GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules,

Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

Terms of Engagement.—(1) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(ii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

War Service Concession—Provided they are qualified in all other respects ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions

and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

#### DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES

#### Hospital Clerical Service Examination

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter the Hospital Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, on November 3, 1956.

The Examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations. Candidates are bound by the Rules for Candidates framed by the Commissioner.

- 2. Salary.—(1) Successful candidates will be appointed to Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service on the salary of Rs. 960 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,688 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 1,206 per annum.
- (ii) Successful candidates, with previous continuous service as temporary clerks in the Department of Health and the Quarantine Department, will be granted incremental credit as if they had been on the salary scale obtaining from time to time for Assistant Clerks from the date of commencement of their temporary employment, provided that such incremental credit does not result in their being paid a salary higher than that received by them in their temporary office immediately prior to appointment to Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.
- 3. Conditions of Service.—(i) Reference is requested to the General Conditions applicable to appointments to posts in the Public Service, published at the beginning of Part I, Section II, of this Gazette.
- (ii) The posts are permanent and pensionable. The selected candidate will be appointed on probation for a period of two years. Candidates will be required to pass an examination in the following before promotion over the efficiency bar .—
  - (a) Sinhalese and Tamil (conversation and interpretation);
  - (b) Rules, regulations and procedure relating to hospital accounts and administration.
  - (iii) Successful candidates will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon.
- (iv) Successful candidates will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed.
  - 4. Successful candidates will be given appointments as vacancies occur.
  - 5. Eligibility.—(i) Candidates must be of good character.
  - (ii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—
    - (a) the London Matriculation or the Cambridge Senior or the Ceylon Senior School (English) Certificate Examination; or
    - (b) the Senior School (Sinhalese or Tamil) Certificate Examination together with one of the following:—
      - (i) A credit pass in English at the S. S. C. (Sinhalese/Tamil) Examination, or at the G. C. E (Ordinary Level: Sinhalese/Tamil Medium) Examination;
      - (ii) an ordinary pass in English Language at the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examination;
      - (iii) a pass in the J. S. C. (English) Examination held by the Education Department or by a school approved by it; or
    - (c) the Final Examination for the Commercial Certificates of the Ceylon Technical College;

(d) one of the following examinations:-

(r) Cambridge Jumor
(ii) J. S. C (English)
Education Department
(iii) J. S. C. (English) school
approved by the
Education Department

- (i) EITHER the Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists Section) OR the Higher Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section), (Overseas Scheme), of the London Chamber of Commerce; or
- (n) EITHER the Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section) OR the Higher Commercial Education Certificate (General Commercial or Shorthand Typists' Section) awarded by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce and the Ceylon Education Department, or
- (in) The Commercial Certificate or the Higher Commercial Certificate (for Book-Keepers or for Shorthand Typists) of the Ceylon Technical College.

Note.—True copies of certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application form.

- (iii) Candidates must be between 17 and 25 years of age on November 1, 1956.
- 6. Eligibility.—Special conditions for ex-personnel of the Civil Defence Services :-

In computing age for the purpose of the age-limit prescribed in paragraph 5 (iv), persons who have been full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions or Civil Defence Services (excluding those who were dismissed or had left those services of their own accord) for any length of time during the period September 3, 1939 to August 15, 1945, inclusive, will be allowed to deduct the period of their continuous full-time service with those Services since September 3, 1939, from their ages. They should also have passed at least one of the following —

