GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service, who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

VACANCY IN THE CEYLON OVERSEAS SERVICE

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

Posts of Inspector of Schools, Grade I (Permanent and Temporary—Sinhalese Qualified)

APPLICATIONS from men and women candidates, who satisfy the conditions in paragraph 4 below, are invited for permanent posts and temporary posts of Inspector of Schools, Grade I, in the Education Department Applications, which should be in the specimen form shown below, should reach the Director of Education, Administrative Branch, Education Department, Malay Street, Colombo 2, on or before April 12, 1956. Applicants who wish to be considered for both permanent and temporary posts should state so in the application.

2. The salary scale attached to the posts is Rs. 3,420 rising up to Rs. 6,780 per annum by 4 annual increments of Rs. 120, 8 of Rs. 180 and 6 of Rs. 240 with efficiency bars before Rs. 4,080, Rs. 4,800 and Rs. 5,580.

3. The permanent posts are pensionable under the Minutes on Pensions except in the case of female officers. The candidates selected for permanent posts will, if not in the permanent pensionable service under Government, be appointed on probation for two years. A female officer will be required to contribute to the Public Service Provident Fund. The temporary posts are non-pensionable and appointments to them are terminable at one month's notice on either side. The selected candidates will be required to contribute to the Public Service Provident Fund. If candidates holding permanent appointments pensionable under the Minutes on Pensions are selected, the question of seconding them to the Post of Inspector of Schools will be taken up with the Treasury, and if those holding permanent appointments pensionable under the School Teachers' Pension Regulations are selected, their pension rights will be safeguarded during the period of temporary appointment as Inspector.

4. (i) Every applicant must satisfy the following conditions and furnish satisfactory proof thereof:—

- (a) If not already in the service of the Government, should be less than 35 years of age on April 12, 1956.
- (b) Should be trained graduates with at least 3 years' experience in teaching or graduates of a recognized University with at least 5 years' experience in teaching.
- (c) Should possess a good knowledge of Sinhalese. Preference will be given to those who have passed at least in language and literature at the Sinhalese S S C Examination or G. C. E. (Ordinary Level, Sinhalese) Examination.
- (c) Should be of good character and physically sound.

(ii) The selected candidate would be required to maintain for his official travelling a motor car or a motor cycle. Candidates must, therefore, be prepared to adduce proof of their ability to do so. An advance for the purchase of motor vehicles will be available only to those appointed to permanent posts.

3. The permanent posts are pensionable under the Minutes on Pensions except in the case of female officers. EXAMINATION (ENGLISH) FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE TYPISTS' SERVICE—JUNE, 1956

1 *Date of Examination*—A competitive examination for candidates of either sex wishing to enter the Typists' Service, which does not form part of the General Clerical Service, will be held in Colombo by the Commissioner of Examinations commencing on June 16, 1956

2 *Salary*—Successful candidates will be appointed to the Typists' Service on the salary scale of Rs 960 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs 72 to Rs 2,688 per annum. In this scale, efficiency bars operate before Rs. 1,608 and Rs 2,184

3 *Conditions of Service*—(i) The posts are pensionable for male candidates. Female candidates will be appointed on a Provident Fund basis. Successful male candidates will be appointed on two years' probation and female candidates will be appointed on two years' trial.

(ii) As regards allowances and other conditions of service, reference is invited to the general conditions applicable to appointments to posts in the Public Service, published at the beginning of Part I, Section II, of this *Gazette*.

(iii) Officers in the Typists' Service will not be allowed to sit for the examination for promotion to the Executive Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service but they will be allowed to sit for the examination for entry into the Lower Grade of the Stenographers' Transferable Service,

irrespective of age and educational qualifications, after they have been confirmed in their appointments in the Typists' Service

4 *Eligibility—General Conditions*.—(i) Candidates must be of good character

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese¹.

