GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.
- (ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.
- (iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
 - 4. New Entrant Officers-
 - (i) The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.
 - (ii) "New Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made

- or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
- (iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.
 - (b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, inter alia, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

- (iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.
- Note.—The term "New Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.
- 5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

- 6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

- (ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.
- (iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

BRITISH REGULAR ARMY

Cadetships at The Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst

APPLICATIONS for admission as Cadets to the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, are invited from candidates who desire to be considered for entry to the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, with the object of obtaining Permanent Commissions in the British Regular Army.

- 2. Applicants must-
- (a) be members of families established and resident in Ceylon;
- (b) be British subjects whose parents are British subjects;
- (c) be over 18 years of age but under 19 years of age on August 1, 1959;
- (d) possess the educational requirements specified below;
- (e) be unmarried;

- (f) conform to the British Army medical standards for service in any part of the world.
- 3. The educational requirements specified by the Army Council in the United Kingdom are as follows:—
- (a) A General Certificate of Education issued by the University of London showing passes in English Language and three other subjects.
 - (b) Passes at the following levels will be regarded as ordinary level passes in the General Certificate of Education Examination of the University of London —
 - (i) A credit pass at the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examination;
 - (ii) A credit pass entered on a Senior School Certificate (English); and
 - (iii) A pass entered on a Higher School Certificate.
 - (c) Candidates should note however that the passes at the above-mentioned levels should only be in subjects recognized by the University of London and that for this purpose—
 - (i) passes in "Mathematics" will exclude passes in "Elementary Mathematics (Ordinary)" at the Senior School Certificate (English) and General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examinations;
 - (ii) passes in a "Science" subject will refer to passes in Physics or Chemistry or Geology or Botany or Zoology or Biology;
 - (iii) passes in "Other" subjects will exclude passes in Lower Sinhalese, Lower Tamil, Maldivian, Sinhalese Literature, Tamil Literature, Civics, Oriental Music, Arithmetic, Commercial Arithmetic, General Science, Needlework, Handicraft, Agriculture, Commercial Subjects and Religion at the Senior School Certificate (English) and General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level—English Medium) Examinations.
- 4. The candidates nominated by the Ceylon Government will be required to appear before a Regular Commissions Board in the United Kingdom for final selection. The decision of this Board, confirmed by the War Office, will be final.
- 5. The cost of passage to the United Kingdom of nominated candidates will be borne by the United Kingdom Government, but all other expenses incidental to the journey and cost of maintenance in the United Kingdom prior to enlistment into the Army as successful candidates will be the responsibility of the parents or guardians. Candidates who fail the selection tests in the United Kingdom will, in addition, be required to meet the cost of their return passage to Ceylon. Those who are finally selected will be required to enter the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, in September, 1959.
- 6. Application forms and further particulars may be obtained from the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs, Colombo.

7. CADETSHIPS IN THE ROYAL CEYLON NAVY

APPLICATIONS are invited for Naval Cadetships in the Electrical Branch of the Royal Ceylon Navy. Upon selection Cadets (L) will be sent to the Britannia Royal Naval College, Dartmouth, the Naval Electrical School and a British University for training.

- 2. After successful completion of the period of training at the Britannia Royal Naval College, Dartmouth, Cadets (L) will be sent to the Naval Electrical School and to a British University for a three years' course in Electrical Engineering. Cadets (L) will be commissioned in the commencing rank of Sub-Lieutenants (L) in their third University year. Officers will be expected to serve in the Royal Ceylon Navy for a minimum period of 10 years after they return to Ceylon on completion of the prescribed courses. The prospects and conditions of pay and allowances for Officers of the Royal Ceylon Navy are as prescribed in the Government Gazette.
- 3. Applications for the above Cadetships must fulfil the following conditions:—
- (A) Nationality.—Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- (B) Age.—Candidates must be not less than 17 years and not more than 21 years of age on February 14, 1959.
- (C) Education.—Candidates must be in possession of—
- (a) The Ceylon General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level—English medium) with credit passes in—
 - (i) English language;
 - (ii) Sinhalese language or Tamil language;
 - (iii) Mathematics or an approved science subject; AND

The London University General Certificate of Education in Physics, Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics passed at the Advanced Level, OR

- (b) The Ceylon Senior School Certificate (English) with the subjects and credit passes indicated in the foregoing paragraph along with the London University General Certificate of Education in Physics, Pure Mathematics and Applied Mathematics passed at the Advanced Level.
- (D) Status.—Candidates must be unmarried. No Cadet (L) will be permitted to marry while he is a Midshipman (L) or a Cadet (L).

