GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

CEYLON GOVERNMENT RAILWAY**Post of Junior Mechanical Engineer**

APPLICATIONS are invited for a post of Junior Mechanical Engineer, Ceylon Government Railway. Applications, both local and overseas, which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before Thursday, April 12, 1956.

**PROFICIENCY EXAMINATION IN SINHA-
LESE/TAMIL—JUNE, 1956**

1. *Date of Examination.*—June 9, 1956

An examination will be held at two levels, Ordinary and Advanced, to test the proficiency in Sinhalese/Tamil of officers who have been trained at departmental centres, and of other officers who wish to sit for this examination.

2. *Centres of Examination.*—The examination will be held in Colombo and at the following centres:—Kalutara, Galle, Matara, Hambantota, Kandy, Matale, Nuwara Eliya, Ratnapura, Kegalla, Kurunegala, Puttalam, Chilaw, Jaffna, Mannar, Vavuniya, Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa, Badulla, Batticaloa and Trincomalee.

Any centre for which a sufficient number of candidates do not enter may be cancelled.

Candidates are required to attend at the Examination Hall assigned to them.

3. *Eligibility.*—Officers in the Public Service who (i) hold permanent posts and (ii) are in receipt of a fixed salary of not less than Rs. 600 per annum or are on scales the initial of which is not less than Rs. 600 per annum are eligible for this examination.

Heads of Departments will be responsible for checking the eligibility of their officers.

4. *Applications.*—(i) Candidates should apply for admission through the Head of their local office or sub-office, on the prescribed entry list which will be issued by the Commissioner of Examinations on application being made to him by each local Head. The list should be completed in triplicate by each local Head and all three copies forwarded well in time, to the Head of the Department, under registered cover. For this purpose, the term "local Head" shall mean the officer directly in charge of the sub-office or sub-department in which the applicant/s work/s. (ii) The necessary supply of entry list forms may be obtained from the Department of Examinations from April 11, 1956, to April 26, 1956. An indication of the probable number of candidates should be given to enable the Department of Examinations to issue a sufficient supply. Any excess may be preserved for use at subsequent Examinations. All completed entry lists should reach the Commissioner of Examinations on or before May 2, 1956.

5. *Admission Forms.*—(1) The Commissioner of Examinations will return direct to each local Head or the Head of the Department, as appropriate, the duplicate entry list indicating (a) the Index Numbers assigned to each of his candidates and (b) the Place of Examination (Hall) which has been allotted to them. A sufficient supply of Admission Forms which will give the Time Table and the Rules governing the conduct of candidates will also be sent at the same time.

The local Head will enter on each Admission Form the name, Index Number, Centre and Place of Examination (Hall) as indicated in the duplicate entry list and issue them to his candidates. Thereafter, the Head may retain the duplicate entry list in his office for record.

(ii) Every candidate presenting himself for the examination is required to give up his Admission Form to the Supervising Officer.

(iii) Candidates are bound by the Rules and Regulations prescribed by the Commissioner of Examinations for the conduct of examinations and are liable to any punishment imposed by him for breach of these Rules and Regulations.

6. *Scheme of Examination.*—(i) The Examination consists of the following sections:—

- (1) Sinhalese—Ordinary Level. (2) Sinhalese—Advanced, Level. (3) Tamil—Ordinary Level (4) Tamil—Advanced Level

A candidate may enter for only one of these sections.

(ii) The standard required for the papers at Ordinary Level will be that of the Junior School Certificate and for the papers at Advanced Level will be that of the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level).

(iii) In order to qualify for a pass in the examination, candidates will be required to obtain a minimum of 40 per cent of the marks allotted to each paper

(iv) *Syllabus.*

Sinhalese or Tamil—Ordinary Level *Marks*

- (i) Language and Composition—one paper of 2½ hours 150

The paper will consist of (i) exercises in one or more of the following forms of composition: description, dialogue, letter-writing, official minutes, and reports, paraphrase, (ii) questions on the comprehension of simple unprepared passages, and, (iii) questions dealing with some or all of the following: meaning, function and relation of words, phrases and sentences, errors, &c

- (ii) Translation—one paper of 2½ hours 150

Translation (i) into English and into Sinhalese/Tamil of easy idioms, phrases and sentences, of a passage of simple prose and of an easy extract from an official document or newspaper report, and (ii) into Sinhalese/Tamil of official terms and phrases

Sinhalese or Tamil—Advanced Level *Marks*

- (i) Language and Composition—one paper of 2½ hours 150

The paper will consist of (i) exercises in one or more of the following forms of composition: essay (a choice of subjects will be given), letter-writing, paraphrase, official minutes and reports, (ii) a precis (a prose extract from an official document or newspaper editorial or article to be condensed), and (iii) questions dealing with some or all of the following: meaning, function and relation of words, phrases and sentences, errors, figurative language, analysis and syntheses, &c.

- (ii) Translation—one paper of 2½ hours 150

Translation (i) into English and into Sinhalese/Tamil of idioms, phrases and sentences of a passage of prose or verse, and of an extract from an official document or newspaper report, and (ii) into Sinhalese/Tamil of official terms and phrases.

(v) Marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

7. *Leave to attend Examination.*—Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their departments, whose applications have been forwarded by them, leave to present themselves for the examination. This leave shall count as duty leave.

8. *Results.*—The Commissioner of Examinations will return the triplicate entry list to each Head of Department conveying the results of his officers. The passes and failures in each paper will be indicated. Each Head of Department will convey the results to his officers in the various local offices or sub-offices.

The signature forms of the successful candidates will at the same time be forwarded to be filed in the Departmental Personal Files. The necessary entries should also be made in their History Sheets.

Age Concession to Temporary Clerks and Draughtsmen of the Survey Department.—

13 Temporary Clerks and Draughtsmen in the employ of the Survey Department on March 23, 1956, will be permitted to sit for the examination provided they possess the educational qualifications specified in para 12 and are under 45 years of age on August 1, 1956.

14 Candidates entitled to War Service concession should furnish documentary proof of such service when forwarding their applications.

Note—(i) The War Service concession referred to does not apply to civilian employees in Service Departments.

(ii) Civil Defence Services will be held to include only those services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.
