### Posts—Vacant

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should annex copies of their birth certificates in proof of age. No affidavits will be accepted. If no copies of birth certificates are attached, the applicants will be considered as ineligible.

4 *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5 *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6 *Age Concession.*—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

7. Members of the Local Government Service in the same class and grade as the post advertised are eligible to apply for transfer to the vacancy advertised irrespective of educational qualifications.

8. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

(vii) Applications should be made substantially in the form appended below and should be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, and NOT personally to him.

(viii) Applications received in this office after the closing date will not ordinarily be entertained.

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above posts.

2 *Salary Scale*—Rs 840—6 × 72—Rs 1,272 per annum payable according to the degree of proficiency and technical skill acquired by the apprentice at each stage of training as laid down under para 4 below

3 *Qualifications required*—

(a) *Age*—Not less than 17 years nor more than 26 years of age on March 1, 1956. (Copy of birth certificate should be attached in support).

(b) Applicants should have passed the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination or a higher examination with Mathematics as a subject

Preference will be given to those who have, in addition, obtained a pass in Physics and/or Applied Mathematics.

4 The selected candidates should attend the Ceylon Technical College daily and follow the Draughtsman Apprenticeship Course (College hours are from 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. and these are liable to be altered). They are expected to conform to the College discipline. When they are not attending the College during the above hours or on days on which there are no classes, they should attend the Municipal Office

After successful completion of the Technical College Course, they should undergo a further period of 2 years' training in practical work in the Municipal Engineer's Department. During the period of training, they will receive salary as follows—

**THE STREET COLLECTIONS REGULATION ORDINANCE**

REGULATIONS for the area comprised within the administrative limits of the town of Matara, made by the Minister of Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 2 of the Street Collections Regulation Ordinance (Chapter 335), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, and approved by the Senate and the House of Representatives

**Regulations**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Matara Street Collections Regulations, 1955
2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
  - ‘ Board ’ means the Board of Control established by these regulations for the area within the administrative limits of the town of Matara ,
  - ‘ Charity ’ means the charitable institution or purpose for the use or benefit of which a collection or sale is held ,
  - ‘ collecting committee ’ means the body of persons organising or promoting and conducting or supervising any collection or sale ;
  - ‘ collection ’ means the collection of money for any charitable or other similar purpose ;
  - ‘ collector ’ means a person participating in any collection by taking money from the public for the purpose of such collection ,
  - ‘ Fund ’ means the fund which is or is to be set apart for any charitable or philanthropic purpose and for which a collection or sale is held ,
  - ‘ sale ’ means a sale of articles held for any charitable or other similar purpose ,
  - ‘ Special Commissioner ’ means the Special Commissioner appointed to administer the affairs of the town of Matara ; and
  - ‘ vendor ’ means a person participating in any sale by selling to the public the article or articles provided for the purposes of such sale
3. For the purpose of supervising and controlling the collection of money or sale of articles for charitable or other similar purposes in any street or other public place within the administrative limits of the town of Matara, there shall be a Board of Control, which is hereby established, consisting of—
  - (a) the Special Commissioner as Chairman of the Board,
  - (b) two persons nominated from time to time by the Special Commissioner with the approval of the Minister, and
  - (c) two persons nominated from time to time by the Minister
4. (1) No person shall organise or promote any collection or sale in any street or public place within the administrative limits of the town of Matara—
  - (a) unless he is a member of a collecting committee of not less than three persons appointed with the object of organising or promoting such collection or sale by any society or association, or by the managing body of any Charity or Fund, or by a representative meeting of the section of the public interested in any charitable purpose or institution, and
  - (b) unless such collecting committee has obtained from the Board in the manner hereinafter prescribed, a permit authorising the collection or sale

Provided, however, that nothing in the preceding provisions of this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit or affect in any way—

- (i) any collection taken at an open-air meeting, or
- (ii) the sale of any article in any street or public place in the ordinary course of trade, or for the purpose of earning a livelihood, without any representation being made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose

(2) No person who is a member of a collecting committee to which a permit is issued under these regulations shall cause or permit the collection to be taken or the sale to be held otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit

