GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service, in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her-Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

(vii) Applications should be made substantially in the form appended below and should be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, and NOT personally to him.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE**Scholarships and Fellowships for Training Facilities, &c., under the International Aid Programmes, 1955-56**

APPLICATIONS are invited from qualified officers in the Local Government Service for nomination for the following Awards for which application is proposed to be made by the Local Government Service Commission:—

- (1) Travelling Fellowship for a Medical Officer of Health for a period of six months to study Public Health Administration in America, Canada, or the United Kingdom.

Qualifications.—Medical Officers in the Municipalities possessing the Diploma in Public Health and practical experience in Public Health work in Local Bodies are eligible to apply.

- (2) One Scholarship for a Medical Officer, Child Welfare, to specialize in Paediatrics in the United Kingdom.

Qualifications.—Medical Officers in Municipalities with experience in Child Welfare work in Local Bodies are eligible to apply.

- (3) (A) Three Scholarships for a Course of Training for Sanitary Inspectors to qualify as Food and Drug Inspectors in the United Kingdom.

(B) One Scholarship for a Sanitary Inspector to gain practical experience in Anti-Plague Measures and Rodent Control.

(C) One Scholarship for a Sanitary Inspector to gain practical experience in the Control of Insect-borne Diseases.

Qualifications.—Applicants should be qualified Sanitary Inspectors possessing—

- (a) not less than 10 years' experience as a Sanitary Inspector on April 1, 1955, and
(b) should not be less than 35 years nor more than 45 years of age on April 1, 1955.

Possession of the Royal Sanitary Institute (London) Certificate will enhance claims of candidates for selection.

2. Awards of Fellowships and Scholarships are subject to acceptance of the nomination by the Council for Technical Co-operation in South and South-East Asia or the International Agencies

3. Applications close on April 20, 1955.

4. Terms of Award—

The following expenses will ordinarily be met by the country providing training facilities under the Colombo Plan:—

- (a) Cost of passages of trainees to and from Ceylon.
(b) Costs of training which includes fees, books, &c.
(c) Payment of travel costs incidental to the training in the host country.
(d) Payment of an outfit allowance when necessary.
(e) Meet costs of medical aid if any received by trainees in the host country.

5. Agreement and Security—

The selected candidates may be required to enter into an Agreement with the Local Authority together with a bond with two approved sureties on terms and conditions as may be determined by the Commission.

6. Medical Examination—

The selected candidate will be required to pass a medical examination by a Medical Board as to his physical fitness to undergo a course of training in the United Kingdom or other country awarding the Scholarship. Fees for the examination will have to be paid by the candidate.

7. Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification or withdrawal of the award.

8. It should be clearly understood that the Local Government Service Commission does not offer any guarantee of higher employment in the Local Government Service to a trainee on his return after completion of the course of training.

9. THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61
OF 1939

Order under section 30

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Christopher William Wijekoon Kannangara, Minister of Local Government, do hereby—

(1) revoke—

(a) the Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 8,833 of December 19, 1941, in so far as that Proclamation relates to the limits of the town of Horana, and

(b) the Order published in *Gazette* No. 8,968 of July 17, 1942, relating to the limits of the wards of the town of Horana;

(2) order that—

(a) the limits of the town of Horana shall be those defined in the First Schedule hereto; and

(b) the limits of the wards of the town of Horana shall be those defined in the Second Schedule hereto, and

(3) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Order shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Horana Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

FIRST SCHEDULE

LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF HORANA

All that area of land situated in the villages of Horana, Kulupana, Munagama and Wewala, in Kumbuke Pattuwa of Rayigam Korale, Kalutara District, Western Province, and bounded as follows:—

