#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should annex copies of their birth certificates in proof of age. No affidavits will be accepted. If no copies of birth certificates are attached, the applicants will be considered as ineligible.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Age Concession.*—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

7. Members of the Local Government Service in the same class and grade as the post advertised are eligible to apply for transfer to the vacancy advertised irrespective of educational qualifications.

8. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

### Scheme of Training for Posts of Works Overseer, Grade IV, in the Local Government Service

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for selection of trainees. The training period will be for eight weeks from April 23, 1956. The candidates who pass the test after training will be placed on a waiting list and will be given appointments as Works Overseers, Grade IV, in the Local Government Service, as and when vacancies occur. They should be prepared to serve in any part of the Island.

2 Each post of Works Overseer, Grade IV, carries a salary scale of Rs 540 per annum, rising by 10 annual increments of Rs. 12 and 8 annual increments of Rs. 18 to Rs 804 per annum. Efficiency Bar before Rs. 678 per annum. A rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and special living allowance at Government rates will be paid. A travelling allowance may also be paid. The posts are permanent and pensionable. The appointed candidates will be entitled to contribute to the Local Government Service Widows' & Orphans' Pension Fund.

3. The appointed candidates will be on one year's probation and will be subject to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations made thereunder. They have prospects of promotion to higher technical posts in the Local Government Service.

4 Applicants for training must be Ceylonese and they should be not less than 18 years of age nor more than 30 years of age on March 1, 1956. They should have passed either (a) the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination with Sinhalese or Tamil as a subject, or (b) the Senior School Certificate (Sinhalese) or (Tamil) Examination with English as a subject.

5 (a) Applications will also be considered from persons holding permanent posts in the service of a local authority, irrespective of age, provided they are otherwise qualified. Applications from such candidates should be forwarded through the Mayor or Chairman of the local authority in which they are serving.

(b) In the case of Ceylonese ex-Servicemen, or those who have had continuous temporary service in a local authority, the period of their mobilized service or temporary service in the local authority will be deducted from their ages for purposes of eligibility.

6. The selected candidates will have to undergo a course of training at the Ceylon Technical College. The duration of the course will be eight weeks. During the period of training no salary or allowances will be paid and all expenses of staying in Colombo will have to be met by them. They will also have to pay a sum of Rs. 50 (Rupees Fifty only) being fees for the course.

7. The selected candidates will be required to enter into a bond with two sureties for a sum of Rs. 500 to serve the Local Government Service for a period of not less than three years after undergoing the course of training.

8. Applications will also be considered from Works Overseers in Grade IV in the Local Government Service who desire to have a technical training. They will not be paid any subsistence or travelling expenses and the Village Committees should be prepared to grant them eight weeks duty leave and full salary and other allowances excluding the travelling allowance. The Officer will have to pay a sum of Rs. 25 (Rupees twenty-five only) being fees for the course.

9. Anyone who desires to recommend a candidate should do so by giving him a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

## Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

#### Efficiency Bar Examination for Secretaries, Grade IV, Urban Councils, and Secretaries, Grade I, Town Councils

REFERENCE is requested to my Circular letters No D. 13/3 of January 22, 1954, and March 10, 1955, on the above subject. The next Efficiency Bar Examination for Secretaries, Grade IV, Urban Councils, and Secretaries, Grade I, Town Councils, will be held on March 24, 1956. The Scheme of Examination is given below:—

#### SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

I. The subjects of the examination will be—

- (a) the two National Languages, Sinhalese and Tamil  
 (b) (i) The system of Accounts employed in Urban Councils and Town Councils; and the Government Financial Regulations Part II excluding Chapters XIX and XX.  
 (ii) Local Government Law. (This paper will be based on the Urban and Town Councils Ordinances, Regulations and By-laws framed thereunder, and the Local Government Service Ordinances, amending legislation, and regulations framed thereunder, and Local Government Service Commission Circulars and Instructions).

II. The examination in Sinhalese and Tamil will be divided into:

- (a) Conversation and interpretation.  
 (b) Reading and writing.

III. All officers will be required to pass in one language and Accounts and Local Government Law.

IV. In the examination under Rule II (a) above, the candidate will be tested in conversation so as to satisfy the examiner as to his power of understanding Sinhalese or Tamils of different classes and of making himself understood by them both in common conversation and in the course of official business. He will also be required to act as interpreter between the examiners and Sinhalese and Tamils entirely ignorant of English, the interpretation to be on matters connected with ordinary official business. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 60 per cent. of the total marks.

V. In the examination under Rule II (b) above, the candidate will be required to write an English translation of two short Sinhalese or Tamil reports written in different running hands, to translate an English Order into Sinhalese or Tamil and to read and translate and extract from a Sinhalese or Tamil notarial deed and from the proceedings of a Rural Court case put into his hands for the first time. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 60 per cent. of the total marks

VI. Candidates for examination under Rule I (b) above, will be required to obtain a minimum of 60 per cent. of the total marks in Accounts and Local Government Law

VII. *Applications.*—Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from this office and forwarded to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than March 13, 1956. Any application received after that date will be rejected. Each candidate will receive a time table stating the date and place of examination sufficiently in advance of the date fixed for the examination.