5. Every application for a permit shall—

- (a) be substantially in Form A set out in the Schedule hereto,
- (b) be signed by every member of the collecting committee organising the collection or sale for which the permit is required,
- (c) be addressed to the Chairman of the Board, and
- (d) be made not later than the first day of the month preceding the month fixed for the collection or sale

Provided, however, that the Board may in the special circumstances of any case entertain an application notwithstanding that such application is made later than the aforesaid date

6. Every permit issued by the Board shall be subject to the following conditions —

- (1) The collection shall be taken or the sale held only on the day and between the hours and in the districts, streets or places specified in the permit,
- (2) No person under the age of fourteen years shall be authorised or permitted to act as a collector or vendor,
- (3) Every person authorised to act as a collector or vendor shall, before the hour fixed for the commencement of the collection or sale, be given a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority;
- (4) All boxes or other receptacles in which the collection or the purchase money is to be placed shall be numbered serially and shall be securely closed and sealed in a manner capable of preventing the extraction of money placed therein without breaking the seal, and a record shall be kept of the serial number of each box or receptacle issued to each person who is authorized to act as collector or vendor,
- (5) Every such box or receptacle shall bear prominently displayed thereon—
  - (a) the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held,
  - (b) the date of the collection or sale, and
  - (c) the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle.

(6) No payment shall be made or reward given—

- (a) to any collector or vendor for his services in connection with the collection or sale, or
- (b) directly or indirectly to any other person connected with the promotion or conduct of the collection or sale, unless the name of that person and the nature of the payment or reward have been specified in the application made for the permit.

7. No person shall act as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale—

- (a) if he is under fourteen years of age, or
- (b) if he is not the holder of a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority, or
- (c) if he knows or has reason to believe that the collection or sale has not been authorised by a permit issued by the Board

8. No person acting as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale shall—

- (a) carry or use any collecting box or receptacle for money which is not securely closed and sealed and which does not bear prominently displayed thereon—
  - (i) the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held;
  - (ii) the date of the collection or sale, and
  - (iii) the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle;
- (b) carry on the collection or sale on any date, or at any time, or in any district or street or place, other than that specified in the permit issued in that behalf, or
- (c) carry on the collection or sale in any part of the carriage-way of any street, or in such manner on any part of the foot-way of a street or in any public place as to cause obstruction or annoyance to any person lawfully using such street or public place, or
- (d) use for the purposes of the collection or sale any table exceeding 30 inches in length or 20 inches in width or use any table in a manner which causes or is likely to cause obstruction to the public; or
- (e) keep any animal with him at the place where he is to carry on the collection or sale; or
- (f) in the course of the collection or sale importune any person to the annoyance of that person; or
- (g) fail to place any money received in the course of the collection or sale in the sealed box or receptacle or in one of the sealed boxes or receptacles issued to him for the purpose, or
- (h) fail or refuse for any reason after the close of the collection or sale to deliver each of the boxes or receptacles issued to him, with the seals intact, to the person authorised by the collecting committee to take charge of such boxes or receptacles.

9. Every person acting as a collector or vendor shall produce forthwith for inspection, on the demand of any Police Officer not below the rank of sub-inspector, the written authority issued to him by the collecting committee.

10 (1) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the collecting committee shall—

- (a) cause a statement of the amount received and the expenditure incurred in connection with such collection or sale to be prepared substantially in Form B set out in the Schedule hereto, and to be signed by two of the office-bearers authorised in that behalf by the committee,
- (b) cause the statement to be audited by the auditor appointed by the committee, or where there is no such auditor, by a responsible person who is not a member of the committee, and
- (c) forward to the Chairman of the Board the original of the statement so audited, together with receipts of vouchers in proof of the items of expenditure set out in the statement.

(2) In any case where the expenses of a collection or sale are defrayed wholly or in part by any contributions distinct from the amount collected or realized, particulars of such contributions shall be inserted in the statement both under the head "Receipts" and under the head "Expenditure"

11. Every collecting committee shall, if required so to do by the Board, produce proof to the satisfaction of the Board as to the due application of the proceeds of the collection or sale to the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection or sale was conducted

**THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE**

THE following resolution passed by the Senate at a meeting held on January 31, 1956, and by the House of Representatives at a meeting held on February 7, 1956, is published for general information:—

“ This House resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that from the first day of March, 1956, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto.

