Trade Marks limited to colours

OPPOSITION

NOTICE is hereby given that any person who has grounds of objection to the registration of the following trade marks may, within two months from the date of this Gazette, lodge Notice of Opposition on form T. M. No. 7 bearing an uncancelled or impressed stamp of Rs. 25. The period of lodging Notice of Opposition may be enlarged by the Registrar if he thinks fit and upon such terms as he may direct.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the Applicant fer registration so as to afford him an opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the Notice of Opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an Opponent for an Order of Costs if the opposition is uncontested by the Applicant.

VELUPPILLAI ARIARATNAM

"An air-cooled Refrigerating Machine without moving parts based on the intermittent wet-absorbtion principle"

Abstract —The Refugerating Machine described consists of three main parts

- (i) A vessel which acts alternately as generator (during the heating phase) and absorber (during the leftigerating phase) Ammonia is driven out of solution by heat during the heating phase and travels to the condenser after rectification. When the kerosene burner supplying heat goes out the refrigerating phase commences and ammonia from the evaporator is absorbed with the evolution of heat. This heat is dessipated by fins
- (11) An air-cooled multifin condenser in which the ammonia from the generator condenses. From here it passes to the evaporator through a pipe of specially designed bore constituting a liquid seal
- (iii) An evaporator consisting of a pipe suitably disposed in a brine solution Refrigeration is possible even during the heating phase due to the presence of the cooled brine