- (E) Medical Standard.—Candidates must conform to the required medical standard. Candidates selected for final interview by the Selection Board will be medically examined under the Royal Ceylon Navy arrangements.
- 4. Applications for Cadetships should be submitted in writing in terms of the form given in paragraph 10 below and should be forwarded to the Captain of the Navy, P. O. Box 593, Colombo, so as to reach him not later than 12 noon on February 14, 1959. The envelope enclosing the application should be marked "APPLICATION FOR A NAVAL CADETSHIP".
- 5. Applications should be accompanied by two certificates of character one of which should be from a responsible person of mature age who has known the applicant for the past one year in private life and the other from the Principal of the last school attended with particular reference to his educational achievement.
- 6. A preliminary selection will be made from amongst applications received from those who fulfil the above conditions and a final selection will be made after interview of those selected candidates by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Defence. Candidates selected for interview by the Selection Board will be informed in writing of the place, time and date of such interview. The interviews will take place in Colombo. No travelling or other expenses will be paid by the Ceylon Government in this respect. Candidates not selected will be so informed by the Selection Board.
- 7. The following procedure and rules will apply in respect of each candidate selected for the vacancies:—
 - (a) The candidate will be entered as a Cadet (L) in the Royal Ceylon Navy and subject to his qualifying in various examinations and his continued suitability, he will be required to serve in the Navy as a career.
 - (b) On entry the Cadet (L) will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed.
 - (c) On successful completion of the training referred to in (b) above the Cadet (L) will be sent to the Britannia Royal Naval College, Dartmouth for a period of preliminary naval training lasting three terms of 14 weeks each in the College and in the ships of the training squadron.
 - (d) On passing out of Dartmouth the Cadet (L) will be promoted Midshipman (L). He will then undergo a course lasting approximately 6 weeks at the Naval Electrical School which will be followed by a three years course in Electrical Engineering at a British University. During vacations, while at the University, officers will be given industrial training with manufacturing firms, if possible.
 - (e) After 16 months and subject to satisfactory progress he will be promoted Acting Sub-Lieutenant (L). On satisfactory completion of the University Course, he will be commissioned in the confirmed rank of Sub-Lieutenant (L) in his third University year and will then be given 2½ years further training at the Royal Naval Electrical School, at sea and with manufacturing firms.

Subsequent promotions will be in accordance with the regulations prescribed in that behalf.

(f) During the period of training all tuition and maintenance fees will be paid by the Ceylon Government. An initial outfit allowance of Rs. 700 is payable and a further allowance of Rs. 1,300 when the Cadet (L) proceeds to the United Kingdom for training. No cost of living allowance is payable. All expenses such as pocket money, maintenance during compulsory leave periods between terms, cost of civilian clothes which may be worn when off duty &c., will be the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the individual cadet (L). Such expenses should be about Rs. 1,000 per annum for the period during which the Cadet (L) is away from Ceylon. He will also be entitled to ration allowance as may be approved from time to time during compulsory leave periods (i.e. period of non-attachment to a Mess.)

- (g) In the event of a Cadet (L) or Midshipman (L) voluntarily terminating his candidature for a commission during his course of training the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on account of such cadet (L). Such Cadet (L) or Midshipman (L) will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense.
- (h) If at any time during his course a Cadet (L) or Midshipman (L) is reported on by the Authorities as being unsuitable to secure a commission for reasons of misconduct or for causes within his own control, his parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government.

EXAMINATION (SINHALA) FOR RECRUIT-MENT TO THE TYPISTS' SERVICE—MARCH, 1959

- 1. Date of Examination.—A competitive examination for recruitment to the Typists' Service of candidates of either sex proficient in Typewriting in Sinhala, will be held in Colombo, by the Commissioner of Examinations, commencing on March 28, 1959.

 - (a) In computing age, for the purpose of the age limit prescribed in paragraph 4 (iv), ex-Servicemen of the Armed Forces, i.e., Reservists, or Officers and Servicemen who have left the Armed Forces, except those who have been cashiered, dismissed, discharged with ignominy or had to leave the Service for any sort of misconduct, will be allowed to deduct their periods of service in the Regular Force from their ages.
 - (b) Those who count not less than four years' service in the Regular Force and who do not possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 4 (iii), will be permitted to sit for the examination provided they have passed at least one of the examinations mentioned in paragraph 7 (iii) (B) (i).

