#### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, July 18, 1896, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; R. D. Ormsby, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; Dr. J. T. Morgan; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 27 were read and confirmed.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1895 to June 30, 1896; separate statement in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Report of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of June; also Health Officer's Report.

Resolved,—That the several documents, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, with Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, together with the Health Officer's report, for publication in the Gazette.

- 3. Read letter from the Secretary explaining the absence of the explantory notes which usually accompan the mouthly statement of accounts. After consideration of the complaint made, it was unanimously resolved that th Accountant be instructed in future to restrict his notes on the accounts to necessary explanations. It is no part of hi duty to audit the accounts, and clearly inconsistent with his position to call in question items of expenditure vouched for by the Secretary.
- 4. Tenders received for sundry works, and which had been considered by the Standing Committee and rejected as the rates are higher than the present cost of works, and which had been since circulated, were submitted and ordered to be filed.

5. Read letter dated July 13 from the Secretary and Superintendent of Works on subject of leave granted him, and submitting the names of two gentlemen to carry on the duties during his absence.

Resolved,—That the Council agree to Major Tranchell acting for the Secretary, but do not consider that the outdoor work should be left in his hands. The Council being desirous that the Secretary should get his leave are willing to vote a sum of Rs. 83-33 per month to the District Engineer of Kandy as remuneration for looking after the roads and buildings in charge of the Municipality. The Council having made this concession, are unable to allow the compensation for loss of exchange applied for. The leave must be restricted to six months, and the horse allowance granted to the Secretary should be paid to the District Engineer. granted to the Secretary should be paid to the District Engineer.
