Entrepreneurs hailed President Rajapakas consistent and systematic policies to build a strong economy and praised concessions provided for economic growth in the 2021 budget.

Enlightening the President on the current situation of their businesses, they explained the prevail-

ICG seizes 9.7 kg gold in Gulf of Mannar

The Indian Coast Guard (ICG)

The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) yesterday said it had seized 9.7 kg gold from a fishing boat in the Gulf of Mannar off the Tamil Nadu coast and arrested five persons, Indian media reported.

The operation was launched at 10 pm on Thursday along with a Directorate of Revenue Inteligence (DRI) team onboard a Coast Guard ship and the suspect boat's movement was closely monitored.

Those who violate home-based quarantine rules could face up to three years imprisonment as well as a fine in Court, Police Media Spokesman DIG Ajith Roha-

na said.

The Police Media Spokesman said that The Police Media Spokesman said that quarantine rules should always be fol-lowed when undergoing home quarantine and that it is strictly forbidden to leave the house or allow any persons from out-side to enter the house, including close relatives not living in the same household.

In addition they should respond immediately if instructed by health authorities to undergo PCR or other COVID tests.

The Police Media Spokesman stated that if there are any issues or needs such as illness, medicine, food etc., the relevant telephone numbers to contact have been orded in the notice neared on the door of

teepnone numbers to contact have been noted in the notice pasted on the door of every quarantined house.

"By calling those numbers quarantined persons can seek any assistance. Officials will respond and assist immediately in resolving issues". The Police Media

Spokesman urged home quarantined persons to stay at home at all times while respecting quarantine rules.

He said the number of people currently under home quarantine was 95,825, belonging to 35,114 families.

The highest number quarantined people i from the Gampaha district at present numbering 14,332, according to police spokesman DIG Ajith Rohana.

Five persons, including a woman, have been arrested by the Anuradhapura Police on Thursday for illegally flying a drone camera near the Anuradhapura Air Force Base.

Audit report finds glaring wrongdoings in setting up 'Sharia' University

The Hira Foundation chaired by Former Governor of the Eastern Province A.M.L.Hizbullah, has been accused of committing a number of wrongdoings and abuses of power in violation of the country's common

law and regulations when initiating the controversial private 'Sharia' Uni-versity in Batticaloa, according to a report by the Auditor General. The Special Audit Report on the Establishment and Maintenance of the Batticaloa Private University has

also pointed out that the Hira Foundation, acted in a manner which amounts to an interference in the normal functioning of one Ministry, two Pradeshiya Sabhas and several other state and semi-government institutions.

Country lost US\$ 2,790 mn due to airport closure - Prasanna

The Government has lost around US\$ 2,790 million by way of levies and other revenue due to the closure of the Airport for tourist arrivals because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Tourism Minister Prasanna Rana-

tunga said.
"With the closure of the airport, tourist arrivals have been completely disrupted and a huge amount of money owed to the tourism industry has been lost from March 19

to October 30," he said. The Tourism Minister said that the country had lost around US \$ 2,700 million that would have accrued from the tourism development levy charged from foreign tourists arriving in the country.
