GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE

THE following resolution passed by the Senate at a meeting held on November 9, 1954, and by the House of Representatives at a meeting held on November 2, 1954, is published for general information :—

“ This House resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that from the first day of January, 1955, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within each of the areas defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule

1. All that area of land situated in the villages of Attidiya, Boralesgomuwa, Wattarappola, Ratmalana North and Ratmalana South in the Kotte-Galkissa village area in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Colombo in the Colombo District, Western Province, and bounded as follows :—

North.—By a line drawn from a point on the eastern limit of the Dehiwala-Mt. Lavinia Urban Council area where the centre line of the road along the southern boundary of lot 29 in Dehiwala-Mt. Lavinia Town Survey Sheet No. 27 meets the said Urban Council limits, south-eastwards, north-eastwards and northwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the Village Committee road; thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said Village Committee road to the centre of its junction with the Public Works Department road leading to Ratmalana; thence eastwards, south-eastwards and again eastwards along the centre line of the road that leads to the canal till it meets the right bank of the canal; thence due eastwards across the canal to its left bank.

East.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the left bank of the said canal till it meets the left bank of the Weras Ganga; thence north-eastwards, northwards and south-eastwards along the said left bank till it meets the northern boundary of Salpiti Korale Divisional Revenue Officer's Division; thence westwards along the said Salpiti Korale boundary which runs across the Weras Ganga to its right bank; thence south-eastwards along the said Salpiti Korale boundary which runs along the right bank of the Weras Ganga till it meets the centre line of the cart road from the Colombo-Galle road to the Werahera Ferry.

South.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the northern boundary of the Salpiti Korale which runs along the centre line of the cart road from the Colombo-Galle road to the Werahera Ferry till it meets the southern extremity of the eastern limit of the Dehiwala-Mt. Lavinia Urban Council area.

West.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards and northwards along the eastern limit of the Dehiwala-Mt. Lavinia Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

2. All the area of land situated in the villages of Werahera, Katuwawala, Tunbowila, Wewala, Borupane, Telawala, and Katubedda in the Mampe-Kesbewa village area in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Salpiti Korale, in the Colombo District, Western Province; and bounded as follows:—

North.—By a line drawn from a point on the southern boundary of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Colombo at the south-eastern corner of lot 49 in P. Plan No. A 506 W. P., eastwards along the boundary of the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division crossing the Weras Ganga to its left bank; thence eastwards, northwards and again eastwards along the said boundary of the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division, till it meets the centre line of the Public Works Department road from Colombo to Kesbawa

East.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre line of the Public Works Department road from Colombo to Kesbawa till it meets the centre line of the Heen Ela about 14 chains south-east of the 10th mile post; thence south-westwards along the centre line of the said Heen Ela to a point 10 chains west of the north-western corner of lot Z446 in P.P. 8063 W. P., thence southwards in a straight line to a point where the centre line of the cart track leading to the road from the Wewala Ferry to the Colombo-Kesbawa Public Works Department road meets the centre line of the Tunbowila Ela shown in P.P.A. 814 W. P., thence south-eastwards and southwards along the centre line of the said cart track and the Village Committee road from Suwarapola to a point due north of the centre of the junction of the said Village Committee road from Suwarapola with the Public Works Department road from Moratuwa to Piliyandala; thence due southwards in a straight line to the said centre of the junction.

South.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards, north-westwards and westwards along the centre line of the Public Works Department road from Moratuwa to Piliyandala to the centre of the iron bridge over the Bolgoda Lake where it meets the eastern limit of the Moratuwa Urban Council area; thence northwards and westwards along the said eastern limit till it meets a point east of the Colombo-Galle road from where the said eastern limit turns north-westwards.

West.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards north-eastwards and again north-westwards along the eastern limit of the Moratuwa Urban Council area till it meets the southern extremity of the eastern limit of the Dehiwala-Mt. Lavinia Urban Council area at the centre of the cart road from the Colombo-Galle road to the Werahera Ferry; thence north-eastwards along the southern boundary of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Colombo which runs along the centre line of the said cart road to the right bank of the Weras Ganga; thence north-westwards along the said boundary of the said Divisional Revenue Officer's Division which runs along the right bank of the Weras Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

3 All that area of land situated in the village of Angulana in the Mampe-Kesbewa village area, in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Salpiti Korale in the Colombo District, Western Province; and bounded as follows:—

North.—By a line drawn from a point on the low-water mark of the sea at the western extremity of the southern limit of the Dehiwala-Mt. Lavinia Urban Council area, north-eastwards along the said southern limit till it meets the western limit of the Moratuwa Urban Council area.

East.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards and southwards along the western limit of the Moratuwa Urban Council area to a point 16 chains north-east of the centre of the railway bridge over the Lunawa Ela.

South.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the western limit of the Moratuwa Urban Council area till it meets the southern extremity of the western limit of the village of Angulana at the low-water mark of the sea.

