#### Order

- 1 The provisions of the Industrial Products Act, No 18 of 1949, shall with effect from January 31, 1956, apply to the industrial product specified in Column I of the Schedule hereto.
- 2 Every importer of the industrial product specified in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall, in order to obtain a licence to import that industrial product, with effect from the date specified in paragraph 1 of this Order, purchase the local product specified in the corresponding entry in Column 11 of that Schedule.

#### Notification

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 9 (1) of the Industrial Products Act, No 18 of 1949, I, Kanthiah Vaithianathan, Minister of Industries, Housing and Social Services, after consultation with the Industrial Products Regulation Board, do by this Notification, prescribe—
