GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

2. Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 24 on March 8, 1956, and possessed of sound physique as they will be required to work mainly under arduous conditions in forests. They should have passed the Government Senior School Certificate (English) or equivalent or higher examination with Elementary Mathematics as a subject. Preference will be given to those who have passed in Botany or Rural Science in addition. They should also be able to converse fluently in Sinhalese or Tamil, preferably in both.

3. The posts are permanent and pensionable and the appointment of a selected candidate will in the first instance be on two years' probation on the salary scale Rs. 960—72—Rs. 1,392 per annum. If service has been satisfactory and prescribed departmental examinations have been passed during the period of probation the officer will be confirmed and placed on the Forest Ranger grade salary scale Rs. 1,260—120—Rs. 3,900 per annum.

If an officer fails to secure confirmation at the end of 2 years he will be liable to discontinuance but Government at its discretion may allow an extension of the period of probation. If his service is unsatisfactory, he will be liable to discontinuance at any time during the original or extended period of probation or at the end thereof.

COLOMBO PORT COMMISSION

Posts of Special Apprentices (Marine)

APPLICATIONS are invited for three posts of Special Apprentices (Marine) in the Harbour Engineer's Branch of the Colombo Port Commission. Applications which should substantially be in the form given below must reach the Port Commissioner on or before March 2, 1956.

2. *Qualifications.*—Every candidate must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (i) has passed the Senior School Certificate or an equivalent or higher examination with Mathematics and Physics and preferably one or more of the subjects—Advanced Mathematics and Mechanics.
- (ii) is of good character and physically sound.
- (iii) not less than 17 years or more than 21 years of age on March 2, 1956. Three years extra will be allowed for those who have successfully completed the Junior Technical Officers course in Mechanical Engineering or higher course at the Ceylon Technical College.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—Every successful candidate will be placed under 3 months probation. If he is found to be satisfactory at the end of the probationary period which will be counted as part of his training, the apprentice and his parent or guardian will be required to sign an Indenture to cover the 5 years training the apprentice will receive in this department. In the case of a candidate who has successfully completed the Junior Technical Officers' course or a higher course in Mechanical Engineering at the Ceylon Technical College the period of training will be reduced by one year.

Deposit to ensure good behaviour and service under Government.—At the end of the probationary period, the Special Apprentice or his guardian will be required to deposit with the Colombo Port Commission a sum of Rs. 300 as a guarantee of the good behaviour and conduct of the apprentice. This sum which will be deposited in the Ceylon Savings Bank will be paid back with interest earned thereon to the apprentice on completion of the training provided the Harbour Engineer certifies that the apprentice has satisfactorily concluded his apprenticeship. If the Indenture is terminated before the completion of the period of training for any reason other than on account of illness of the apprentice, or the Harbour Engineer is not willing to issue the certificate referred to above, the deposit is liable to be forfeited. The candidate will be required to enter into a further bond and agreement in a sum of Rs 5,000 that such candidate will serve the Government, if so required, for a period of at least 5 years immediately after qualifying as a M. O. T. Engineer (1st or 2nd class as the Port Commissioner may decide).

Unsatisfactory Conduct.—If an apprentice's conduct is not satisfactory, the Port Commissioner has the power to terminate the Indenture at any stage of the training without previous notice.

Programme of Training.—Special Apprentices will be trained in the different workshops as decided by the Mechanical Superintending Engineer. Technical instruction at the Ceylon Technical College is compulsory and will be confined to two days a week or as arranged by the Harbour Engineer and Director of the Ceylon Technical College. On these days, the apprentices will not attend the Harbour Engineer's Department unless specially instructed to do so. Non-attendance at the Technical College will count as absence from duty and will incur forfeiture of pay. On other working days of the Department the Special Apprentices will be expected to report for training at the Colombo Port Commission workshops as decided by the Harbour Engineer.

Rates of Pay.—Special Apprentices will, subject to the approval of the Harbour Engineer, be paid at the following rates during training in the Colombo Port Commission :—

but no increment will be granted unless the Engineer under whom the Apprentice is being trained certifies that he is worthy of it.

Leave during Period of Apprenticeship.—After one year's satisfactory attendance and service, Special Apprentices will be eligible to casual leave for 14 days in terms of F. R. 1385 (v).

Studentship of the Institute of Mechanical Engineers and Marine Engineers.—A Special Apprentice desiring to improve his qualification may be recommended for enrolment, at his own expense, as a student of the Institutes of Mechanical Engineers and/or Marine Engineers on satisfying the following conditions :—

- (i) that he reaches a standard required by the Harbour Engineer in an examination oral or otherwise to be held after the completion of the first 2 years of his training ;
- (ii) That he completes satisfactorily the prescribed course of instructions at the Ceylon Technical College and obtains good reports from the Director of that College.

(iii) that the Departmental Officers under whom he has worked report that his work and conduct have been satisfactory.

N B.—It should be clearly understood, however, that this department does not give any undertaking that even if an Apprentice satisfies these conditions he will be recommended for such studentships.

Examination.—Every Special Apprentice will be required to reach a specified standard in a written examination to be held at the end of each year of apprenticeship to test his knowledge in the practical engineering work on which he had been engaged. Failure to attain that standard in any of these examinations will result in the withholding of the increment due to the Apprentice until he passes it.

Employment after completion of Apprenticeship.—Completion of apprenticeship does not qualify the Special Apprentice for appointment to any engineering post in the Colombo Port Commission Department. To qualify for this, the possession of a Board of Trade First Class Marine Engineer's Certificate is normally necessary, although in special circumstances a Second Class Marine Engineer's Certificate may be accepted as the minimum qualification. Every Special Apprentice must make his own arrangements to secure an appointment as a Junior Engineer in a sea-going vessel to obtain the sea service required to make him qualified to sit for these Board of Trade Marine Engineering Examinations. The department will do its best to assist him to obtain such an appointment.

Apprentices who have passed the Junior Technical Officers' course in Mechanical Engineering and satisfactorily completed the course of training outlined above, as well as passed a final Departmental examination on Workshop practice conducted by the Harbour Engineer may be employed as Minor Supervisors, Grade I, provided there are vacancies, while awaiting opportunities to acquire sea service.

Leave.—Apprentices who complete their period of training will be eligible for leave without pay for the period spent on acquiring sea service. However, before leave is granted, such an Apprentice will be required to enter into an Agreement with the Port Commissioner to qualify in the minimum time and to return to the Island after he obtains the First Class (or the Second Class Board of Trade Certificates should the department so require) and serve the Colombo Port Commission for a minimum period of 5 years. Those who obtain the Second Class Board of Trade Certificate will be considered for appointment as 2nd Engineers of Tugs. Those who obtain the First Class Board of Trade Certificate will be considered for appointment as First Engineer Tugs. Leave without pay may be granted to 2nd Class Board of Trade Engineers who are in employment in the Department for acquiring the necessary sea going training for the purpose of obtaining the First Class Board of Trade Certificate.
