of admission to schools will not be accepted.

(b) Affidavits or baptismal certificates will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates

(c) Where the name/names appearing in the birth certificate differs/differ from the name/names which the candidate ordinarily uses and under which the candidate enters for the examination a valid affidavit to the effect that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person must be attached. In the case of a candidate who has a parent living, the affidavit must be by the parent. In the case of others, the affidavit must be by a guardian or close relative. In no case will an affidavit by the candidate himself be accepted. Action should also be taken forthwith in terms of section 19 or 20, as the case may be, of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), to get the name in the birth registration entry amended by the Registrar-General, the Provincial Registrar, or the Assistant Provincial Registrar of the district in which the birth took place. That such action is being taken should be stated in the affidavit. A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted for purposes of making appointments only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established.

(v) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Examinations must also be attached to the form of application. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended, otherwise it may be from a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, Divisional Revenue Officer or a permanent Government officer in receipt of an annual salary of Rs. 2,400 or over, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made. The name, designation and address of the person must be clearly indicated on the certificate. Candidates holding permanent posts in Government employ are not required to furnish a certificate of good character.

(vi) True copies (not originals) of certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application form. If a certificate has not been issued the candidate should quote the index number, centre, name and month of examination instead

If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

If any of the particulars furnished by a candidate are found to be false within his knowledge, or if he has wilfully suppressed any material fact, or if it is proved, at any time, during the period of his service, that he was ineligible to sit for this examination, he will be liable to immediate dismissal from the Service.

9 Refunds—