- (1) Cambridge Junior;
- (2) J. S. C. (English), Education Department;
- (3) J. S. C. (English), school approved by the Education Department;
- (4) Higher Commercial Certificate (either section), London Chamber of Commerce,
- (5) Commerce Certificate (either section), London Chamber of Commerce,
- (6) Commercial Certificate (either section), Ceylon Chamber of Commerce.
- Note —(1) True copies (NOT ORIGINALS) of certificates of educational qualifications should be attached to the application.
  - (2) Civil Defence Service will be held to include only those services the members of which were enrolled under the Defence Regulations.
- 7. (1) (a) Temporary Clerks in the Department of Health will be eligible to sit for the examination, irrespective of educational qualifications, provided they—
  - (i) are not more than 45 years of age on September 1, 1956,
  - (ii) have completed one year's continuous satisfactory service in the Department of Health Services or the Quarantine Department , and
  - (ui) are recommended by their superior officers as efficient, of good character, and fully capable of performing the duties of a hospital clerk in Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service.
  - (b) Copies of certificates in proof of (i), (ii) and (iii) above should be attached to application.
  - (c) A period of "break" not exceeding fifteen days will be condoned if such break was due to retrenchment.
- (d) Mmor employees and Hospital Overseers of the Department of Health will be eligible to sit for the examination provided they—
  - (1) possess the Junior School Certificate (in English) or higher qualifications,
  - (ii) are not more than 45 years of age on November 1, 1956,
  - (iii) have completed two years' continuous satisfactory service in the Department of Health on November 1, 1956,
  - (iv) are recommended by their superior officers as efficient, of good character, and fully capable of performing the duties of a hospital clerk in Class II of the Hospital Clerical Service
- 8. (i) Applications should be substantially in the form specified below, and should be sent by registered post to reach the Office of the Director of Health Services, P. O. Box 500, Secretariat, Colombo 1, on or before September 29, 1956.
  - (ii) Applications will be rejected if they-
    - (1) are received after the closing date specified in (i) above, and
    - (2) do not conform in any respect with the requirements of this notification.
  - (iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10.
- (iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments, whether in a temporary or permanent capacity, must forward their applications through the heads of the institutions and departments in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so he will be regarded as disqualified.
- (v) Candidates referred to in paragraphs 6 and 7 must attach to their applications copies of certificates in proof of their satisfactory service. These certificates should in addition, indicate clearly the period of their service.

(v1) A copy of the certificate of the registration (not the originals) of the candidate's birth must be attached to the form of application.

Note.—(a) The special certificate of birth issued for purpose of admission to schools will not be accepted for this examination.

- (b) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.
- (c) Baptismal certificates will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.
- (d) Where the name/names appearing in the birth certificate differ/differs from the name/names which the candidate ordinarily uses and under which the candidate enters for the examination a valid affidavit to the effect that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not than of any other person must be attached. In the case of a candidate who has a parent living, the affidavit must be by the parent. In the case of others, the affidavit must be by a guardian or close relative. In no case will an affidavit by the candidate himself be accepted. Action should also be taken forthwith in terms of section 19 or 20, as the case may be, of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), to get the name in the birth registration entry amended by the Registrar-General, the Provincial Registrar, or the Assistant Provincial Registrar, of the district in which the birth took place. That such action is being taken should be stated in the affidavit. A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94), will be accepted for the purposes of making appointments only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established.
- (e) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of this office must also be attached to the form of application. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended, otherwise it may be from a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, Divisional Revenue Officer or a permanent Government Officer in receipt of an annual salary of Rs 2,400 or over or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made. The name, designation, and address of the person must be clearly indicated on the certificate.
- 9. Admission forms will be issued to candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointing to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate who does not produce such forms will be refused admission to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall, other than the one assigned to him, will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time-table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by the candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the Examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination he should communicate without delay with the Director of Health Services informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following information:—

10 If any of the particulars furnished by a candidate are found to be false within his knowledge, or if he has wilfully suppressed any material facts, or if it is proved, at any time during the period of his service, that he was meligible to sit for this examination, he will be hable to immediate dismissal from the service

- 11 In no circumstances will a refund of the value of the stamps be made.
- 12. Identity Cards.—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted
  - (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.
  - (b) A valid passport issued within 3 years of the date of this examination.
  - (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within 3 years of the date of this examination on the authority of a Government department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

- 13. The subjects for the examination are as follows:--
  - (1) English Language and composition—one-and-half-hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the correct use of the English Language.
  - (2) General paper—a-two-and-half-hour paper in three sections, as follows:—
    - (a) 50 minutes. A test of accuracy with figures including tots and additions of various kinds
       (b) 50 minutes. A test of general and local knowledge
       (c) 50 minutes. A test of general intelligence

(3) One of the following:--

Sinhalese.
Tamil

(4) Viva voce test .. 100

their applications. The number to be called for the viva voce examination will be decided by the Director of Health Services. The viva voce examination may, however, be dispensed with in the event of the number of candidates qualifying for it falling short of the number of vacancies. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

15. The names of successful candidates will be published in the Government Gazette.
