(b) they should have had at least five years' practical experience in an electrical engineering firm or under a chartered electrical engineer or under Government or local supply authority, viz, Linesmen, Switch Board Operators and others of sımılar status,

(c) in the case of those who have completed the evening vocational courses in Electricity at the Ceylon Technical College, two years' practical experience in an electrical engineering firm or under a chartered electrical engineer or under Government or local supply

authority, and

(d) should have a knowledge of the operation and maintenance of high tension and low tension distribution systems, transformers, diesel engine plant and switch gear, testing of consumers installations and house service meters. Should also possess a working knowledge of safety rules and I EE Regulations for electrical equipment and buildings.

- 1 (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has in his possession, custody or control any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars substantially in the form specified in Schedule A hereto, which may be obtained from the office of the Committee
- (2) The schedule shall be filled up and send to the Chairman on or before the thirty-first day of January 1957, in respect of the year 1957, by the person liable to pay the tax under section 47 of the Ordinance, and no such schedule shall be required from such person in respect of any subsequent year during which such person is in possession, custody or control of such vehicle or animal
- 2 Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has turnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice, be liable-
 - (a) for the year 1957 in respect of the vehicles and animals specified in that schedule, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of March of that year, and
 - (b) for every subsequent year, in respect of such vehicles and animals specified in that schedule as remain in his possession, custody or control for more than thirty days in such subsequent year, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of March of that year
- 3 If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, which is not mentioned in such schedule and which is liable to the tax under the Ordinance, or if any person who has not furnished any schedule under by-law 1 for the first time acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal which is liable to such tax, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires, commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, send a written notice to the Chairman stating the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use and further furnish a written statement of particulars, substantially in the form set out in Schedule A hereto
- 4 Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the written statement referred to in by-law 3, shall be liable to pay the tax, in respect of the year in which such statement is furnished and in respect of every subsequent year, for the vehicles and animals specified in that statement, which are in his possession, custody or control, within such time as may be notified to him in that behalf by the Chairman
- 5 (1) Every person who, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance, from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered, or referred to in such schedule or statement, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which such claim is made
- (2) Every person who, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, ceases to possess, keep or use any vehicle or animal, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman that he has ceased to possess, keep or use such vehicle or animal

6 On payment of the tax by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with such of the distinguishing letters for the vehicle specified in Schedule B hereto, as are appropriate to that vehicle, and with the figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding numbers in the register of vehicles

Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of fifty cents, to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by such owner of 50 cents

- 7 The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of that vehicle
- 8 It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or any officer authorized by the Chairman in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path, for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 7 to be affixed on such vehicle, and the driver or person in charge of such vehicle shall, on being so requested by the Chairman or such officer, stop the vehicle and permit him to inspect such plate
 - 9 In these by-laws---
 - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee,
 - "Committee" means the Village Committee of the Yatıgaha village area in the Colombo District, and
 - "Ordinance" means the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198)
- 10 The by-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals made by the Village Committee of the Yatigaha village area in the Colombo District and published in Gazette No 8,796 of September 26, 1941, are hereby rescinded

THE accounts of the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund for the year ended December 31, 1954, have been audited under my direction and the Balance Sheet as at December 31, 1954, has been certified subject to the following observations —

Reserve for Administration Expenses Rs 36,166 17

The amount reserved for Administration Expenses up to December 31, 1954, was Rs 36,166 17, while the actual administration expenses incurred as at December 31, 1954 (exclusive of the initial expenses of establishing the Fund, which consisted mostly the cost of obtaining actuarial advice) was Rs 93,224 36 As the reserve of 5 per cent of the contribution Income is clearly insufficient to cover the actual administration expenses the adequacy of the reserve should be reviewed at the next actuarial valuation

Pensions paid during the Year Rs 1,490 65

As at December 31, 1954, 12 contributors had died Pensions had been sanctioned in 10 cases, and payments are being made to the widows and/or minor children. In six of these cases, although the contributors had made Lump sum Contributions, under Regulation 17, the computation of Pensions did not take into account the Lump sum contributions made. Steps should be taken to amend Regulation 17 to grant pension benefits on account of contributions thereunder.
