GOVT TO RETAIN OWNERSHIP, ADMINISTRATION

NO HARM TO COUNTRY'S SOVEREIGNTY AND INDEPENDENCE

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa yester-day assured trade unionists that the East-

day assured trade unionists that the East-ern Container Terminal (ECT) of the Colombo Port will not be sold or leased. The President met the Ports Author-ity Trade Union representatives at the Presidential Secretariat on their request to discuss about the ECT.

The President stressed that he would The President stressed that he would not allow any harm to the country's sovereignty and independence from the investments made. "The former Government has made an agreement to sell the ECT to India. Following discussions the incumbent Government had with India, it has now been agreed to retain 51 per cent of its ownership and the administration of the Eastern Terminal with the Ports Authority," the President

said.

He pointed out that the ECT would be subject to sustainable development under the investment project. He said the ECT development project. He san the ECT.
development project was planned after
careful consideration of regional geopolitical facts, the country's sovereignty,
generation of income and job opportunities. He explained that India contributes
to 66 per cent of re-exports at the ECT.
Bangladesh contributes 9 per cent to the

shipment volumes and the rest are trans-

shipment volumes and the rest are trans-shipments from other countries.

The President said the plan is to devel-op the Port as a shared investment where 51 per cent of shares would be owned by the Sri Lankan Government, while the Adani Group of India and others could invest in the rest (40 per cent) invest in the rest (49 per cent).

The President, asking the Trade Unionists not to harbour any doubts on the investment, also requested their suggestions for further improving it. Ports Minister Rohitha Abeygunawardena, Secretary to the President Dr. P.B. Jayasundera and other officials participated.
