Central Expressway third stretch to open before March 31

The third stretch of the Central Expressway from Meerigama to Pothuhera will be vested with the public before March 31, 2021, Highways Minister Johnston Fernando said. He said that the Road Development Authority (RDA) will undertake the construction, supervision, planning and

design of the third stretch. Although then President Mahinda Rajapaksa laid the foundation stone for this section in 2014, the former Yahapalana Government did not continue the work, he said.

"We were planning to complete the entire Central Expressway project by 2019 and vest it with the public. If

this target was achieved, there would have been a massive development in the country. But, we could not achieve anything due to the failure of the former Government."

"The Government has allocated the largest amount of funds for the Highways Ministry. We expect to complete the tasks in the coming years.
