REGULATION made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs under section 155 of the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949.

Regulation

The Soldiers Service Regulations, 1950, published in *Gazette* No. 10,085 of March 17, 1950, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended in the Schedule thereto; by the insertion in Table H, immediately after item (xx) relating to the cause of discharge, of the following new item, the several particulars contained therein being set out in the appropriate columns in the aforesaid Schedule:—

- | (xxi) Discharge by purchase. The amount of the purchase price shall be in accordance with the scale of rates set out hereunder | Commander of the Army | Officer Commanding | Officer in charge of records | (i) Discharge by purchase shall not apply to a soldier who is serving overseas or who, in his capacity as a soldier, is in debt to the Government until such debt is paid.
(ii) A soldier with more than three months but less than three years service, or a soldier who has entered into an agreement to serve for a specified period as a condition precedent to his being trained as a tradesman or other specialist, or who has been trained for or has been employed in, any of the trades set out hereunder shall not, except with the prior approval of the Permanent Secretary, be permitted to purchase his discharge.
(iii) A soldier who has completed sixteen years service on his current engagement and whose aggregate service entitles him to a pension under the Army Pensions and Gratuities Code shall not be required to pay any purchase price.
(iv) The provisions of the Army Pensions and Gratuities Code shall apply to a soldier who has purchased his discharge, and accordingly the gratuity to which a soldier may be entitled at the time of his discharge may be set off against the purchase price which he is required to pay.
(v) Where a soldier who has purchased his discharge re-enlists in the Regular Force of the Army or enlists in the Regular Naval Force or in the Regular Air Force within twelve months of such discharge, and declares his prior service upon such re-enlistment or enlistment, as the case may be, a part of the purchase price not exceeding fifty per centum thereof may be refunded to him after the completion of three months service in his new engagement.
(vi) Where a soldier who has purchased his discharge joins the Volunteer Force of the Army, a refund of thirty per centum of the amount of the purchase price shall be made. |

(vii) In the special circumstances of any particular case, a reduction in the amount of the purchase price or a free discharge may be allowed by the Commander of the Army. In a case where the reduction in the amount of the purchase price exceeds fifty per centum thereof, or in a case where a free discharge is granted, the prior approval of the Permanent Secretary shall be obtained.

THE NAVY ACT, No. 34 OF 1950

REGULATION made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs under section 161 of the Navy Act, No. 34 of 1950.

Regulation

The Seamen's Enlistment and Service Regulations, 1950, published in *Gazette* No. 10,187 of December 9, 1950, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended as follows :—

(1) in regulation 15 thereof,—

(a) by the substitution, in paragraph (1) thereof, for sub-paragraph (viii), of the following new sub-paragraph :—

“(viii) who desires to secure his discharge by purchase, that is to say, by the payment of a sum of money in accordance with the scale of rates set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto, if the Captain of the Navy considers that discharge by purchase should be allowed in the particular circumstances of any case.”;

(b) in the proviso to paragraph (1), by the substitution for sub-paragraph (b), of the following new sub-paragraph :—

“(b) sub-paragraph (viii) shall be subject to the following provisions :—

- (i) No seaman shall be entitled to claim a discharge by purchase as of right.
- (ii) Discharge by purchase shall not apply to a seaman who is serving overseas or who is, in his capacity as a seaman, in debt to the Government until such debt is paid.
- (iii) A seaman who has completed sixteen years of service or who has sufficient aggregate service to qualify him for a pension under the Navy Pensions and Gratuities Code shall not be required to pay any purchase price in respect of his discharge.
- (iv) The provisions of the Navy Pensions and Gratuities Code shall apply to a seaman who has purchased his discharge, and accordingly, the gratuity to which a seaman may be entitled at the time of his discharge may be set off against the purchase price payable by him.
- (v) Where a seaman who has purchased his discharge re-joins the Regular Naval Force or joins the Regular Force of the Army or the Regular Air Force within twelve months of such discharge and declares his prior service upon such re-enlistment or enlistment, as the case may be, a part of the amount of the purchase price not exceeding fifty per centum thereof may be refunded after the completion of three months of service in his new engagement.
- (vi) Where a seaman who has purchased his discharge joins the Volunteer Force of the Navy, a refund of thirty per centum of the amount of the purchase price shall be made.
- (vii) In the special circumstances of any particular case, a reduction in the amount of the purchase price or a free discharge may be allowed by the Captain of the Navy. In a case where the reduction in the amount of the purchase price exceeds fifty per centum thereof, or in a case where a free discharge is granted, the prior approval of the Permanent Secretary shall be obtained. A seaman who is granted a free discharge shall be entitled to travelling expenses from the place of discharge to his home.”; and

(2) by the insertion, immediately after the Third Schedule thereto, of the following new Schedule :—

THE AIR FORCE ACT, No. 41 OF 1949

REGULATION made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 155 of the Air Force Act, No. 41 of 1949.

