Priority for Sri Lanka in vaccine exports

Enhanced cooperation in post-COVID era

India is ready to give priority to Sri Lanka when exporting the vaccines now being produced in India to prevent COVID-19, the External Affairs Minister of India Dr. S.Jaishankar told President Gotabaya Rajapaksa yesterday. The Indian Minister called on President Rajapaksa at the Presidental Secretariat. Commenting on the future course of action to control the COVID-19 pandemic, the President stated that Sri Lanka would like to obtain the COVID vaccines which are being produced in India, following an accurate assessment of the need for treat-ment.

Dr. Jaishankar agreed to give priority to SrI Lanka when his country begin separting the vaccines to other countries. India currently produces the Oxford/Astra/emeca COVISHELD waccine under license at the Serma Institute of India (the world's biggiest vaccine producer) as well as the homogrown Bharat Biotech COVAXIN vaccine. The Serma Institute of India plans to initially produce 100 million doses of the Astra-Fencea vaccine for India, priced at INR 200 per dose. It will later produce 400 million doses for the WHO/CEP/IGAVI COVAX initiative from which too SrI Lanka plans to obtain COVID-19 vaccines. # 'All Easter attack culprits will be punished'

It has been almost two years since the Easter Sunday attacks which was carried out on April 21, 2019 resulting in the deaths of almost 300 and injuries to over 500 and the Government is carrying out extensive investigations regarding this incident. "As the Presidential Commission investigating the Easter attacks had unravelled many a vital evidence which was not found during the investigations by the Parliamentary Committee appointed during the previous Government, we cannot be satisfied with the investigations carried out by the Parliamentary Committee appointed by the previous regime to investigate the Easter attacks, "said Public Security Minister Rear Admiral (Rid) De. Sarath Weerasekara.

He said this in Parliament yester day, in response to a question raised by MP Nalin Fernando. MP Fernando questioned the Government