- permanent Employees.—Persons holding permanent posts in Government employ in categories (A) and (B) below, who are not eligible for the concessions set out in paragraph 7 (i) and (ii) will be permitted to sit for the examination:
- (A) Those in service on January 20, 1959, provided—
 - (i) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 4 (iii);
- (ii) they are under 45 years of age on March 1, 1959; and
- (iii) the Heads of Departments concerned are prepared to release them if they are selected for appointment to the Typists' Service.
- (B) Those who have completed at least 4 years' continuous service under Government immediately prior to February 10, 1959, provided—
- (a) they possess one of the following:—
 - (a) Cambridge Junior Certificate;
 - (b) J. S. C. of the Education Department;
 - (c) J. S. C. of a school approved by the Education Department;
 - (ii) they are under 45 years of age on March 1, 1959; and
- (iii) the Heads of Departments concerned are prepared to release them if they are selected for appointment to the Typists' Service.
- Note.—(a) Officers in categories (A) and (B) above, appointed prior to September 24, 1956, who are successful in this examination, will be regarded as "Old-Entrants" for the purpose of the Official Language Policy.
- (b) Officers belonging to Departmental Clerical Services, such as the Railway, Postal, Survey, Hospital and Customs Clerical Services will not be eligible to sit for this examination under paragraphs 7 (iii) (A) and (B). Officers in Departmental Clerical Services, reruitment to which has now ceased, will, however, be eligible.
- (iv) Temporary Employees.—Persons holding temporary posts in Government employ in categories (A) and (B) below, will be permitted to sit for this examination.

- (A) Those who have completed at least one year's continuous service under Government immediately prior to February 10, 1959, provided—
 - (i) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 4 (iii); and
 - (ii) they are under 45 years of age on March 1, 1959.
- (B) Those who have completed at least four years' continuous service under Government immediately prior to February 10, 1959, provided—
 - (i) they possess the educational qualifications specified in paragraph 7 (iii) (B) (i); and
 - (ii) they are under 45 years of age on March 1, 1959.
- 8. Applications.— (i) Application forms for admission to the examination may be obtained by personal callers from the Enquiry Office, Department of Examinations or by post from the Commissioner of Examinations, Malay Street, Slave Island, P. O. Box No. 1503, Colombo 2, from January 26 to February 10, 1959. Each candidate will be issued only one form.

Every person who applies by post for an entry form for this examination is advised to send along with his application an unstamped and self-addressed long envelope with the name of the examination written on the top left-hand corner of it, so that the Department of Examinations may despatch the form expeditiously to him/her.

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Commissioner of Examinations, Colombo 2, on or before February 12, 1959.

Any application received after that date will be rejected. The name of the examination should be clearly written on the left-hand top corner of the envelope.

- (iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of ${\bf R}{\bf s}.$ 10.
- (iv) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving. Those candidates who claim eligibility under paragraph 6, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they last served. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified. Candidates are requested to forward their applications to the Heads of their Departments well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Commissioner of Examinations to reach him on or before February 12, 1959.
- 9. Admissions to the Examinations.—(i) The Commissioner of Examinations will issue admission forms to all candidates whose applications have been received. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admission to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time-table and the Rules for Candidates will be forwarded together with the admission form. Candidates will be bound by these Rules: Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervisor on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of examination, he should communicate without delay with the Commissioner of Examinations, Malay Street, Slave Island, P. O. Box No. 1503, Colombo, (Telegraphic address: "Exams", Colombo), informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following information:—

- (1) Name of Examination.
- (2) Full name.
- (3) Full postal address.
- (4) Post Office, Registration number and date of despatch.
- (ii) Admission to the Examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.—The Commissioner of Examinations may, however, grant to a candidate provisional candidature at the examination, at his discretion. Such candidature will subsequently be either confirmed or cancelled.
- 10. Identity Cards.—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose, any of the following documents will be accepted:—
 - (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.
 - (b) A valid passport issued not more than three years before the date of this examination.
 - (c) Any certificate, licence, or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued not more than three years before the date of this examination on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above, in addition to his admission card.

- 11. Documents of Eligibility.—(i) No documents whatsoever should be forwarded with the application, but the necessary particulars should all be provided in the form, as required. An application which is not complete in all these respects will be judged on its own merits and may be rejected.
- (ii) Documentary evidence in proof of eligibility will be required from candidates who have qualified. Such candidates should produce these documents at the *Viva Voce* test, if held, or forward them promptly under registered cover when called for by the Commissioner of Examinations.
- (iii) The following documents will be necessary:—
 - (a) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person.

