President Gotabaya Rajipaksa yester-day decided to suspend arrival of pas-sengers from the United Kingdom from today due to a new strain of COVID-19 currently spreading across the UK. Aviation Authority for all inbound travellers to Sri Lanka in the wake of the discovery of a fast spreading new strain of Coronavirus in certain countries.

The revised guidelines on repatriation will be issued once the situation has been reappraised, a Foreign Ministry statement said yesterday. "All flights from the United Kingdom have been beaung it of Sri Lanka with effect from 2 a.m. today," State Aviation Minister D. V. Chanaka told the *Daily News* last night.

"We want to ensure that our borders
