MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, August 21, 1896.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 15, 1896.

Present:—Mr. F. H. Price, Chairman; Captain F. Bayley; Dr. W. R. Kynsey, C.M.G.; Brigade-Surgeon Lieut.-Col. A. W. Duke; Hon. A. de A Seneviratne; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alvis.

The Minutes of July 10, 1896, having been printed and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of July 10, 1896, be confirmed.

- 1. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias presented a petition from some of the ratepayers of Colombo making certain suggestions re the tramway concessions to Messrs. Boustead Brothers, and moved that the same be read and considered.
 - Mr. C. Perera seconded.
 - Resolved,-That the petition be considered in connection with the draft agreement on tramways.
- 2. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of August 7, 1896, were laid before the Council:—
 - (3) By-laws relating to mortgages, drafted under clause 20, sub-section 5, of Ordinance 1 of 1896. Resolved that the draft by-laws be recommended to the Council.

Resolved that the draft by-laws be recommended to the Council.

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(5) The supervision of dairies.

Resolved that Mr. W. A. de Silva be offered the appointment of Veterinary Surgeon to the Municipality on a salary of Rs. 150 a month and allowance for one horse, for the purpose of inspecting dairies, slaughter-houses, markets, and the meat supply of the town. The Committee does not object to Mr. De Silva's lecturing at the Agricultural School, provided that each day's lecture does not occupy more than one hour.

- (6) Extra cooly for Dean's road market. An additional cooly may be allowed.
- (9) Letter from Assistant Chairman forwarding a copy of the revised edition of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance.

Resolved that the Council be recommended to thank Mr. Ludovici, and that he be informed that the Standing Committee gladly accepts his offer to edit a revised edition of the by-laws.

(10) Application from Assistant Chairman for retirement on pension, and applications for the post.

Resolved that the Council be recommended to allow Mr. Ludovici to retire on pension, and to address the Government with the view of obtaining for Mr. Ludovici additional pension on account of his services under the Government as well as under the Galle Municipality.

Resolved further that the Council be recommended to pay Mr. Ludovici at the rate of Rs. 3,500 per annum, pending the settlement of the question.

Further, that a majority of the Standing Committee recommends the Council to appoint a Secretary on Rs. 4,500 a year with biennial increments of Rs. 500 (to be made on the recommendation of the Standing Committee for the time being), rising to Rs. 6,000 a year.

Pending the appointment of a Secretary, the Committee sanctions the expenditure of Rs. 50 a month for extra clerical assistance.

(11) Application from Inspector Akbar for retirement on pension.

Resolved that Mr. Akbar's resignation be accepted, and that he be granted three months full pay in accordance with his application. The Council will be recommended to grant pension to Mr. Akbar.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the by-laws relating to mortgages referred to in paragraph 3 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee be adopted."

Mr. Haniffa seconded.—Carried.

Captain Bayley moved "that the recommendation contained in paragraph 5 of the Minutes of the foregoing Standing Committee be adopted."

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.—Carried.

Resolved further,—That the recommendations contained in paragraphs 6 and 9 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee be adopted.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the first recommendation in paragraph 10 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee be adopted."

Mr. Alvis seconded.—Carried.

With reference to the second recommendation contained in paragraph 10 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee, the Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that Mr. Ludovici be paid at the rate of Rs. 7,000 per annum pending the settlement of the question of pension."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

With reference to the third section of paragraph 10 of the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee, Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the consideration of the recommendation contained therein be postponed until the next Meeting, and that the Chairman be kindly requested to furnish this Council with a statement particularizing the duties of the Secretary."

 - (1) Mr. Walter Pereira moved "that the agreement be adopted."

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne moved as an amendment "that the draft agreement, together with all correspondnce, be referred back to the Special Committee on tramways, in order that the Committee may confer with Messrs. Boustead Brothers as to terms of agreement, and may report to the Council."

(2) That the Council considers the Mahadolle scheme to be the most promising of these, and trusts that Mr. Johnson will undertake the supervision of the further surveys required to frame an estimate, and that a sum of Rs. 1,000 be placed at his disposal for this purpose.

Resolved,—That the above resolution, with copies of Mr. Johnson's report and Dr. Anthonisz's memorandum,

be forwarded to Government.

4. Submitted letter from the Provincial Engineer dated June 27, 1896, and connected papers, in regard to

PROTEST BY DR. ANTHONISZ.

I have to enter a protest against the motion passed on Saturday, the 25th instant, by the Municipal Council regarding the construction of the China Garden drain on an altered plan, the effect of which will be to divert the surface sewage of two latrines (the police and a public one), the cattle pound, the drainage of two cemeteries, and the police station and barracks, into a drain which runs along the China Garden and opens into the canal opposite the

At present the surface sewage of this locality is more or less absorbed in the soil which it is intended to drain, and is so distributed as to cause a nuisance. To prevent this it was proposed to divert the surface sewage into the sea by constructing a drain and carrying it across the Matara road, underground, to open at the rocks near the coal sheds on the west side of the harbour.

An opening existed here years ago when there was a canal all round the China Garden. This opening was closed to the best of my knowledge at the recommendation of the late Master Attendant, Mr. Twynam, the father of Sir W. Twynam, under the belief that fresh water flowing into the harbour would cause coral to grow there.

The canal already receives the surface sewage of the China Garden, and when the tide is low and its banks exposed, it becomes very offensive. This was pointed out to me by the late Station Master of the Galle Railway.

who work in the coal sheds as a bathing place, and to increase the sewage which already flows into the canal must be injurious to the health of both man and beast.

The objections taken by the Council to construct the drain to the sea as originally proposed and agreed to by Government, and to allow the flow of the sewage into the canal, is on the belief that a drain into the sea would be blocked up with sand. This is not proved to be the case, and is simply an assertion. Wherever there is an outlet into the sea it is where there are rocks, and where no rocks exist sandbanks form. A drain runs along or close to the jail, which is daily flushed by the tide, and no sand collects in it—a proof of what I say against the supposed opinion of the Chairman and Council.

The drain opening into the harbour near the rocks will have a better fall, as admitted by the Provincial Engineer, and will be shorter than the one now approved by the Council, which will carry the sewage all round the Chine Garden, a damp and unhealthy locality saturated with surface sewage, and where, whenever an epidemic of any

kind occurs, invariably finds a location.

This short drain into the sea was proposed at the time Mr. Ievers was the Acting Chairman, after careful inspection, and received the sanction of Government. It was recommended on sanitary grounds, in that it tended to improve the sanitary condition of China Garden, and also to remove the surface sewage of the police barracks and station. On the return of Mr. Elliott to Galle opposition was raised to this work, as the correspondence on the subject with Government will show.

Another reason for objecting to this work is its cost. Rs. 5,000, it is said, would be necessary, but as Government has promised to pay one-half of it, the charge on the Municipal funds will be only Rs. 2,500. It could not be said that this expenditure is too heavy for a work of this kind where the health of the community is concerned. Since the railway was opened this neighbourhood is being more and more polluted, and it is not desirable that it should be rendered more unhealthy than it is at present.

I could not see any valid reason for altering the plan of the drain sanctioned by the Lieut.-Governor, Sir Noel

Walker, and for the construction of which Government is going to pay one-half of the cost.

The Council, when the motion was carried, consisted of only two elected Members besides myself, and all but one of the nominated Members were present. The Chairman called on the elected Member of the Ward in which the canal runs to second the motion, and I was left in the minority. I am quite sure if the elected Member who seconded the motion knew the injury he was going to do to the health of his constituents, he would have been the last to second the motion.
