## Over 12,335 prisoners released to reduce congestion

The authorities have released 12,339 prisoners since December 1 last year aimed at reducing congestion in the country's jails, a senior official said yesterday.

Prior to their release the inmates

were subject to Polymerize Chain Re-

action (PCRs) as a precaution against the Covid-19 pandemic, Prisons Spokesman, Commissioner Chandana Ekanayake said. Among those released were 371

# Hunt on for buried survivors after Indonesian quake

OVER 45 PEOPLE DEAD, HUNDREDS INTURED

AFP: Rescuers scrambled to find buried survivors vesterday after a powerful earthquake on Indonesia's Sulawesi island killed dozens, injured hundreds and left more feared trapped in the rubble of collapsed build-

At least 45 people died after the 6.2-magnitude quake struck in the early hours of Friday, triggering panic among residents of the island, which was hit by a 2018 quake-tsunami disaster that killed thousands,

Dozens of bodies have been



hauled from beneath crumpled buildings in Mamuiu, a city of about 110,000 in West Sulawe-si province, while others were killed south of the area after the SEE PAGE 2
