GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts specified in the schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under Section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension

By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of Section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service or permanent posts in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should annex copies of their birth certificates in proof of age. No affidavits will be accepted. If no copies of birth certificates are attached, the applicants will be considered as ineligible.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. *Age Concession.*—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

7. Members of the Local Government Service in the same class and grade as the post advertised are eligible to apply for transfer to the vacancy advertised irrespective of educational qualifications

8. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant if selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

**THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61
OF 1939**

Order under sections 2, 5, 6 and 15

ORDER made by the Minister of Local Government under sections 2, 5, 6 and 15 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, as amended by section 89 of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance, No. 53 of 1946, and modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

ORDER

1. The area delimited in the First Schedule hereto shall be a town for the purposes of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance"), and the administrative limits of that town shall be the limits set out in that Schedule.

2. The name and designation of the Urban Council to be constituted under the Ordinance for the aforesaid town shall be the following:—
"Nawalapitiya Urban Council".

3. The number of members of whom the Nawalapitiya Urban Council shall consist, shall be eight.

4. The town for which the Nawalapitiya Urban Council is to be constituted shall be divided into eight wards as defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The date on which the term of office of the Nawalapitiya Urban Council shall commence, shall be January 1, 1957.

FIRST SCHEDULE

*Administrative Limits of the Town of
Nawalapitiya*

All that area of land situated in the villages of Bawwagama, Jayasundara, Kahamana, Karahandungala, Mahakumbura, Medagahawatura, Nawalapitiya, Penitudumulla, Penituduwa and Warakawa in Pasbage Korale of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Uda Bulatgama, Kandy District, Central Province, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from the Centre of the junction of the Nawalapitiya-Dolosbage road with the Shamrock estate road otherwise called Lunuwanegala road eastwards along the northern boundary of the Gansabhawa road to a point 100 feet

to the east of and on a line parallel to the centre line of the Nawalapitiya-Dolosbage road, thence southwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 100 feet to the east from the centre line of the Nawalapitiya-Dolosbage road to the point where it meets the landmarked boundary shown on Town Survey Sheet No L 10/1-3 east, thence south-eastwards along the said landmarked boundary crossing the Galpeela Ela to a point 300 feet to the west of and on a line parallel to the centre line of the Nawalapitiya-Gampola road, thence northwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 300 feet to the west from the centre line of the Nawalapitiya-Gampola road to the northern boundary of the Gansabhawa road, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the Gansabhawa road to the second railway gate on the Nawalapitiya-Gampola road, thence in a straight line south-eastwards to a distance of 132 yards crossing the last-mentioned road to a point on the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga and crossing the bridge over the Mahaweli Ganga on the road to Goorook Oya estate to a point 60 yards north of the centre of the bridge on the Nawalapitiya-Kotmale road, thence eastwards in a straight line to a point near the confluence of Hal Oya with Mahaweli Ganga 207 yards north of the centre of the junction of the Nawalapitiya-Kotmale road and the road leading to Hyndford estate, thence southwards in a straight line through the centre of the said road junction to a point 92 yards south of the centre of the said road junction, thence westwards in a straight line to a distance of 57 yards, thence south-westwards in a straight line to a point on the right bank of Mahaweli Ganga 175 yards south-east of the centre of the bridge over the Mahaweli Ganga on the Nawalapitiya-Kotmale road

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point due westwards in a straight line to a point on the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga 182 yards south of the centre of the bridge on the Nawalapitiya-Kotmale road, thence westwards along the centre line of the Mahaweli Ganga and crossing the railway bridge to a point 44 yards to the west of the centre of the said railway bridge.

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards in a straight line to the boundary defined with rail posts shown on Town Survey Sheet No L 10/9-10 west, thence north-westwards along the said boundary up to the centre line of the ela, thence westwards along the centre line of the ela up to the landmarked boundary shown on Town Survey Sheet No L 10/9-6 west, thence north-westwards along the said landmarked boundary up to the western boundary of the Gansabhawa path, thence north-eastwards along the western boundary of the Gansabhawa path up to the landmarked boundary shown on the said sheet, thence north-westwards along the said landmarked boundary crossing the channel and ela up to the 24th mile stone on the Ambagamuwa road, thence northwards in a straight line crossing the said

road to the landmarked boundary shown on Town Survey Sheet No L 10/9-5 east, thence northwards and north-eastwards along the landmarked boundary shown on Town Survey Sheets Nos L 10/9-5 east, L 10/9-1 east, and L 10/1-13 east and crossing the footpath and Sandanamwatte Ela to the western boundary of the Tawalam road leading northwards to Dolosbage, thence northwards, north-eastwards and again northwards along the western boundary of the said Tawalam road and crossing Dewalagommane Ela and Gederahena Oya to a point due west of the landmark on the eastern boundary of the said Tawalam road shown on Town Survey Sheet No L 10/1-10 east, thence eastwards, north-eastwards and again eastwards across the said road and along the landmarked boundary shown on Town Survey Sheets Nos L 10/1-10 east, L 10/1-11 west, L 10/1-7 west, L 10/1-3 west, and L 10/1-3 east and crossing the Penithudumulle Oya and the Gansabhawa path up to the left bank of the Galpeela Ela, thence eastwards along the left bank of the Galpeela Ela up to the western boundary (cutting) of the Nawalapitiya-Dolosbage road, thence northwards along the western boundary of the Nawalapitiya-Dolosbage road to a point south of the centre of the junction of the said road with the Shamrock estate road, thence northwards in a straight line to the starting point of the northern limit of the area