North.—By a line drawn from a point on the centre of the bridge on Panadura-Ratnapura Road over Kulupana Maha Ela north-eastwards along the centre line of the said Ela and the landmarked northern boundaries of lots 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 and the western boundary of lot 7 in Horana, Town Survey Sheet No. 1 till it meets the landmark on the left bank of the Ela that forms the western boundary of lot 7

in the said Sheet No. 1; thence north-eastwards and eastwards along the centre line of the said Ela to the landmark on the northern-most corner of lot 17 in the said sheet No. 1; thence eastwards, north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the landmarked northern boundaries of lots 17 and 26, western and northern boundaries of lot 34, northern boundary of lot 35, western boundary of lot 37, western and northern boundaries of lot 36 and northern boundary of lot 37 in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 1; northern boundary of lot 1, northern and eastern boundaries of lot 2, eastern boundary of lot 3, northern and eastern boundaries of lot 10 and northern boundary of lot 11 to the landmark on the north-eastern corner of the said lot 11 in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 2; thence southwards along the centre line of the Ela that forms the eastern boundary of the said lot 11 to the landmark on the north-western corner of lot 17 in the said Sheet No. 2; thence eastwards along the northern boundary of lot 17 in the said sheet No. 2 to the centre line of the Ela that forms the western boundary of lot 18 in the said sheet No. 2; thence north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the said Ela, crossing the Padukka-Horana Road, to the centre of the confluence of the said Ela with the Ela that forms the northern boundary of lot 103 in the said sheet No. 2; thence eastwards and north-eastwards along the centre line of the said Ela that forms the northern boundary of lot 103, crossing the Estate Road, to the landmark on the northern-most corner of lot 1 (Ellakanda Estate) in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 3; thence south-eastwards along the landmarked northern boundary of the said lot 1, crossing the Estate Road, and along the northern and eastern boundaries of lot 2, and northern boundary of lot 3 in the said sheet No. 3 to the landmark on the western boundary of the cart road leading to village; thence south-eastwards along a straight line across the said cart road to its eastern boundary; thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said cart road to the landmark on the northern-most corner of lot 4 in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 3; thence south-eastwards, southwards, and again south-eastwards along the landmarked eastern boundaries of lots 4, 5, 6 and 10 the northern and eastern boundaries of lot 11 and the northern boundary of lot 12 in the said sheet No. 3 to the centre line of the Ela that forms the northern boundary of lot 13 in the said sheet No. 3; thence north-eastwards along the centre line of the said Ela and the northern boundary of lot 4 in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 4 to the western boundary of the cart road leading to village; thence south-eastwards across the said cart road and along the northern and eastern boundaries of lot 5 to the north-western corner of lot 6 in the said sheet No. 4; thence north-eastwards, south-eastwards and south-westwards along the northern, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 6 to the eastern boundary of lot 7 in the said sheet No. 4; thence south-eastwards and eastwards along the eastern boundary of lot 7 and the northern boundaries of lots 8 and 9 to the centre line of the Ela that forms the western boundary of lot 11 in Horana

Town Survey Sheet No. 4; thence north-eastwards and eastwards along the centre line of the said Ela to the centre of the confluence of the said Ela with the Ela that forms the western boundary of lot 15 in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 4; thence north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Ela that forms the northern boundary of the said lot 15 to the north-western corner of lot 23 in the said sheet; thence south-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said lot 23 to the western boundary of the cart road leading to village; thence eastwards across the said cart road and along the northern landmarked boundaries of lots 24, 25, 26 and 27 to the centre line of Shindi Ela, that forms the eastern boundary of the said lot 27 in Horana Town Survey Sheet No. 4.

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to any of the following advertisements unless such advertisement is an illuminated advertisement or a sky-sign:—

- an advertisement relating to any entertainment, the nett proceeds of which are to be used for the purposes of charity;
- an advertisement relating to any entertainment to be held in the premises upon which such advertisement is displayed;
- an advertisement relating to any religious, political or other public meeting;
- an advertisement in the window of any building;
- a "To Let" advertisement;
- a "For Sale" advertisement;
- a domestic name plate;
- a name plate, not exceeding one square foot in area used for professional purposes;
- an advertisement on a vehicle used for trade purposes, displaying the name and address of the owner of that vehicle; or
- an advertisement relating to the trade or business carried on in the premises upon which such advertisement is displayed.

