GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate

SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE STUDY OF COST ACCOUNTING IN THE UNITED KINGDOM

APPLICATIONS are invited from Clerks with considerable experience in financial and accounting work for the award of a scholarship for the study of Cost Accountancy in the United Kingdom. The period of scholarship is 3 years. Applications which should be substantially in the form appended should reach the Deputy Controller of Establishments on or before August 16, 1956.

2 *Terms of Award*—The under-mentioned expenses will be met by the Government—

- (a) Remuneration to the scholar in accordance with the rules given in Treasury Circular No. 276 of November 30, 1955.
- (b) Refund (up to a maximum of Rs. 1,000 for the entire Scholarship) of cost of books certified by the training authorities as necessary for the satisfactory completion of the course of study.
- (c) Reimbursement of medical expenses supported by medical certificate and bills up to £50 for the duration of the scholarship.
- (d) Free passages to and from Ceylon.
- (e) Outfit allowance at appropriate Government rate.

3 *Qualifications required*—Every applicant should—

- (i) be in the Executive Clerical Class, Grade II, of the General Clerical Service;
- (ii) have passed the Government Senior School Certificate (English) or equivalent examination with credits in five subjects of which two must be (a) Mathematics, and (b) English, English Language or English Literature;
- (iii) be of excellent moral character.
- (iv) not be more than 35 years of age on August 16, 1956.

4. *Agreement and Security*—The selected candidate will be required to—

- (a) enter into an agreement with the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury undertaking among other things to follow and satisfactorily complete the prescribed course of studies and to pass the Final Examination of the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants, London, and to serve the Government for a specified period (to be decided by the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury) after passing the Final Examination of the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants, London.
- (b) enter into a personal bond in a sum covering the full cost of the scholarship as indemnity in the event of his failure to complete the course satisfactorily and pass the Final Examination of the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants, London, or to comply with the terms and conditions in the Agreement.

5 On return to Ceylon after passing the Final Examination of the Institute of Cost and Works Accountants, London, the officer will be appointed to Class IV of the Accountants' Service. Before he is confirmed in his appointment, he will be required to pass an examination in Financial Regulations.

6. The selected candidate will be required to pass a Medical Examination by a Medical Board appointed by Government as to the candidate's physical and mental fitness to undergo a course of studies in the country in which it is to be undertaken. A high degree of physical and mental health is required.

In the case of officers who have passed the Government Senior School Certificate Examination (English), a copy of the detailed results issued by the Commissioner of Examinations should be attached.

Fellowships for Medical Officers in Ophthalmology under Colombo Plan

APPLICATIONS are invited from Medical Officers of the Department of Health for the award of two Fellowships in Ophthalmology for a period of 1½ years in the United Kingdom under the Colombo Plan, to obtain the D. L. O. (Eng.)

2. Applicants should be—

- (a) under 45 years of age on June 1, 1956,
- (b) Medical Officers in Grade II.

3 All applicants must be Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" means a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

4 A high standard of both mental and physical fitness is necessary. The successful candidates will be required to pass a Medical Examination by a Board of Government Medical Officers as to their mental and physical fitness

5. Candidates will be required to present themselves for an interview in Colombo at an appointed time and place which will be notified later. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

6. The selected candidates will be required to—

- (a) enter into Agreements with the Government of Ceylon, undertaking among other things, to follow the prescribed courses and complete satisfactorily their courses of studies, and to serve the Government for a specified period (which will be determined by Government) after completion of their courses of studies,
- (b) enter into personal bonds undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the total cost of training (i.e., salary, allowances, cost of passages, &c., paid on account of the fellowship from Ceylon Government funds and by the Government awarding the fellowship under the Colombo Plan) in the event of their failure to comply with the terms and conditions in the Agreement.

7. The Agreement of Medical Officers will include the following clause:—

The said trainees shall while in the service of the Government devote himself exclusively to the duties of his office as a member of the Department of Health and shall not, without the written consent of the Director of Health Services, render any professional service to any person for fee or reward. Where such consent is given he shall be bound to strictly observe such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in writing from time to time by the Director of Health Services.

8. The award of the fellowship includes cost of travel to and from the country of study, and a suitable training allowance fixed by the Colombo Plan authorities payable in the United Kingdom.

9. The trainees will be granted study leave on full pay. However, no rent or separation allowance is payable.

10. The selected candidate will not be entitled to enhanced emoluments as a result of undergoing the training.
