### Posts — Vacant

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

**Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

**2. Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

**3. Terms of Engagement.**—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

**4. New Entrant Officers—**

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made

or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

**Note.**—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

**5. Qualifications required.**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

### Post of Assistant Rubber Controller

**COLOMBO PORT COMMISSION****Posts of Special Apprentice (Civil), Chief Engineer's Division**

APPLICATIONS are invited for posts of Special Apprentice (Civil) in the Chief Engineer's Division, Colombo Port Commission. Applications which should substantially be in the form given below should reach the Port Commissioner, on or before January 24, 1959.

**2. Rates of Pay.—**

3. *Age.*—Not more than 20 years of age on the closing date for applications and must produce satisfactory proof of age.

4. *Educational and other qualifications required of candidates.*—Every candidate must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (i) has passed the G. C. E. Examination with English and Mathematics as subjects. Preference will be given to those who have passed in Physics as well;
- (ii) is unmarried;
- (iii) is physically fit. Every candidate will be subject to a Medical Examination before being indentured;
- (iv) is of good character.

5. *Conditions of Service, &c.*—The selected candidates will serve six months in the Chief Engineer's Division, Colombo Port Commission, on probation and if subsequently indentured the probationary period will be considered as part of the training. On satisfactory completion of the probationary period and if recommended for further training by the Chief Engineer, candidates and their guardians will be required to sign an indenture with the Port Commissioner covering a period of 4 years on the penalty of a forfeiture of a deposit which will be determined by the Port Commissioner, that they would satisfactorily complete the apprenticeship and serve the department for a minimum period of 5 years on satisfactory completion of training.

Candidates will be required to undergo a period of apprenticeship of 4 years and pass departmental examinations both oral and written which will be held periodically. Failure to pass such examinations will result in the apprentice having to take over again the section of the training which he failed, and the time so lost will be added to the total period of training. His full period of training will therefore be correspondingly extended. At the end of 4 year's apprenticeship or extended period, apprentices will be required to pass a final examination which will be held by the Chief Engineer.

On satisfactory completion of apprenticeship if found suitable apprentices will be retained in service as Minor Supervisors on the salary scale applicable at the time of completion of training. They will be eligible for promotion, if and when suitable vacancies occur in the grade of Civil Engineering Foreman such as Foreman, Carpentry Shop, Building Supervisor, Inspector of Works, Foreman Plate Layer, Quarry Foreman, &c.

6. *Programme of Training.*—The four years training provided by the Department to the Apprentices will be on buildings, Bridges and Roads, in the Drawing Office, in Surveying

Carpentry, Plate Laying, Block Bed, Stress Bed, Maritime Works and on general Civil Engineering Constructional Works.

It is compulsory for apprentices in training under this scheme to attend Technical College Classes in Civil Engineering when ordered to do so.

Arrangements will be made to enable apprentices to attend these classes and they will be required to obtain a pass in the examination held at the end of each year and to successfully complete the Technical College Course.

The Port Commissioner reserves the right to terminate an indenture without previous notice if an apprentice's conduct is not satisfactory or if an apprentice does not make satisfactory progress in his training or if for any cause he considers the continuance of an apprentice in training is not in the interest of the service.

Apprentices will be required to conform to the Departmental rules and regulations in force. Breach of discipline, misconduct and other offences will be met by such punishment as the Port Commissioner or other officer authorized by him may decide.

An apprentice must merit a good certificate from the immediate superior under whom he is working before he can proceed from one stage of his training to another. He will be judged on attendance, punctuality, good disposition and willingness to work, general ability, good conduct and steadiness. An apprentice may be called upon to make all time lost due to sickness and absence (with or without leave) before he makes the next step in his course of training.

7. Leave, free Railway passes, hours of work, &c., whilst in training are same as those applicable to industrial labour.
