#### GALLE MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on May 22, 1896, at 3 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; Dr. J. Attygalle; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; D. G. Gunawardena, Esq.; and C. L. Abdul Carim, Esq.

- 1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.
- 2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked :-
- . (i.) What use is being made of the Salvation Barracks purchased at the recommendation of the Chairman at a valuation of Rs. 400 made by the Superintendent of Works with the object of housing coolies; whether any coolies have been lodged in it for any time; and whether it is not now in a dilapidated state, and used as a latrine by the people of the neighbourhood.
  - (ii.) Whether the sum of Rs. 400 paid for the Salvation Barracks was provided for in the Budget for 1895.
- (iii.) How often within the last two years expenditure had been incurred either on the authority of the Chairman, or with the sanction of the Standing Committee, for which no provision had been made in the Budget, or in excess of Budget votes, and whether the sum so expended were not more than the pay (Rs. 8 a month each for eight months) of two coolies required to keep the Victoria park in order.

The Chairman replied that no provision had been made in the Budget for the purchase of the Salvation Barracks, but that the purchase had been made with the sanction of the Standing Committee and was afterwards provided for in the Supplemental Budget for 1895. The Municipal scavenging coolies have refused to live in this or the lines erected at Dr. Anthonisz's instance, but as it was intended to substitute Tamils, the buildings would then be utilized.

The Chairman laid on the table a statement of expenditure in 1894 and 1895 in excess of votes in the Budgets of those years.

3. In terms of resolution of Council passed at a Meeting of March 14 last, the Council resumed consideration of the terms to be offered for a new Superintendent of Works.

Read letter from Government, No. 19 of May 9, 1896.

Mr. C. P. Hayley moved, "That as the funds of the Municipaltity will allow, and as the services of a satisfactory person are not likely to be secured for less than Rs. 1,800 per annum, that sum be fixed as salary, with a horse allowance of Rs. 480, and that the same officer be also required to perform the duties of Head Inspector without any further remuneration."

Seconded by Mr. D. J. Goonewardena.—Carried.

Resolved,—That applications for the post be invited by advertisement in the Colombo daily newspapers.

- 4. #### Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended March 31, 1896.

The General Health was bad. The epidemic of malarial fever, which has been raging in the vicinity of the Matara railway line for over a year, with disastrous effects upon the population, has practically died out. No fresh cases occurred to my knowledge during this quarter, but the old victims get relapses upon the action of some exciting cause, such as fatigue, exposure to the sun or to cold, and every influence, physical or mental, that depresses the system. Several families who took up residence in the malarious localities a few months ago have been perfectly free from malaria, and this fact proves that there is no fresh generation of the poison.

Malarial Dysentery prevailed to some extent in the malarious localities. An epidemic of chickenpox prevailed in all the wards during this quarter. No cases of smallpox occurred within the Municipality, but two patients were removed to hospital from on board a ship and two from Batadua, outside the Municipal limits.

Ward No. 1.—In the Fort, house drainage is very defective, and very much neglected. This accounts for the

dampness of houses and its attendant evils.

The cesspits form the greatest source of danger to the inhabitants. I have dwelt at length on the condition of the cesspits and their dangers to the public health in my report for the quarter ended March 31, 1894. undoubtedly an abomination, and pollute the soil, air, and water—the three great sources of disease production. The dangers from this source must necessarily increase with the lapse of years, and just now the Fort soil is saturated with sewage.

Water pipes have been laid through this sewage-sodden soil, and should any leakage take place the water will undoubtedly be injected and result in a serious epidemic of typhoid fever, dysentery, cholera, &c. To guard against such dangers to the public health from these insanitary cesspits, it is necessary to introduce a more satisfactory system of refuse removal. The water-carriage system is not practicable, and I have for several years been advocating the dry-earth system, which is more simple and less expensive. Those who understand the dangers of cesspits are quite willing to have the dry-earth system. The sanitary condition of the Fort could be greatly improved, and the dangers to the public health could be avoided by emptying and filling up the cesspits with sea sand after disinfection. In houses with back or side entrances the tubs may be removed daily, while in houses without such entrances if daily removed is inconvenient, tubs of sufficient capacity to hold the contents for a week may be provided and the removal done once a week. Sufficient dry-earth or kitchen ashes will keep the contents dry and free from smelling.

Most of the houses in the Fort are built back to back without any consideration for free ventilation. There should be a lane at least between two rows of houses to allow free ventilation and facilitate scavenging and drainage.

It is therefore expendient that roads or lanes should be opened up between rows of houses.

In Wards Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 5 the drainage in very defective. The drainage of Kaluwella, China Garden, and the fever-stricken area deserves special attention. There may be a recurrence of the malaria if the drainage of the affected locality be neglected. The big swamp between the Colombo railway line and the Wakwella road should be drained and filled with virgin soil instead of scavenging refuse, which will only supply material for the future development of malaria and increase the evil it is intended to remedy.

The market drains ought to be maintained in better condition to ensure sufficient flushing.

Scavenging and Street Sweeping.—The present system of scavenging is very unsatisfactory. The contractor supplies bulls and men for the carts, and the overseer and his coolies do the scavenging; except in the Fort, there is very little house refuse removed. It is chiefly the sweepings of roads and markets that are removed by the overseer. Even this has been very unsatisfactorily done. There have been many complaints against the contractor for being irregular about sending bulls and men for the carts. To avoid divided responsibility it is best to resort to the contract system, specifying the area to be scavenged and hours of visit to different localities. The number of carts should be increased, and particular attention should be paid to the removal of house refuse outside the Fort, which is at present not scavenged, and consequently the residents throw such refuse on the sea-beach, waste lands, or their own back yards, thus causing a nuisance. Dust boxes should be placed at convenient distances in crowded localities to facilitate scavenging.

Latrines.—The Municipal latrines are kept much cleaner than they used to be. Dry-earth is not used as ordered, and a sufficient quantity of disinfectants not used. The latrine coolies very often leave the premises and

allow the surroundings to be dirtied.

The removal of night soil to Bataduwa has been a farce. Night soil is not removed for days together, sometimes for a fortnight or longer, as I ascertained from the man in charge of the sheds. When removed even it will be only three or six buckets, amounting to the contents of one latrine only, and the soil of the remaining eleven latrines is, I understand, thrown into the sea at different places. This is a very objectionable procedure, and should be put a stop to.

There are two built sheds at Bataduwa, and if the contents of all the latrines are removed there daily, the sheds will be full within a fortnight, and the contents will have to be buried to make room for the daily collections. This process of collecting and burying of decomposing human excrement, probably infected, will involve so much pollution of the air and soil that the bathing and drinking wells in the neighbourhood, at no great distance and used by inhabitants of almost the whole of the Ward No. 3, will be seriously polluted as to cause an epidemic.

Bataduwa is not a suitable place for the storage and burying of night soil. I would suggest to have the night soil removed in large tubs with lids and thrown into the sea outside the harbour. Should the dry-earth system be enforced in the Fort, this will be found a very satisfactory mode of disposal of the excretal refuse, as an incinerator

would be very expensive.
