Mahara Prison deaths: Court orders post-mortems

When the case regarding the clashes and subsequent deaths at Mahara prison were taken up by Wattala Magistrate's Court yesterday, an order was issued to conduct post-mortems on the 11 inmates who died during the bloody clashes within the Mahara prison premises. Wattala Magistrate Buddhika Sri Ragala instructed the fivemember committee appointed over the matter to conduct the post mortem examinations at the Infectious Disease Hospital (IDH).

OUTSTANDING TAX REVENUE OF EXCISE DEPT. RS.2,376.2 MN - COPA

It was disclosed at the Committee on Public Accounts (COPA) held in Parliament on December 7 that the revenue outstanding to be collected by the Excise Department for the period of five years is Rs. 2,376.2 million by December 2019.

The total amount of tax arrears due to the Excise Department for more than five years is Rs. 479.9 million, by December 31, 2019 and its delay charge alone was Rs.1,896.3 million.

The Committee on Public Accounts chaired by Prof. Tissa Vitarana stressed that prompt action should be taken to recover the arrears. The Commissioner General of Excise and other officials informed the

The Committee also noted that the Excise Department had conducted 224,737 raids during the last five years, out of which 53,848 raids were carried out in 2017, 49,278 in 2018 and 47,391 in 2019 and that legal action has been taken against those criminals. against those criminals.

The Chairman drew attention to the fact that the relevant disciplinary inquiries regarding 48 officers who were suspended due to various reasons in

the Excise Department as at 31st December 2019, have not been completed properly even though one to three years have elapsed. It was also identified that some of the officers had been suspended due to non-participation in the District Coordinating Committees.

The Chairman of the Committee instructed that the legal proceedings be completed

The Light Rail Transit (LRT) proposed by the previous Government was a huge waste of money and the cost of building just one kilometer was Rs. 26,388 million, Company Estate Reforms, Tea and Rubber Estates Related Crops Cultivation and Factories Modernization and Tea and Rubber Export Promotion State Minister Kanaka Herath said.

He made these remarks while participating in the 2021 budget debate relating to the Ministry of Highways.

The Minister further stated that US \$ 2,200 million has been estimated for the construction of the 15 km LRT system. A huge finan-

cial irregularity was revealed for this project and if the proposal was implemented in any way, a sum of Rs. 36.6 million per day would have to be paid in loans and installments. He also said that the Kandy Expressway project

also said that the Kandy Expressway project had not been implemented properly during the previous Government. That Government had failed to pay compensation for the lands acquired for the project.

"Compensation for the expressway project was formalized under the present Government. Funds have already been allocated for the construction of expressways as well as access roads," said State Minister Herath.

32 mn loss incurred by ICTA on Ioned e-Pension Project - COPE

It was revealed at the Committee on Public Enterprises (COPE) Committee Meeting held yesterday (08), that the e-Pension Project initiated by the Information and Communication Technology Agency of Sri Lanka (Pvt) Ltd

Information and Communication Technology Agency of Sri Lanka (Pvt) Ltd (ICTA) at a cost of Rs. 232 million is a complete failure.

ICTA was entrusted with the responsibility of developing the hardware and software for the project using government funding to initially provide pension online to the pensioners of the Western Province covering the District Secretariat, the Armed Forces, the Department of Prisons, the Department of Railways and the Department of Civil Defense. However, given various software and hardware issues, the project was not implemented island wide and was abandoned on the 1st of November 2013.