(iii) Candidates should possess at least—

(a) the London Matriculation or the Cambridge Senior Certificate or the Ceylon Senior School (English) Certificate; OR

(b) the Senior Domestic Science Certificate; OR

(c) the Senior School (Sinhalese or Tamil) Certificate TOGETHER WITH ONE of the following:—

(i) a credit pass in English at the S S C (Sinhalese/Tamil) Examination, or at the G C E (Ordinary Level—Sinhalese/Tamil Medium) Examination;

(ii) an ordinary pass in English Language at the G C E (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examination;

(iii) a pass in the J S C (English) Examination held by the Education Department or by a school approved by it OR

(d) the Final Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; OR

¹ For all purposes of recruitment to the Public Service, the term "Ceylonese" is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

- (e) either the Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section) or the Higher Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section) (Ceylon Scheme) of the London Chamber of Commerce; OR
- (f) either the Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section) or the Higher Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section) awarded by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and the Ceylon Education Department, OR
- (g) the Commercial Certificate or the Higher Commercial Certificate (for Book-Keepers or for Shorthand Typists) of the Ceylon Technical College

Note—Applications will not be entertained from candidates who have sat for any of the examinations mentioned above, the results of which have not been released before the date of closing of applications for this examination

(iv) Candidates must be not less than 17 years nor more than 24 years of age on June 1, 1956.

5 *Eligibility—Special Concessions to Government Employees*—(i) *Clerks in the Higher and Lower Grades of the Quasi-Clerical Service*.—Clerks in the Higher and Lower Grades of the Quasi-Clerical Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before April 21, 1956, will be permitted to sit for this examination, irrespective of educational qualifications, provided they are not more than 45 years of age on June 1, 1956.

(ii) *Assistant Clerks, Copyists and Typist-Clerks*.—Clerks in the Assistant Clerks' Service controlled by the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury who have been confirmed in their appointments as Assistant Clerks on or before April 21, 1956, and Copyists and Typist-Clerks with not less than 2 years' service on April 21, 1956, will be allowed to sit for this examination, irrespective of educational qualifications, provided they are not more than 45 years of age on June 1, 1956

(iii) *Permanent Employees*.—Persons holding permanent posts in Government employ on March 21, 1956, who are not eligible for the concession set out in paragraph 5 (i) and (ii), will be permitted to sit for this examination provided—

- (a) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 4 (iii);
- (b) they are under 45 years of age on June 1, 1956; and
- (c) their services are certified as satisfactory by the Heads of their Departments and the Heads of Departments are prepared to release them if they are selected for appointment to the Typists' Service

Note—(a) Officers belonging to Departmental Clerical Services, such as the Railway, Postal, Survey and Customs Clerical Services, will not be eligible to sit for the examination under the above sub-paragraph Officers in Departmental Clerical Services, recruitment to which has now ceased, will, however, be eligible

(b) Candidates who are admitted to the examination under the above sub-paragraph and are successful will not, under any circumstances, be allowed incremental credit for their previous services They will be appointed to the Typists' Service on the initial salary of the scale for that Service

(iv) *Temporary Clerks, Temporary Stenographers and Temporary Typists*.—Temporary Clerks, Temporary Stenographers and Temporary Typists employed in Government Departments will be permitted to sit for this examination provided—

(a) they have passed at least—

(i) the Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department, OR

(ii) an examination held by a school approved by the Education Department and certified by the Principal/Head Master as equivalent to the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department.

(Note—Applications will not be entertained from candidates who have sat for any of the examinations mentioned above the results of which have not been released before the date of closing of applications for this examination.)

- (b) they are under 45 years of age on June 1, 1956; and
- (c) they have completed at least one year's continuous service under Government immediately prior to April 1, 1956.

(v) *Temporary Employees*.—Persons holding temporary posts in Government employ, who are not eligible for the concession set out in paragraph 6 (iv), will be permitted to sit for this examination provided—

- (a) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 4 (iii);
- (b) they are under 45 years of age on June 1, 1956; and
- (c) they have completed at least one year's continuous service under Government immediately prior to April 1, 1956

6 *Applications*.—(i) Application forms for admission to the examination may be obtained by personal callers from the Enquiry Office, Department of Examinations, or by post from the Commissioner of Examinations, Malay Street, Slave Island, P O Box 1503, Colombo 2, from April 5 to 21, 1956 Each candidate will be issued only one form

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Commissioner of Examinations, P O Box 1503, Colombo 2, on or before April 25, 1956 Any application received after that date will be rejected The name of the examination should be clearly written on the left-hand top corner of the envelope

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs 10

(iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government departments must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified Candidates are requested to forward their applications to the Heads of their Departments well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Commissioner of Examinations to reach him on or before April 25, 1956.