Note.—If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise, it may be from a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, Divisional Revenue Officer or a permanent Government officer in receipt of an annual salary of Rs. 2,400 or over, or, generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made. The name,

designation and address of the person must be clearly indicated on the certificate.

Candidates holding permanent posts in Government employ will not be required to furnish certificates of good character.

- (b) A certified copy of the candidate's birth registration entry.
 - Note.—(i) The special certificate of birth issued for school or educational purposes, or a certified extract from the birth registration entry will not accepted.
 - (ii) Affidavits or baptismal certificates will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.
 - (iii) If the name/names appearing in the birth certificates differs/differ from the name/names which the candidate ordinary uses and under which the candidate enters for the examination, action should be taken immediately in terms of section 27 or 28, as the case may be, of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, No. 17 of 1951, to get the name in the birth registration entry amended. A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 24 (6) of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, No. 17 of 1951, as amended by section 2 of the Births and Deaths Registration (Amendment) Act, No. 15 of 1953, will be accepted for purposes of making appointments only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established.

Candidates holding permanent posts in Government employ, who have changed their names in accordance with the provisions of Treasury Circular No. 394 of August 18, 1957, will not be required to take action to have their names in the birth registration entry amended.

- (c) Certificate of registration as a citizen of Ceylon or original official letter of acceptance of claim to citizenship by descent (where applicable).
- (d) Original certificate of educational qualification, or, where the certificate has not been issued, other official document (e.g., Ceylon G.C. E. (Ordinary Level) results slip issued to private candidates or original letter from the candidate's Head of School).
- (e) Original certificate of service as a civilian employee of the United Kingdom Services in Ceylon, or certificate of service in the Armed Forces (in respect of candidates referred to in paragraph 5.)
- (f) Original certificate of service under Government (in respect of candidates referred to in paragraph 6).
- (g) Indentity Card (at the Viva Voce test only if held).
- (iv) Candidates are warned to have all the necessary documents in readiness at the time of application. Any candidate who is unable to produce the necessary documents at the *Viva Voce* test, if held, or who delays in producing them when called for by the Commissioner of Examinations, will have this entry rejected.
- 12. Penalty for furnishing False Particulars: If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to

the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

If any of the particulars furnished by a candidate are found to be false within his knowledge, or if he has wilfully suppressed any material fact, or if it is proved at any time during the period of his service, that he was ineligible to sit for this examination, he will be liable to immediate dismissal from the service.

13. Refunds: No refunds will be made under any circumstances.

Fees paid for this examination cannot be transferred to any other examination.

14. Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination: Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been approved by the Commissioner of Examinations, leave to present themselves at the examination.

15. Scheme of Examination: The examination will be held in two parts, viz., Part I (Written) and Part II (Viva Voce). The subjects of the examination and the marks assigned to each subject are given below. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

The written examination will be held first, and, on the results of it, candidates will be selected competitively to attend the Viva Voce examina-tion, which will be held in Colombo, on a date to be notified to them. The number to be called for the Viva Voce examination will be fixed by the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury in consultation with the Commissioner of Examinations. The Viva Voce examination may however, be dispensed with if the number of candidates qualifying for it falls short of the number of vacancies.

16. Publication of Results and offer of Appointments: The names of successful candidates will be published in the Ceylon Government Gazette and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

17. Medical Examination: The selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of Ceylon.

TENANCY OF SHOP BUILDINGS AT WOLFENDHAL STREET, COLOMBO

- (a) the successful bidder who becomes the tenant shall not sub-let, sell or donate, mortgage or otherwise dispose of or deal with his interest in the premises rented out to him without a written consent of the Commissioner for National Housing;
- (b) the successful bidder who becomes a tenant shall at all times maintain the building rented out to him in good repair at his expense, pay all rates and taxes and erect and keep in good repair a substantial fence or boundary wall around the tenanted premises;

the successful bidder who becomes the tenant shall at the termination of his tenancy surrender the tenanted premises to the Commissioner for National Housing, together with all buildings erected thereon and all additions, improvements and fixtures in good repair and condition and shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the said buildings, additions, improvements and fixtures on any account whatsoever;

(d) rents will be revised, if necessary, every five years.