VIII. A candidate may take up the languages and the Accounts and Local Government Law papers, if he so desires, separately and on different occasions.

“ This House resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199) as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that from the first day of June, 1956, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto

#### Schedule

All that area of land known as Dela Town, situated in the villages of Dela and Dombagammana (in the Meda Pattu village area) in Meda Pattuwa, in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Nawadun Korale, in the Ratnapura District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, and bounded as follows :—

*North* By a line drawn from the centre of the confluence of Palagala Dola and We Ganga south-eastwards along the centre line of the said Palagala Dola till it meets the point where it crosses the main road from Ratnapura to Kalawana ; thence crossing the said road to a distance of 2 chains to the eastern boundary of the land called Palagalahena.

RULES in respect of the Resthouse at Matale made under section 4 of the Resthouses Act, No. 12 of 1951, by the Matale Urban Council, the appropriate authority in that behalf, and approved by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section.

#### RULES

1. An occupation fee at the rates set out in the Schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of the resthouse:

Provided that children under twelve years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates and that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- (a) an infant in arms
- (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the resthouse and who sleeps in the car or in the garage.
- (c) the chauffeur of any car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage

2. (1) Every visitor shall, on his admission to the resthouse, legibly write his correct name and address in the resthouse visitor's book

(2) No visitor shall be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments until he has carried out the requirements of the preceding paragraph.

3. (1) No person shall occupy any part of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days without the written permission of the Chairman

(2) Every occupier of the resthouse who has not obtained permission as aforesaid shall, on the expiration of three days, leave the resthouse.

4. All charges paid by a visitor shall be entered by the resthouse-keeper in the register under the appropriate columns.

5. The resthouse charges payable by a visitor shall be paid in cash on demand. In default of such payment, the resthouse-keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies to such visitor.

6. (1) No room shall be reserved for any visitor prior to his arrival unless it is engaged at least one day in advance.

(2) Where a room is reserved in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this rule, it shall be paid for, even if the person engaging it does not occupy it.

(3) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom a room is reserved, such room shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it

7. The resthouse-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

8. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

9. The value of all articles damaged or broken by a visitor shall be paid by the visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

10. (1) Any complaint which a visitor may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper shall be noted in the complaint book kept in the resthouse.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon to do so.

(3) No remark or complaint about the resthouse shall be written in the book in which the resthouse charges are entered.

11. (1) No public lunch, dinner or garden party or other reception shall be held in the resthouse premises except with the written permission of the Chairman and every such function shall be held without causing any disturbance to the other visitors in the resthouse.

(2) Where the Chairman allows the use of the whole or part of the resthouse for any function, there shall be paid to the Council—

(a) Where the number of persons attending does not exceed twenty-four, a fee (in lieu of occupation Charges) of Rs 15 for the first six hours, and Rs. 2 for every hour or part thereof in excess of six hours; and

(b) where the number of persons attending exceeds twenty-four, the occupation charges at the rates specified in the schedule hereto.

12. A person in actual occupation of the resthouse shall have a prior claim to the use of any garage or stable attached to the resthouse over persons not in occupation of the resthouse.

13. The owner or hirer of a private vehicle garaged in the resthouse or parked anywhere within the resthouse premises shall, notwithstanding that he himself has not occupied the resthouse, pay the appropriate occupation fee for the period during which the vehicle is garaged or parked, in addition to the fee for parking the vehicle or for the use of the garage.

14. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to prohibit the use of the resthouse by any visitor who is convicted of any breach of any of these rules

15. The resthouse-keeper shall not permit any person or persons to occupy any part of the resthouse for any immoral purpose

16. No visitor or servant of such visitor shall misbehave or conduct himself in such manner as to cause annoyance to the other persons using the resthouse.

17. No visitor shall be permitted to bring any dog to the resthouse.

18. Officers of the Council who have been in the service of the Council for a period of not less than two years shall be charged, for the use of the resthouse or any part thereof, half the rates specified in the Schedule hereto. This concession shall also apply to the members of the family of every such officer.

19. Any public servant occupying the resthouse while on duty in connection with any matter appertaining to the Council shall be charged half the rates specified in the Schedule hereto, if such officer is continuously on duty for any period exceeding 14 days

20. A breach of any of these rules shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

21. In these rules—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council;

“Council” means the Matale Urban Council ;  
and  
“resthouse” means the Matale Resthouse.

22. The rules relating to the resthouse at Matale published in *Gazette* No 7,994 of July 28, 1933, are hereby rescinded.