7. *Admission to the Examination.*—(i) The Commissioner of Examinations will issue admission forms to all candidates whose applications have been received. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admission to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time-table and the rules for candidates and directions to them for their guidance will be forwarded together with the admission form. Candidates will be bound by these rules. The decision of the Commissioner of Examinations in regard to any breach of the rules will be final. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervisor on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should communicate without delay with the Commissioner of Examinations, Malay Street, Slave Island, P. O. Box 1503, Colombo 2 (telegraphic address: "Exams", Colombo), informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following information:—

- (1) Name of examination ;
- (2) Full name ;
- (3) Full postal address ;
- (4) Examination centre at which candidate applied to take his examination ;
- (5) Post Office, registration number and date of despatch.

(ii) Admission to the examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.

The Commissioner of Examinations may, however, grant to a candidate provisional admission to the examination at his discretion. Such candidature will subsequently be either confirmed or cancelled.

8. *Identity Cards*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.
- (b) A valid passport issued not more than 3 years before the date of this examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued not more than 3 years before the date of this examination on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

9. *Documents of Eligibility.*—(i) *No documents whatsoever should be forwarded with the application* but the necessary particulars should all be provided in the form as required. An application which is not complete in all these respects will be judged on its own merits and may be rejected.

(ii) Documentary evidence in proof of eligibility will be required from candidates who have qualified. Such candidates should produce these documents at the *Viva Voce* Test, if held, or forward them promptly under registered cover when called for by the Commissioner of Examinations.

(iii) The following documents will be necessary:—

- (a) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person.

Note.—If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, Divisional Revenue Officer or a permanent Government officer in receipt of an annual salary of Rs. 2,400 or over, or, generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made. The name, designation and address of the person must be clearly indicated on the certificate.

Candidates holding permanent posts in Government employ will not be required to furnish certificates of good character.

- (b) A certified copy of the candidate's birth registration entry.

Note.—(a) The special certificate of birth issued for school or educational purposes or a certified *extract* from the birth registration entry will not be accepted.

(b) *Affidavits or baptismal certificates will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.*

(c) If the name/names appearing in the birth certificate differs/differ from the name/names which the candidate ordinarily uses and under which the candidate enters for the examination, action should be taken immediately in terms of section 27 or 28, as the case may be, of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, No. 17 of 1951, to get the name in the birth registration entry amended. - (d) Original certificate of educational qualification or where the certificate has not been issued other official documents (e.g., Ceylon G. E. C.—Ordinary Level—results slip issued to private candidates or original letter from the candidate's head of school).

In the case of the J. S. C. awarded by a school approved by the Education Department, the relevant portion of the application form must necessarily be completed by the Head of the School. No other statement will be accepted. The production of a Record Sheet in proof of this educational qualification is *not* sufficient.

(iv) Candidates are warned to have all the necessary documents in readiness at the time of application. Any candidate who is unable to produce the necessary documents at the *Viva Voce*

10 *Penalty for furnishing False Particulars.*—If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

If any of the particulars furnished by a candidate are found to be false within his knowledge, or if he has wilfully suppressed any material fact, or if it is proved, at any time, during the period of his service, that he was ineligible to sit for this examination, he will be liable to immediate dismissal from the Service

11. *Refunds*—No refunds will be made under any circumstances.

Fees paid for this examination cannot be transferred to any other examination.

12. *Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination.*—Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their departments, whose applications have been approved by the Commissioner of Examinations, leave to present themselves at the examination.

13. *Scheme of Examination.*—The examination will be held in two parts, viz., Part I (Written) and Part II (*Viva Voce*). The subjects of the examination and the marks assigned to each subject are given below. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

3 Agreements and Security.—The selected candidates will be required to—
