MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO,

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, January 17, 1896, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 11, 1896.

Present:—Mr. F. H. Price, Acting Chairman and Mayor of Colombo; Capt. F. Bayley; Hon. R. K. MacBride, C.M.G.; Mr. E. Creasy; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne: Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alvis.

The Minutes of December 13, 1895, having been printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of December 13, 1895, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. Alvis moved "that a Committee of the Council be appointed to draw up a report on the sanitation, drainage, and water supply of the city; and that when approved by the Council, the same be forwarded for the consideration of His Excellency Sir J. West. Ridgeway, with a view to aid being obtained for the formation of a Special Sanitary Fund for the benefit of the City of Colombo."

This motion was by leave of Council amended by the conjugion of the words "and water supply" and the

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the omission of the words "and water supply" and the insertion of the word "and" before "drainage."

The motion so amended was seconded by Mr. C. Perera and carried.

Resolved,—That the Special Committee do consist of the Chairman, Hon. Sir John J. Grinlinton, Capt. F. Bayley, Hon. R. K. MacBride, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. M. Fernando, and Mr. A. Alvis—three Members to form a quorum.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that the Special Committee appointed on September 13, 1895, be re-appointed to consider and submit a report on the papers referred to it on October 11, 1895. Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

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Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that the Special Committee appointed on April 5, 1895, be re-appointed to consider and submit a report on the Auditor-General's report referred to it on May 10, 1895."

Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that a Committee be appointed to prepare an address of welcome to our coming Governor, Sir J. West Ridgeway, to be presented on his arrival at Colombo." Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Resolved,—that the Committee do consist of the Chairman, Capt. Bayley, Hon. R. K. MacBride, Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. M. Fernando, and Mr. A. Alvis—three Members to form a quorum.

- 5. The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of five members to form a Standing Committee for 1896, in accordance with the 88th section of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, and the result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. P. Dias, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, and Mr. C. M. Fernando, who, with the Chairman, were thereupon appointed a Standing Committee for 1896.
- 6. A report dated December 13, 1895, of the Special Committee, on the sanitary condition of overcrowded localities, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. Alvis moved the adoption of the report.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved as an amendment the deletion of the second paragraph of the report.

Hon. R. K. MacBride seconded.

Whereupon the amendment was lost, and the original motion was carried.

7. A report dated December 13, 1895, of the Special Committee, on incineration, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

A letter No. 24, dated January 15, 1896, from the Superintendent of Works, was read, reporting inability to

submit plans for an incinerator to work at Dean's passage latrine.

Mr. C. Perera moved the re-appointment of the Special Committee on incineration appointed on April 5, 1895, consisting of the Chairman, Dr Kynsey (or any Medical Officer nominated by Government in his place), Capt. F. Bayley, Hon. A. do A. Seneviratne, Mr. C. Perera, and Mr. C. P. Dias—three Members forming a quorum, and that Hon. R. K. MacBride be added to the Committee.

Mr. Alvis seconded.—Carried.

8. A report dated December 17, 1895, of the Special Committee, on the disposal of night soil from private latrines, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. Dias moved the adoption of the report.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

The Special Committee on this question was accordingly re-appointed.

A letter No. 172 of December 30, 1895, from the Colonial Secretary, on the subject of the proposal to form a street along the approach road to the Victoria bridge, was read.

10. A letter dated Decembr 19, 1895, from Messrs. Boustead Brothers, accepting the conditions imposed by the Council with reference to tramways, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated. The Chairman moved (in view of a further communication dated January 16, 1896, received from Messrs. Boustead Brothers) the re-appointment of the Special Committee on tramways appointed on November 8, 1895, and consisting of the Chairman, Capt. F. Bayley, Hon. R. K. MacBride, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. M. Fernando, and Mr. A. Alvis—three Members forming a quorum.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.—Carried.

- 11. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for June, 1895, received with letter No. 88 of December 14, 1895, were laid on the table.
- 12. The City Analyst's report dated December 19, 1895, on the town water for December, 1895, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
- 13. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for January, 1896, were laid on the table.
- A letter dated January 9, 1896, from Major E. F. Tranchell, inquiring, with reference to a memorial proposed to be erected by public subscription in Colombo to Sir Arthur Havelock, whether the promoters of the memorial might expect any assistance from the Municipal Council, was laid before the Council.

 • Mr. C. Perera moved "that the Council will consider the proposal when an adequate sum of money has been raised by public subscription."

Captain Bayley seconded.

Mr. Creasy moved as an amendment "that the Council is prepared to vote Rs. 1,000 towards the memorial if an additional sum of Rs. 4,000 is collected from the public."

The Chairman seconded.

The Council divided on the amendment, which was lost, the mover and seconder alone voting for it.

The original motion was then put and carried.