Regulation

The Ceylon Air Force (Regular and Regular Reserve) Regulations, 1951, published in *Gazette* No. 10,240 of April 27, 1951, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) by the insertion, immediately after regulation 165, of the following new regulations:—

“ DISCHARGE BY PURCHASE

166. (1) The Commander of the Air Force may allow an airman to secure his discharge by purchase, that is to say, by the payment of a sum of money in accordance with the rates specified in Table D set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

(2) A discharge by purchase under paragraph (1) of this regulation shall not be allowed if—

- (a) the Commander of the Air Force is of the opinion that the exigencies of the service do not warrant such a discharge; or
- (b) the airman, in his capacity as an airman, is in debt to the Government; or
- (c) the airman is serving overseas.

167. (1) Officer cadets under training at any training establishment of the Royal Ceylon Air Force or of the Royal Air Force, in Ceylon or abroad, shall not be entitled to a discharge by purchase:

Provided, however, that in the special circumstances of any particular case, the Permanent Secretary may authorise such a discharge.

(2) In the event of any officer cadet being granted a discharge by purchase under paragraph (1) of this regulation, such officer cadet shall pay a sum of Rs. 2,500 together with such sum of money as may be payable under the terms of the bond which such officer cadet has entered into; and if he is abroad, he shall, in addition, pay the expenses of his passage to Ceylon.

168. (1) Any apprentice or airman, who has entered into a bond to serve in the Regular Air Force for a fixed period as a condition precedent to any specialised training given to him shall not be granted a discharge by purchase:

Provided, however, that in the special circumstances of any particular case, the Permanent Secretary may authorise a discharge by purchase in the case of any such apprentice or airman.

(2) In the event of any apprentice or airman being granted a discharge by purchase under paragraph (1) of this regulation, such apprentice or airman shall pay in addition to the sum of money payable under the terms of the bond which he has entered into in respect of his training, such sum of money specified in Table D of the Fifth Schedule hereto, as is appropriate to him.

169. (1) An airman who obtains a discharge by purchase shall be eligible for any pension or gratuity which he may be entitled to under any other provisions of these regulations.

(2) The gratuity to which an airman may be entitled at the time of his discharge may be set off against the purchase price which he is required to pay.

170. (1) An airman who wishes to obtain a discharge by purchase shall make application to the Commanding Officer of his unit stating in full the grounds upon which he makes such application.

(2) Where an application is made under paragraph (1) of this regulation, the Commanding Officer shall forward such application to the Commander of the Air Force together with his report thereon. Such report shall state whether—

- (a) the application is made on account of any misconduct on the part of the airman;
- (b) the airman is in debt to the Government; and
- (c) there is any objection to a discharge by purchase being granted to such airman.

171. In the special circumstances of any particular case, a reduction in the amount of the purchase price or a free discharge may be allowed by the Commander of the Air Force. In a case where the reduction in the amount of the purchase price exceeds fifty per centum thereof, or in a case where a free discharge is granted, the prior approval of the Permanent Secretary shall be obtained. An airman who is granted a free discharge shall be entitled to travelling expenses from the place of discharge to his home.”; and

(2) in the Fifth Schedule thereto, by the insertion immediately after Table "C" of the following new Table:—

G. Romiel Singho, M. M. Japin Nona, T. A. D. Lewis Appuhamy and his wife who were employed at the Mills of the Company.

4. When the matter was taken up on 19th February, 1959, Mr. Wyman Perera, Secretary and Mr. J. S. Amerasekera, District Representative of the Samithiya, appeared for the Samithiya and Mr. Lyn Wirasekera of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon (of which the Ceylon Coconut Industries Limited, Loluagoda Mills, Mirigama, is a member) and Mr. H. J. Atkinson, Managing Director of the Company appeared for the Ceylon Coconut Industries Limited.

5. After a preliminary discussion, both parties came to an amicable settlement, the terms of which were as follows:—

- (1) P. G. Romiel Singho and M. M. Japin Nona will be given work if available without any discrimination at all. They will each be paid 3 months' gross wages for the period of their suspension up to 19th February, 1959. The period of suspension will be counted for purposes of gratuity, if and when gratuity is paid to all the other workers at the time of closing down of the Mills. They will be allowed to stay in the lines till the Mill is closed down.
- (2) T. A. D. Lewis Appuhamy and his wife left of their own accord. It is agreed, however, that if any monies are due to them for work done prior to their departure, the Company will pay same.
- (3) Payments are to be made through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Kurunegala, within a fortnight of the publication of this award in the *Government Gazette*.

6. I consider the above terms of settlement just and equitable and I make order accordingly.

3. The office hours are from 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on week days and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays.
4. Cash transactions close at 3.30 p.m. on week days and at 12 noon on Saturdays.
5. All Notices and Advertisements must be prepaid. Notices and Advertisements sent direct by post should be accompanied by Money Order, Postal Order or Cheque, made payable to the Government Printer. Postage stamps will not be accepted in payment of advertisements.
6. To avoid errors and delay, "copy" should be on one side of the paper only and preferably typewritten.
7. All signatures should be repeated in block letters below the written signature.
8. Trade Advertisements or Notices *re* change of name are not accepted for publication.
