GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

- 1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.
- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.
- (a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.
- (b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

- By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.
- (c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.
- (d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

- (e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
- (f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.
- 4. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- 5. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 6. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.
- (ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.
- (iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for mterview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.
- (iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.
- (v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance

REGULATIONS under sections 17 and 22 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance (Chapter 181), made by the Dodanduwa Town Council, the proper authority in that behalf, in respect of the general cemetery at Dodanduwa.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Every application for a grave shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial: Provided that the Chairman may, in discretion, direct the cemetery-keeper to entertain an application made at any later time.
- 2 No grave shall be dug at any place other than a place approved by the cemetery-keeper.
- 3. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth or less than four feet distant from any other grave.
- 4 Except on the orders of any authority competent to order the disinterment of any dead body, no person shall re-open any grave within one year of the burial of any dead body therein,

- 5. Where an applicant for a grave requests the cemetery-keeper to cause such grave to be dug, the applicant shall pay for that grave a fee of two rupees and fifty cents.
- 6. Every application for a cremation shall be made to the cemetery-keeper not less than twenty-four hours before the time fixed for the cremation to enable the cemetery-keeper to point out the site for constructing the pyre. Provided that the Chairman may, in his discretion, direct the cemetery-keeper to entertain an application made at any later time
- 7. No cremation shall take place except in a site indicated by the cemetery-keeper and the ashes of any dead body cremated, unless removed by the parties interested within seven days of the cremation, shall be disposed of by the cemetery-keeper in such manner as he may deem proper.
- 8. No person shall cremate any dead body in the cemetery unless he pays the cemetery-keeper a fee of Rs $\,15$
- 9 No person shall bury or cremate a dead body without the permission of the cemetery-keeper and such permission shall not be granted until the certificate of registration is produced
- 10. The cemetery-keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and where two or more parties arrive at the same time the cemetery-keeper shall intimate the order in which they are to move to the respective graves.
- 11. For the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another funeral party and for no other purpose, the cemetery-keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before the other is commenced.
- 12. The cemetery-keeper shall maintain order within the cemetery and every person shall obey any directions given by him in that behalf
- 13 In these regulations, the expression "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Dodanduwa Town Council.
- 14. The regulations relating to the general cemetery at Dodanduwa and published in *Gazette* No. 6,858 of March 9, 1917, are hereby rescinded

- 2. (1) Every application for the registration of a burial ground shall be in writing, addressed to the Chairman, and signed by the owner.
- (2) The owner shall submit with the application, a plan of the burial ground certified by, or on behalf of, the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor.
- (3) Where the owner intends to appoint a person to be the keeper of the burial ground, the name of the keeper shall be stated in the application.
- (4) The person named as keeper in the application shall sign the application in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of keeper
- 3 Where the keeper's name is not stated in the application, or where the keeper so named has not signed the application in the manner specified in by-law 2 (4), the owner shall, on the burial ground being registered, be deemed to be the keeper of that burial ground
- 4 In the event of the death or resignation of the keeper of a burial ground, the name of some other keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground, until such fresh registration has been effected, except with the permission of the Chairman.
- 5 (1) The keeper of a burial ground shall enter in a register particulars of every burial or cremation carried out in that burial ground and shall, within a month of such burial or cremation, send the Chairman an extract of each such entry.
- (2) The register shall be in a form approved by the Chairman.

- 6 The keeper of a burial ground shall permit the Chairman or any officer or person authorised in writing in that behalf by the Chairman, at any time to—
 - (a) inspect the burial ground, or
 - (b) examine the register referred to in bylaw 5 (2).
- 7 The owner of a registered burial ground shall enclose such burial ground with a wall or a fence to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and shall maintain such wall or fence in good repair.
- 8. The owner of a burial ground shall keep it clear of jungle and in a clean and sanitary condition, to the satisfaction of the Chairman.
- 9. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth, or at a distance of less than 4 feet from any other grave.
- 10. Except upon the orders of a competent authority, no person shall re-open any grave within one year of the burial in that grave of a dead body.
- 11. (1) No person shall bury or cremate a dead body in any burial ground, except with the permission of the keeper of that burial ground
- (2) No person shall cremate a dead body in a burial ground, at any spot other than the spot indicated by the keeper of that burial ground.
- 12 The person responsible for a cremation at a burial ground shall, within seven days of such cremation, bury or cause to be burried the ashes and other refuse left after the cremation.
- 13. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer authorised in writing in that behalf by the Chairman to inspect any burial ground.
- 14. Any person aggreeved by an order given by the keeper of a burial ground, or by any act or ommission on his part, may complain to the Chairman and the Chairman shall make such order as may be necessary in the circumstances of each case.
 - 15. In these by-laws—
 - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council,
 - "Council" means the Dodanduwa Town Council, and
 - "owner" means the trustee, manager, proprietor or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground.