3. (1) Every application for a permit to display any advertisement shall be made to the Chairman, at least, seven days before the date on which the display of the advertisement is intended to commence:

Provided, however, that the Chairman may, in special circumstances, entertain any such application which is not made within the time limit specified in the preceding provisions of this paragraph.

(2) Every application referred to in paragraph (1) shall be accompanied by a copy of the advertisement which the applicant intends to display.

(3) Where the Chairman approves an application referred to in paragraph (1), he shall direct the applicant to pay, for the permit to display the advertisement, a fee calculated at the rate of one rupee for each square foot, in respect of each year. Such permit shall not be issued to the applicant until such fee is paid.

(4) (1) Where a permit to display an advertisement is issued to any person, the Chairman shall direct that person—

- to insert the number and date of that permit in every copy of that advertisement, or
 - to cause every copy of that advertisement to be produced to the Chairman, for the purpose of being stamped in token of the payment of the fee for that permit.
- (2) Every person to whom a direction under paragraph (1) of this by-law is given by the Chairman, shall carry out that direction.

5. No person shall cause—

- (1) an advertisement to be displayed in such a manner as to project over any street or road for a distance of more than six inches, measured horizontally from the building line unless such advertisement is a projecting sign constructed and erected in a manner approved by the Chairman;
- (2) an advertisement to be displayed on any hoarding which exceeds twenty-five feet in height from the ground or which projects over any street or road;
- (3) to be affixed to, or suspended from, the facade of a building abutting on any street or road, any shop-sign which in length extends beyond the limits of such facade, or which in height at any point exceeds one-fourth of the distance of the bottom of such sign from the pavement or the mean level of the ground, or
- (4) any sky-sign to be constructed and erected in a manner which is not approved by the Chairman.

6. No person shall cause any advertisement to be displayed on any public park or latrine, or on any bridge, street lamp post, or telegraph or telephone post.

7. No person shall on any street or road use any wireless set, gramophone, musical instrument, bell or other instrument for the purpose of displaying any advertisement.

8. (1) Where any advertisement is, in the opinion of the Chairman, in an unsightly or objectionable condition, he may, by written notice, order the person causing the display of such advertisement, to stop such display within the time specified in such notice.

(2) A person to whom a notice under paragraph (1) is sent by the Chairman shall comply with such notice within the time specified therein.

9. The owner or lessee of any hoarding used for the display of advertisements shall—

- (a) maintain such hoarding in a proper state of repair and security, and
- (b) exhibit his name and address in clear and legible characters in a conspicuous position on the front of such hoarding.

10. No person shall deface or cause to be defaced any sign, mark, letter, word or figure which has been put on any advertisement by the Chairman in token of the payment of the fee for the permit to display that advertisement.

11. No person shall cause—

- (a) maintain such hoarding in a proper state vehicle in a manner or form other than that approved by the Chairman, or
- (b) any vehicle bearing any illuminated advertisement, other than an illuminated advertisement, approved by the Superintendent of Police, to be driven on any street or road.

12. Any person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing contravention, to a further fine not exceeding fifteen rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman directing attention to such contravention.

13. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

“advertisement” includes any word, letter, number, sign, placard, board, notice, devise, model or representation in the nature of or used wholly or partly for the purposes of advertisement, over or resting upon any land, building or structure;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council;

“Council” means the Welimada Town Council;

“hoarding” means any structure, support, post, board, wall, case or any other contrivance erected or used for the purpose of displaying any advertisement; and

“sky-sign” means any word, letter, model, sign, device or representation used for the purpose of advertisement and supported or attached to any post, pole, standard, framework or support on or over any land, building or other structure and wholly or partly visible against the sky from some point in any street, road, canal or lake and includes any balloon, parachute, trailer or other similar device used wholly or partly for the purposes of advertisement on or over any land, building, structure, street or road.
