# FIVE YEAR INCOME TAX WAIVER FOR AGRICULTURE, FISHERIES AND POULTRY SECTORS - PRESIDENT

Agriculture, Fisheries and Poultry sectors will be exempted from income tax for the next five years, President Gotahaya Rajapakas asid.

He was virtually joining in the inaugural session of the Sri Lanka Economic Summit yesterday.

Addressing the event, the President said tax concessions will be granted for strategic investments larger than ten million US dollars in value for agricultural product processing, IT, dairy, fabric, tourism and export industries.

"Exports are being strongly encour-aged through the removal of import

taxes on required raw materials, machin-ery, and equipment used by direct and indirect exporters. The private sector must introduce new technologies that enable farmers to produce more, and to target lucrative new export markets," he remarked. Addressing the event, the President also said the Government was in the process of bringing in new laws to protect investments. He emphasised the need to attract more Foreign Direct Investment and encourage more local

He noted that the Government was keen on addressing the problems which had delayed and stalled various projects including some funded by foreign Governments.
