GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS
IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE
“CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made

or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

SURVEY DEPARTMENT

Posts of Assistant Superintendent of Surveys

APPLICATIONS are invited for the selection of two candidates to be trained for appointment to the posts of Assistant Superintendent of Surveys in the Survey Department. Applications, which should be on printed forms provided by this office, should reach me on or before the following dates:—

2. (a) The selected candidates will be required to undergo a practical course in Surveying and Levelling, for a period of two years approximately in Ceylon, partly in Diyatalawa and partly attached to Survey parties in the field. Thereafter they will be required to undergo a further course of study and training at a Survey Training Centre in the United Kingdom and/or a post-graduate course at the University of Cambridge over a period of about a year.

(b) They will be granted free passages from Colombo to the United Kingdom and back in accordance with Government regulations.

(c) During the period of training in the United Kingdom; they will be entitled to the following:—

(i) Full pay (exclusive of rent allowance) during the period.

(ii) An outfit allowance of Rs. 500 in terms of Treasury Circular No. 196 of 17th May, 1949.

(iii) The University and/or Training Centre fees will be paid.

(iv) Allowances during the period they are compelled to be away from the Island, payable in terms of Treasury Circular No. 276 of 30th November, 1955.

3. The selected candidates will be required to:—

(a) pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island, and possess very good eyesight;

(b) (i) enter into an agreement with the Government of Ceylon undertaking among other things to follow the

prescribed courses and to complete satisfactorily the courses of study and training and to serve the Government for a specified period (to be decided by Government) after completion of the courses of study and training.

(ii) enter into a bond with two approved sureties up to the full value of the award undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the total cost of training (i.e. salary, allowances, cost of passages, fees, &c., paid on account of the training from Ceylon Government funds and/or any expenses incurred by any other Government or any other agency) in the event of his failure to comply with the terms and conditions in the Agreement. This Agreement and Bond should be entered into prior to commencement of training at the Survey Training School at Diyatalawa.

(c) Prior to their departure to the United Kingdom, to pass a medical examination by a Special Medical Board at Colombo as to their physical fitness to undergo a course of study and training in the United Kingdom.

4. The post carries a salary of Rs. 4,080 per annum rising to Rs. 13,200 per annum by 12 annual increments of Rs. 360 and 10 of Rs. 480 with a halt of 2 years on Rs. 11,280 and efficiency bars before Rs. 8,400 and Rs. 11,760.

5. The posts are permanent and pensionable. The appointments will be on probation during the 3-year period of training. If the services of the officers are unsatisfactory while they are on probation, they are liable to be discontinued at any time during such period or at the end of it. Confirmation in the appointments will be dependent on satisfactory completion of the courses of training and study and satisfactory services during the probationary period.

(vi) The officer will be liable for service (i) in any part of the Island and also (ii) for short periods of overseas service.

(vii) The selected candidate will be required to pass a Medical Examination as to his physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island and to undergo a course of training abroad.

(viii) The employment of a "New Entrant Officer" for the purpose of the Official Language Policy recruited through the Tamil/English medium beyond a period of three years will unless his appointment is terminated earlier, depend on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala. Enlistment of Private Soldiers (Recruits)

APPLICATIONS for enlistment in the Regular Force of the Army in the rank of Private are invited from candidates who fulfil the following conditions :—

- (a) is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- (b) be not less than 18 or more than 22 years of age on June 1, 1959.
- (c) has passed at least the Fifth Standard in Sinhalese, or Tamil or English.
- (d) is of a height of not less than 5 feet 4 inches.
- (e) passes a medical test to the satisfaction of the Commander of the Army.

THE EDUCATIONAL AND PHYSICAL QUALIFICATIONS AS STATED IN PARAGRAPH 1 (b) AND (c) ABOVE ARE THE MINIMUM REQUIRED. PREFERENCE WILL, HOWEVER, BE GIVEN TO THOSE OF HIGHER EDUCATIONAL AND BETTER PHYSICAL STANDARDS.

2. *Form of application.*—Applications must be made out in the candidates' own handwriting as per specimen application form appearing at the end of this *Gazette* notification.

3. Applications will be forwarded to reach the Recruiting Officer, Army Headquarters, P. O. Box 553, Colombo, on or before February 11, 1959. Applications and envelopes enclosing them must be marked "APPLICATION FOR ENLISTMENT (RECRUITS)".

4. Under no circumstances will applications be considered unless the candidates possess the necessary qualifications stated in paragraph 1 above.

5. Applications will be accompanied by COPIES ONLY of—

- (a) certificate of Registration of Birth. (Baptismal Certificates, Affidavits and Birth Certificates issued for purposes of School Code will NOT be accepted.)
- (b) certificates of the highest Educational Qualifications obtained; and

6. PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION WILL BE AS FOLLOWS :—

- (a) Candidates considered suitable for interview will be required to appear at their own expense for interview by the Recruiting Board, which will sit in Colombo. Such candidates will be notified individually of the time, date and location of interview.
- (b) Candidates who have been interviewed and are considered suitable for enlistment by the Recruiting Board will thereafter be required to appear in Colombo at their own expense for the Medical Examination.

7. Enlistment will commence in approximately last week of May, 1959, and candidates who are unlikely to be free by that date for enlistment are advised not to apply.

8. Those candidates who are selected will be enlisted in the rank of Private in the Army and will then undergo a course of training at the Army Training Centre or at any place that the Army Commander may direct.

9. *Period of Engagement.*—A soldier will normally be enlisted for a period of 12 years of which 5 years will be with the Colours and 7 years with the Reserve after which he may be discharged. In certain cases, a soldier may, however, be permitted to extend his service to 12 years and to re-engage for service up to a total of 32 years.
