Decision on pre-school re-opening in two weeks - GL

Plans to commence academic activities for Grades 1 to 5

Minister of Education Prof. G.L Peiris says that a decision pertaining to the re-opening of pre-schools will be announced in the next two weeks. Prof. Peiris was speaking at a media briefing said that a definitive date to commence activities of primary grades and tuition classes will be announced in two weeks.

The Minister said that the Education Minister houses to commence academic activities.



The Minister said that the Education Ministry hopes to commence academic activities for Grades 1 to 5 in schools that have already re-opened in January next year. He said that the Ministry has observed that the resumption of academic activities of students from Grades 1–5 and pre-school is a practical necessity. He however said that any school that re-opens will need to abide by all health guidelines and the ministry will consider all aspects before arriving at a decision as this.

ICG seizes 3 tonnes of turmeric bound for Sri Lanka

Over three tonnes of turmeric

Over three tonnes of turmeric that was being illegally smuggled from Tuticorin to Sri Lanka was seized by the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) on Saturday night. The value of the seized turmeric is claimed to be INR 500,000.

The country fishing vessel amed 'Miga Periyavan' with five crew members was spotted by the ICG ship Vaibhav about 51 nautical miles southeast of Tuticorin. On searching the boat that was found under mysterious cirwas found under mysterious cir-cumstances, the ICG personnel found more than three tonnes of



turmeric in 88 bags with 35 kg in each bag.

The seized turmeric, boat and the detained men were brought to the old harbour in Tuticorin and handed over to the Customs Department for further investigations on Sunday.