West.—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the low-water mark of the sea to the starting point of the northern limit of the area "

THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE

THE following resolution passed by the Senate at a meeting held on November 9, 1954, and the House of Representatives at a meeting held on November 2, 1954, is published for general information:—

"This House resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary*

No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that from the first day of January, 1955, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within each of the areas defined in the schedule hereto :—

Schedule

1. All that area of land known as Mallawapitiya, Bazaar Area situated in the village of Mallawapitiya, in the Wellawa village area in Mahagalboda Megoda South, Kudagalboda and Mahagalboda Megoda North Korales in the Kurunegala District, North-Western Province; and bounded as follows :—

THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE

REGULATIONS made under sections 17 and 22 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance (Chapter 181), by the Watugedera Town Council, the proper authority in that behalf, in respect of the general cemetery at Watugedera.

Regulations

- Every application for a grave shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than three hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- No person other than a person employed or approved by the cemetery-keeper or a relation of the deceased sought to be buried shall dig a grave.
- The cemetery-keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery and where two or more funeral parties arrive at the same time, the cemetery-keeper shall decide the order in which they are to move to the respective graves.
- For the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by any other funeral party and for no other purpose, the cemetery-keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before the other is commenced.
- The cemetery-keeper shall maintain order within the cemetery and every person shall obey any direction given by him in that behalf.
- No grave shall be less than five feet in depth or less than four feet distant from any other grave.
- For building a vault a space not exceeding one foot shall be allowed for each side wall, and no allowance shall be made for the construction of the steps leading into the vault.

8. Except on the orders of an authority competent to order the disinterment of any corpse, no person shall re-open—

- any grave within three years of the burial of any dead body therein; or
- any vault within eighteen months of any interment therein.

9 No person shall bury or cremate a dead body without the permission in writing of the cemetery-keeper, or in the absence of the cemetery-keeper, of any person authorized by the Chairman, and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due in that behalf have been paid.

10. Subject to the provisions of the Regulation 11, the fees specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid to the cemetery-keeper in advance by the person making arrangements for any burial or cremation of the time he applies for the permission required under Regulation 9.

11. No fee shall be charged by the cemetery-keeper for the burial of any deceased person whose relatives and friends have been certified by the Chairman as being unable to pay the fees prescribed by these regulations.

12. (1) Where any portion of the cemetery has been set apart as a ground for cremation, no person shall cremate a dead body except on a site indicated by the cemetery-keeper.

(2) Where the remains of any dead body which has been cremated have not been removed within six days of the cremation, the cemetery-keeper shall cause such remains to be disposed of in such manner as he considers fit.

13. In these regulations “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Town Council.

By-laws

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Advertisement (Jaffna Municipality) By-laws, 1954.

2. Where the display of any advertisement has commenced before the date on which these by-laws come into force, the succeeding by-laws shall not apply to that advertisement for a period of two years from such date.

3. No person shall display or cause to be displayed any advertisement so as to be visible from any street, road, canal or lake, or culverts except under the authority of a licence issued in that behalf by the Commissioner :

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to any advertisement referred to in by-law 4, nor to any of the following advertisements unless such advertisement is an illuminated advertisement or a sky sign :—

- (a) an advertisement in the window of any building ;
- (b) a 'To Let' advertisement ;
- (c) a 'For Sale' advertisement ;
- (d) a domestic name plate ;
- (e) a name plate, not exceeding one square foot in area, and used for professional purposes ;
- (f) an advertisement, on a vehicle used for trade purposes, displaying the name and address of the owner of that vehicle ;
- (g) an advertisement relating to the trade or business carried on in the premises upon which such advertisement is displayed.

4 (1) The prior permission of the Commissioner shall be obtained for the display of any of the following advertisements :—

- (a) an advertisement relating to any entertainment the proceeds of which are to be devoted to charity ;
- (b) an advertisement relating to any entertainment to be held in the premises in which such advertisement is displayed ;
- (c) an advertisement relating to any religious, political or other public meeting

(2) Every advertisement displayed under paragraph (1) of this by-law shall be removed or caused to be removed by the person who displayed it, within a period of thirty days from the date of commencement of the display of such advertisement

5. The Commissioner may refuse to issue a licence, or may refuse to grant permission, for the erection of any hoarding which—

- (a) is likely to mar the amenities of any street, or
- (b) is not in conformity with the other hoardings in the street, or
- (c) is placed at a road junction and is likely to interfere with the smooth flow of traffic.

6 (1) Every application for a licence to display any advertisement shall be made to the Commissioner, in the form provided by the Council, at least seven days before the date on which the display of the advertisement is intended to commence

Provided, however, that the Commissioner may in special circumstances entertain any such application which is not made within the time limit specified in the preceding provisions of this paragraph

(2) Every application referred to in paragraph (1) shall be accompanied by a copy of the advertisement which the applicant intends to display.

(3) Where the Commissioner approves an application referred to in paragraph (1), he shall direct the applicant to pay, for the licence to display the advertisement, a fee at the rates specified in the Schedule hereto in respect of that advertisement, and such licence shall not be issued to the applicant until such fee is paid.