**Schedule**

All that area of land known as the Ginigathena Bazaar area, situated in the villages of Kadawala, Thiniyagala and Gonawala in the Ambagamuwa (Uda Bulatgama) village area, in Ambagamuwa Korale, in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Uda Bulatgamuwa, Kandy District, Central Province, and bounded as follows:—

*North*—By a line drawn from a point on the northern boundary of the Public Works Department Road from Colombo to Ginigathena at the 63rd milestone, south-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road till it meets the centre line of the foot-path (lot 8 in F V P 106 C. P.) near the 63½ milestone on the said road, thence north-eastwards along the centre line of the foot-path (lots 8, 7 and 6 in F V P 106 C. P.) which forms the southern boundary of Kenilworth Estate to the western boundary of the Public Works Department Road from Nawalapitiya to Hatton; thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the 7th milestone on the said road; thence due eastwards along a straight line crossing the said road till it meets the left bank of the Mahaweli Ganga.

*East*—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the left bank of the Mahaweli Ganga till it meets a point due north-east of the centre of culvert No. 9/2 on the Public Works Department road from Nawalapitiya to Hatton.

*South*—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point due south-westwards along a straight line till it meets the centre of culvert No. 9/2 on the Public Works Department road from Nawalapitiya to Hatton; thence north-westwards along a straight line to the centre of the junction of the Village Committee road from Ella Uda to Ginigathena and the Village Committee road leading to Horakada

*West*—By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along a straight line to the starting point of the northern limit of the area ”

**Rules**

1 These rules shall apply to the resthouse at Tangalla

2 (a) Every person using any part of the resthouse as an office or place of business during his occupation of the resthouse shall pay, in addition to occupation fee, a special fee of one rupee for each period not exceeding one hour

Every person so using the resthouse shall desist from doing so if the resthouse-keeper so requests in the interest of the comfort and convenience of the other visitors of the resthouse.

(b) The Chairman may permit the use of the resthouse or any portion thereof for the purpose of any lunch, dinner, garden party or other organised reception at a fee, in lieu of the occupation fee prescribed by by-law 3, of Rs 30 for a period not exceeding six hours and Rs. 5 for every hour or part of an hour in excess of six hours.

3 A consolidated fee at the rate set out in the Schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of the resthouse or garage:

Provided that children under 12 years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rate and no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- (a) a child in arms;
- (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse;
- (c) the chauffeur of any car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage

4 1 Every visitor shall, on admission to the resthouse, legibly write his or her correct name in the resthouse visitors' book and shall enter therein in the columns provided for the purpose, his or her permanent postal address and the date and time of arrival at the resthouse.

(2) No visitor shall be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments until he has complied with the requirements of paragraph (1)

5 No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman

6. No charges other than those payable to the Council shall be entered in the resthouse book by a visitor

The resthouse fees and charges specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid in cash on demand. In default of payment, the resthouse-keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies. A copy of the Hotel Keepers' Ordinance (chapter 30) shall be exhibited together with these rules in some conspicuous place in the resthouse



8 (1) No room shall be reserved unless it is engaged at least one day in advance, and unless the occupation fee payable is paid in advance

(2) Where a room which is reserved by any person is not occupied by him, the fee paid in advance shall be forfeited.

(3) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom a room is reserved, the room shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it

9 The resthouse-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared, unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram

10 No bed, sofa or couch in the resthouse shall be used by any visitor for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon. A breach of this rule shall be punishable with a fine of five rupees.

11 The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

12 Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse-keeper shall wear a white coat and shall be dressed neatly when attending on visitors.

13 (1) Any complaint which a visitor wishes to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper shall be noted in the complaint book;

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon to do so.

14 No part of the building or premises of the resthouse other than the kitchen shall be used by a visitor or his servant for the purpose of cooking any meal.

15 No visitor shall bring any dog into the resthouse unless such dog is under proper control. Where a nuisance is created by the presence of a dog in the resthouse and complaint thereof is made to the resthouse-keeper by a visitor, the owner of the dog shall cause such dog to be removed from the resthouse

16 A breach of any of the preceding rules other than rule 10 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees

17 In these rules "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Tangalla Urban Council; and

"Council" means the Tangalla Urban Council
