GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1 *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions

2 *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time

3 *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent of salary

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Other Requirements*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

(vii) Applications should be made substantially in the form appended below and should be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, and NOT personally to him.

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above post.

2. (a) *Salary Scale.*—Rs 1,440 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,480 per annum. An efficiency bar operates before Rs. 2,640 per annum, the passing of which is dependent on satisfactory work and conduct and the passing of a test

(b) The selected candidate will be appointed on two years' probation.

3 Qualifications required —

(a) Age - Not less than 17 years nor more than 35 years of age on December 28, 1954.

(b) Applicants should have previously passed at least one of the following examinations —

(i) the Cambridge Senior, the London Matriculation or the Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or

(ii) the final examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(iii) the Cambridge Junior, the J. S. C. (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon; or the J. S. C. (English) Examination held by a School approved by the Education Department for the S. S. C. (English) Examination, TOGETHER WITH EITHER—

(a) the higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or

(b) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or

(c) the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Examination

4. Officers in the permanent employ of a Local Authority for not less than 5 years will be eligible irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above, provided they are otherwise qualified for the post.

5 Prior to selection for appointment, applicants will have to pass a test in the following subjects —

- (1) Shorthand—Taking down in Shorthand passages dictated at 100 words a minute for 5 minutes and transcribing the record in long hand at 8 words a minute.
- (ii) Typewriting—Making a correct copy of a passage of about 600 words on the typewriter in 20 minutes, i.e., 30 words a minute. The test will be held in Colombo. No travelling expenses will be paid.

6. Applications will be entertained only from persons who have been residents for a period of at least 3 years immediately prior to December 28, 1954, in the area comprising the revenue districts of Colombo, Kalutara, Galle, Matara, Hambantota and Chilaw.

THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE

THE following resolution passed by the Senate at a meeting held on November 9, 1954, and by the House of Representatives at a meeting held on November 2, 1954, is published for general information:—

“This House resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that from the first day of December, 1954, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto —

Schedule

All that area of land situated in the villages of Ukuwala, Dumbukola, Bowatta, Maberiya, Manaboda, and Paragahawela in Matale Medasiya

Pattuwa, of the Matale South Divisional Revenue Officer's Division, Matale District, Central Province, and bounded as follows:—

North—By a line drawn from a point 300 feet due north of the centre line of Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road at the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile post, eastwards along a straight line to a point 330 feet due north of a point on the centre line of the said Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road at the 1st mile post; thence north-eastwards along a straight line to a point 300 feet due west of the centre line of Kandy-Matale Public Works Department road at the 16th mile post; thence due eastwards along a straight line crossing the said road at the said mile post to a point 300 feet east of the centre line of the said Kandy-Matale Public Works Department road at the 16th mile post, thence southwards, south-eastwards and northwards along a line parallel to the centre line of the said Kandy-Matale Public Works Department road and the Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road to a point 300 feet due west of the centre of the junction of the Public Works Department road from Wariyapola with the said Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road; thence due eastwards along a straight line crossing the said junction to a point 300 feet east of the centre of the said junction.

East—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along a line parallel to the centre line of the Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road till it meets the boundary between Matale Medasiya Pattuwa and Matale Udasiya Pattuwa; thence westwards and southwards along the said boundary till it meets a point on the said boundary 300 feet due east of the centre line of Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road; thence south-westwards along a line parallel to the centre line of the said road till it meets the centre line of Paragahawela-Devata Village Committee road; thence south-westwards along a straight line to the centre line of Kandy-Matale Public Works Department road at the 15th mile post.

South—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point due south-westwards along a straight line crossing Kandy-Matale railway line to a point 300 feet south-west of a point on the centre line of the said railway line where the said straight line crosses it; thence north-westwards along a straight line to a point on the centre line of the Marukona Estate road 380 feet south (measured along the centre line of the said road) of the centre of the junction of the said Marukona Estate road with the Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road; thence westwards along a straight line crossing Nugapitiya-Gurulawela Village Committee road and Bowatta Village Committee road to a point 300 feet due south of the centre line of Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public Works Department road at the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile post.

West—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point due northwards along a straight line crossing the Kalalpitiya-Elkaduwa Public

Works Department road at the $\frac{1}{2}$ mile post to the starting point of the northern limit of the area."

1 The Chairman may authorise in writing any officer or other person to collect all taxes or fees due to the Committee and to issue printed receipts bearing the facsimile of the Chairman's signature and the seal of the Committee.

2 No person shall wilfully obstruct—

- (a) the Chairman or any other officer of the Committee in the exercise, performance or discharge of any power, duty or function conferred on, imposed upon, or assigned to, such Chairman or officer by, or under, any of the provisions of the Village Communities Ordinance, or any by-laws made thereunder, or
