CLINICAL TRIALS MOOTED FOR COVID-19 VACCINES

Primary Health Services, Pandemics and COVID-19 Prevention State Minis-ter Dr. Sudharshani Fernandopulle yesterday stressed that it is mandatory to conduct a proper clinical trial locally before using any drug or vaccine to pre-vent COVID-19.

State Minister Fernandopulle made this observation at a meeting held yesmeeting held yes

terday at the Ministry with the Expert Committee On COVID-19 Vaccination to inquire into the feasibility of using the vaccines currently available in the mar-ket to control COVID-19 in Sri Lanka.

"Any drug or vaccine to be used to control COVID-19 should be confirmed by a proper clinical trial, otherwise the possible side effects may be adverse," the State Minister added.

The State Minister further stated that it is essential to ensure that any medicine or vaccine prescribed by a doctor for any disease is not harmful to the human body and that there should be an accurate assessment of the complications and side effects caused by it.
