The Cabinet of Ministers yesterday approved Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi's proposal to enter into an agreement to receive COVID-19 vaccines through the COVAX facility, which Sri Lanka has already joined.

COVAX is a co-initiative of the World Health Organ-

COVAX is a co-initiative of the World Health Organisation (WHO), Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) and Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunisation (GAVI). It brings together Governments and manufacturers to ensure equal distribution of vaccines among emerging countries. The WHO has confirmed that Sri Lanka is eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccines through this facility.

The production and development of vaccines for COVID-19 are being accelerated worldwide and COVAX will ensure that the vaccines eventually reach every country in an equitable and timely manner.
