Mailed narco pills worth over Rs.135 mn detected

A package containing 18,000 ecstasy pills worth over Rs.135 million has been detected by Sri Lanka Customs Narcotics Control Unit during an inspec-tion at the Central Mail Exchange in Colombo

The stock of narcotics pills were reportedly sent from Belgium via air mail. The package of narcotic pills has