SECOND SCHEDULE

Ward No 1 —Bazaar

North By a line drawn from a point at the centre line of Dolosbage road opposite the centre of the western end of the over-head bridge connecting Dolosbage road and Market road eastwards along the centre line of the said bridge and Market road to the centre of the junction of the said Market road with Gampola road, thence eastwards along the centre line of the Urban Council road (Lane 1) to the centre line of the partly built earth drain at the turn-off on the said road, thence eastwards along the centre line of the said drain to the centre of Baily road

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Baily road to the point 4½ chains south of the Public Works Department Bungalow at which the said road takes a sharp turn towards the west

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Baily road to the centre of its junction with Kotmale road, thence north-westwards and westwards along the centre line of Kotmale road and Ambagamuwa road to the centre of the junction of the said Ambagamuwa road with Dolosbage road

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Dolosbage road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward

Ward No. 2 —Madagala

North By a line drawn from the centre of the culvert No. 1/5 on Dolosbage road eastwards and south-eastwards along the

centre line of the stream to the centre of the culvert No 24/2 on Gampola road, thence southwards along the centre line of Gampola road to the centre of its junction with Baily road, thence eastwards along the centre line of Baily road and Gansabhawa path to the left bank of Mahaweli Ganga, thence eastwards in prolongation of the centre line of the said Gansabhawa path to the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

East. By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to a point where a line in prolongation eastwards of the centre line of the partly built earth drain on the northern limit of ward No 1 meets the said eastern limit of the Urban Council area

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards across Mahaweli Ganga to the centre line of the partly built earth drain, thence westwards along the centre line of the said drain to the centre line of Baily road, thence eastwards along the northern limit of ward No 1 to its western extremity

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Dolosbage road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No 3.—Shamrock

North By a line drawn from the rock landmark on the western limit of the Urban Council area where it meets the village limit between Warakawa and Kahamana shown on Town Survey Sheet No L 10/1-3 west eastwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the western boundary of Dolosbage road, thence eastwards to the centre line of the said road

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of Dolosbage road to the centre of its junction with Ambagamuwa road.

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Ambagamuwa road to the centre of its junction with Hill road

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Hill road and the Gansabhawa path leading to Dolosbage and passing the Reservoir to the western limit of the Urban Council area, thence northwards along the said limit to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 4—Pemtuduwa

North By a line drawn from a point on the western limit of the Urban Council area where it crosses the Tawalam road leading to Dolosbage eastwards along the said limit to the western limit of ward No. 3

East. By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the western limit of ward No 3 till it meets the centre line of the Ambagamuwa road, thence north-westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of its junction with the old Gansabhawa path leading to Karahandungala, thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said path to the centre

line of the Railway line, thence southwards and south-eastwards along the centre line of the Railway line to the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

South. By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to its western extremity

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, northwards and north-eastwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 5—Karahandungala

North: By a line drawn from the centre of the culvert over Eldorawatte Ela on Ambagamuwa road north-eastwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre line of the Railway line.

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the Railway line to a point $1\frac{3}{4}$ chains north-east of the 88th mile post.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the Railway line to the eastern limit of ward No 4, thence westwards and north-westwards along the said limit to a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains from the centre of the Railway line measured along the centre line of the Gansabhawa path

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the eastern limit of ward No 4 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 6.—Bawwagama

North By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of Kotmale road and Bridgend road (now known as Soysakele road) south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the southern and eastern limits of ward No 1 to the southern limit of ward No 2, thence eastwards along the said limit to the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

- Storing of straw
- Curing or storing of plumbago
- Keeping of a timber depot
- Keeping of a kerosene oil depot
- Manufacture of jewellery
- Keeping of a smithy
- Keeping of a printing press
- Keeping of a tea factory
- Keeping of a smithy in which oxygen is used
- Manufacture of aerated waters
- Any trade in which machinery driven by oil or other fuel or steam or electricity is used.

(2) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive trades :—

- Storing of cured or dry fish
- Storing of perishable articles of food and provisions for the purpose of sale by wholesale
- Manufacture of compost or artificial manure
- Manufacture of vinegar
- Manufacture of soap
- Keeping of a tannery
- Curing of arecanuts
- Boiling of blood or offal
- Smoking or manufacture of sheet or crepe rubber
- Storing of artificial manure or materials used for the preparation of artificial manure in quantity over three bags
- Manufacture of treacle
- Keeping of a toddy-collecting station
- Manufacture of beedies

(3) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous and offensive trades :—

- Manufacture of bricks or tiles
- Charging of batteries
- Burning, storing, curing or rending of lime
- Keeping of a barber saloon

Construction of Buildings

4. (1) No person shall erect within the village area any new building, boundary wall or gateway within a distance of—

- (a) fifteen feet from the centre of any village cart road ; or
- (b) fifteen feet from the centre of any village path which has been notified by the Committee as a path which in course of time, is to be converted into a village cart road ; or
- (c) twelve feet from the centre of any village path other than a path referred to in subparagraph (b).

(2) no person shall erect any building, boundary wall or gateway along any cart road or path referred to in paragraph (1) without giving thirty days' notice thereof, in writing, to the Chairman.

Scavenging and Conservancy

5. For the purposes of by-law 11 of Part VI of the Standard By-laws adopted by the Committee, the scavenging fee payable monthly to the Committee shall be twenty-five cents

Officers and Servants

6. The Chairman may authorise in writing any officer or other person to collect all taxes or fees due to the Committee, and to issue printed receipts bearing the facsimile of the Chairman's signature and the seal of the Committee

7. No person shall wilfully obstruct—

- (a) the Chairman or any other officer of the Committee in the exercise, performance or discharge of any power, duty or function, conferred on, imposed upon, or assigned to such Chairman or officer by, or under, any of the provisions of the Ordinance, or of any by-law made thereunder ; or
- (b) any servant or labourer employed by, or on behalf of, the Committee in the performance of any duty lawfully imposed upon him by the Chairman or any other officer of the Committee.