7. (1) Where a licence to display an advertisement is issued to any person, the Commissioner shall direct that person—

- (a) to insert the number and date of the licence in every copy of that advertisement, or
- (b) to cause every copy of that advertisement to be produced to the Commissioner for the purpose of being stamped in token of the payment of the fee for that licence.

(2) Every person to whom a direction under paragraph (1) of this by-law is given by the Commissioner shall carry out that direction.

8. No person shall cause—

(1) an advertisement to be displayed in such a manner as to project over any street or road for a distance of more than six inches, measured horizontally, from the building line unless such advertisement is a projecting sign constructed and erected in a manner approved by the Municipal Engineer ;

(2) an advertisement to be displayed on any hoarding which exceeds twenty-five feet in height from the ground or which projects over any street or road ;

(3) to be affixed to or suspended from the facade of a building abutting on any street or road, any shop sign which in length extends beyond the limits of such facade, or which in height at any point exceeds one-fourth of the distance of the bottom of such sign from the pavement or the mean level of the ground ; or

(4) any sky sign to be constructed and erected in a manner which is not approved by the Municipal Engineer.

9 No person shall cause any advertisement to be displayed on any public park or latrine, or on any bridge, street lamp post, telegraph or telephone post, or on any building set apart for public worship.

10 (1) Where any advertisement is, in the opinion of the Commissioner, in an unsightly or objectionable condition, he may, by written notice, order the person causing the display of such advertisement to stop such display within the time specified in such notice.

(2) A person to whom a notice under paragraph (1) is sent by the Commissioner shall comply with such notice within the time specified therein.

11 The owner or lessee of any hoarding used for the display of advertisements shall—

- (a) Maintain such hoarding in a proper state of repair and security, and
- (b) exhibit his name and address in clear and legible characters in a conspicuous position on such hoarding.

12 No person shall deface or cause to be defaced any sign, mark, letter, word or figure which has been placed on any advertisement by the Commissioner in token of the payment of the fee for the licence to display that advertisement.

13 No person shall cause—

- (a) any advertisement to be displayed on a vehicle in a manner or form other than that approved by the Commissioner, or

- (b) any vehicle bearing any illuminated advertisement, other than an illuminated advertisement approved by the Superintendent of Police, to be driven on any street or road

14. Any person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and, in the case of a continuing contravention, to a further fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Commissioner directing attention to such contravention.

15. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “advertisement” includes any word, letter, number, sign, placard, board, notice, device, model or representation in the nature of or used wholly or partly for the purposes of advertisement, over or resting upon any land, building or structure ;
- “Commissioner” means the Commissioner of the Council ;
- “Council” means the Municipal Council of Jaffna ;
- “hoarding” means any structure, support, post, board, wall, case or any other contrivance erected or used for the purpose of displaying any advertisement ; and
- “sky-sign” means any word, letter, model, sign, device or representation used for the purposes of advertisement and supported or attached to any post, pole, standard, framework, or other support on or over any land, building or other structure and wholly or partly visible against the sky from some point in any street, road, canal or lake, and includes any balloon, parachute, trailer or other similar device used wholly or partly for the purposes of advertisement on or over any land, building, structure, street or road.

Sale of provisions

1. No person shall keep any shop or place (other than a market) for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables, provisions, or other perishable articles of food, except on a licence duly obtained in that behalf from the Chairman. Every such licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year in respect of which such licence is issued.

2. Every application to the Chairman for a licence to carry on the sale of any of the articles of food specified in by-law 1 shall be made substantially in Form A set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. The licence duty which may be imposed under section 46 of the Ordinance in respect of any licence issued under paragraph (1) of these by-laws shall be paid at the office of the Committee on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year.

4. The owner or seller of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables, provisions or other perishable articles of food in any shop or place (other than a market) shall keep the meat, poultry, and fish apart from the vegetables, and the poultry in baskets so made that the birds may not suffer unnecessary discomfort.

5. (1) No meat shall be transported from any slaughter-house to any shop or place where meat is sold except in a box or vehicle which satisfies the conditions set out in the next following paragraph :—

(2) (a) Every box used for the transport of meat must have the inside lined with zinc or other impermeable material and be fitted with a lid.

(b) Every vehicle used for the transport of meat must be provided with—

(i) a roof to protect the meat from the sun or rain or from contamination by flies or dust ;

(ii) a covering at each open end to screen the meat from public view, and

(iii) a compartment, the inside of which is lined with zinc or other impermeable material for storing the meat.

(3) Where any meat is transported in contravention of paragraph (1), the person liable for such contravention shall be the person on whose behalf or at whose directions the meat was so transported.

(4) Every holder of a licence shall keep the premises to which the licence relates in a clean and sanitary condition and close up all rat holes with cement and glass.

6 The Chairman or any person duly authorized by him in writing may inspect any shop (other than a market) used for the sale of meat, poultry,

fish, fruit, vegetables, provisions or other perishable articles of food for human consumption

7 In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee, and

“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Deniyaya village area
